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PERFORMER BIOGRAPHIES

The **Salisbury "Pops"** Concert Band is open to all students at Salisbury University and is enhanced by a few community musicians who serve as mentors, fill vacancies and/or also share a passion for performing band literature. SU students enroll in this course each semester either as a required music ensemble (music majors) or as an elective course for personal enrichment. Many non-music majors find room in their schedules to participate each semester during their tenure at Salisbury University! A few community members travel from Rehoboth Beach every Monday evening to rehearse with the band.

Conductor **Lee Knier** directs the Salisbury "Pops" Concert Band at Salisbury University where he also teaches courses in music education and applied brass lessons. A graduate of both Temple and Arcadia universities, he earned degrees in music education and performance with concentrations in trombone and conducting. In addition to teaching music in public schools for 30 years in Pennsylvania and New Jersey, he also served as assistant director of bands at Temple University, assistant conductor of the New Jersey Youth Orchestra and interim director of the Salisbury Symphony Orchestra. Knier performs as principal trombone with the Mid-Atlantic Orchestra and has previously performed regularly with St. Peter-by-the-Sea Orchestra, Metro Lyric Opera Orchestra and the Brookdale Big Band. He toured with the Glenn Miller Orchestra directed by Buddy DeFranco as well as the Nelson Riddle Orchestra.

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Sarah Burrall, soprano, is a senior at Salisbury University pursuing a Bachelor of Arts in music education, currently studying with Dr. John Wesley Wright. She transferred to Salisbury University from Anne Arundel Community College where she studied voice under Mary Anne Barcellona. She has been most recently seen in SU's Musical Theatre Workshop' production Be Our Guest. She has also been a soloist in the SU's Opera Work's production of Talk Opera! (2014), the Second Lady in Mozart's Die Zauberflöte (2013), Susan/Wedding Singer in SU's Musical Theatre Workshop' production of Stephen Sondheim's Company (2013), and an ensemble member of *Freaks on Broadway* (2012). She has also been seen in SU's Theatre and Dance Department's production of Camelot under the direction of Dr. T. Paul Pfeiffer; a member of the University Chorale, under the baton of Dr. William M. Folger; and a soloist with the Salisbury Pops band under the baton of Professor Lee Knier. Sarah is also a member of the Christ Church Choir in Easton, MD under the direction of Wes Lockfaw. Sarah thanks her family, friends and professors for all of the love and support in all of her musical accomplishments over the years.
