The Bashaw being sensible that nothing but Forte could put a Stop to their Proceedings, he sept a Body of Troops sgainst them, headed by the Kisya, who was seconded by several Agas. The Rioters had been joined by about 400 other Banditti, and senced themselves in a Village within eight Leagues of this City. The Kisya furrounded the Village; but the Mutiaters sallied out, and fell so impetuously on the Kisya's Troops, that they would certainly have routed them, if a Reinforcement of 150 Men had not opportunely arrived, who attacked the Rebels in Flank, and drove them back into the Village. The latter having spent all their Powder and Shot, were obliged to abandon their Post, and ran away in Disorder 1 only 16 of them could be seized, whom the Kisya put to Death on the Spor, and their Heads were fixed upon Stakes before the Bashaw's House. It is said that the Rebels have fied into the Mountains of the Kurdes 1 but we are not yet quite easy about them, as there is room to fear they will return and ravage the open Country.

PHILADELPHIA, August 4.

On Sunday last Sermons were preached in most of the Congregations of this City, in Favour of the diffressed Back Inhabitants, and Collections are now making for them from House to House.

Our Accounts from the Westward are as follow : Laucaster, July 28. There are certain Accounts that Indians have passed the South Mountain, and gone into York County; and that fome of them have afforedly been feen near Carlifle. The Wants of the distressed Resugees have been greatly relieved, by Sums of Money collected in the different Congregations in this County. The Quakers and Menonifts have been very liberal on this Occasion, having raifed a confiderable Sum, and hired Men to affift the poor People in gathering in as much of their Harvest as possible. And we are told, that feveral large Parties have again attempted to go over the Mountains, for this necessary and laudable Purpose; but the Risk they run is so great, that we

Carlifle, July 25. Two Indians were feen at Cannedogwynnah-Creek, about four Miles from Shippensburgh, on Thursday or Friday last, who attempted taking the Man that faw them, but he escaped. The People of Shearman's Valley are to go over this Day, and endeavour to fave fome of their Harvest. They write from Virginia, that great Numbers of People are reduced to the utmoff Diffress by the Savages; but that several Parties of them had been repulsed by our Men, who had

taken to the Forts.

July 30. On the 25th a confiderable Number of the Inhabitants of Shearman's Valley went over (with a Party of Soldiers to guard them) to at-tempt faving as much of their Grain as might be standing, and it is hoped a considerable Quantity will yet be preserved. A Party of Volunteers, between Twenty and Thirty, went to the farther Side of the Valley, next the Tufcarora Mountain, to fee what Appearance there might be of Indians, as it was thought they would most probably be there, if any where in the Settlement; to fearch for, and bury, the Dead at Buffaloe-Creek; and to affift the Inhabitants that lived along, or near, the Foot of the Mountain, in bringing off what they could; which Services they accordingly performed, burying the Remains of three Persons; but saw no Marks of Indians having lately been there, excepting one Track, supposed about two or three Days old, near the Narrows of Buffaloe-Creek Hill; and heard fome Hallooing; and firing of a Gun at another Place. A Number of the Inhabitants of Tuscarora Valley go over Tomorrow, with a Party of Soldiers, to endeavour to fave Part of the Crops. Five Indians were feen last Sunday, about 16 or 17 Miles from this Place, up the Valley, sowards the North Mountain; and two the Day before Yesterday, about five or fix Miles from Shippensburgh, who fired at a young Man, but missed him. The eight Companies al-lowed for the Desence of this Frontier, are now

very nest, if not quite, compleat.

On the 25th of July there were in Shippensburgh 1384 of our poor distressed Back Inhabitants, viz.

Men 301; Women 345; Children 738; many of whom were obliged to lie in Barns, Stables, Cellars, and under old leaky Sheds, the Dwellinghouses being all crowded.



The Indians all entered about 10 o'Clock, and made their Dissolution according to the purposed Plany Pondise (as we are informed since) had in his Pouch a certain Belt of Wampum, which he was to have produced as a Signal to bepin the Massacre; but he, naturally a Coward, feeing the Garrifon under Arms, dared not to produce if, made a Pertunet of being surprised at our being under Arms, and segmed to be ignorant of the Caule. The Council ended; they retiened, semingly much disconcerted, and encamped on the further dids of the River; the young Warriors reproached Endate for not preducing the Signal, faying, that they could have carried is with the Loss of easy a few Mrs 3 to which he answered, he did not imagion they would be contented to lose any Men, but if they were willing, they should have a scond Opportunity to firstle, whether the Garrison should be under Arma or not; to which they all agreed. In Confequence of which, Pondiac, with isomothers of the Chiefs, came sent Day, being Sonday, to smake the Pipe of Peace with the Major, who despited them so much, because of their Treachery, that be would not go night them, but told Capt. Campbell, if he had a Minch his might speak with them; on which Capt. Campbell went and smooked with them, when Pondiac told him, he should come the next Day and hold a Conference with the Major, and to wipe away all Canle of Suspicion, he would bring all round the Fort, at the Distance of about 200 Yar

The 10th in the Morning, they attacked the Fort very refolutely; there continued a very hot Fire on both Sides until the Evening, when they cested firing, having had faveral killed and wounded. They posted themselves behind the Garden Fences and Houses in the Suburbs, and some Barras and Out-Houses, that were on the Side of the Fort next the Woods, to which we immediately set Fire, by red hot Spikes, are, from the Cannon, which disolged them.

Wednesday, the 21th, some of the French advised us to try to come to Terms of Peace with the Indians, which was thought adviseable, as we had then but three Weeks Provisions for the Garrison, at a Pound of Bread, and two Ounces of Pork a Man per Day; they went accordingly, and acquainted the Indians of what they had advised us to, in Consequence of which 5 of the Indians came to the Fort, and demanded that two of our Officers should go out and hold a Treaty with them in their Camp, and that Capt. Campbell should be one of them, to which he readily agreed, and the more so, as the French, who had savisfed the accommissioning the more so, as the French, who had savisfed the accommissioning Treaty with them in their Camp, and that Capt. M'Daugall along with him, hewever, in the Asternoon, and went off with the 5 Indians, accompanied by 5 or 6 Frenchmen, who, after having given their Parole d'Honeur, went and proved their true French Faith, by delivering him up into the Handa of the Enemy, left him there, and brought Paneline's Proposals for us to capitulate. Upon this Hoftilities recommenced, fince which time, being two Months, the whole Garrison, Officers, Soldiers, Merchants and Servants, confifting of 120 Men, have been upon the Ramparts every Night, not one having fleet in a House, except the Sick and Wounded in the Hoftigal.

Our Fort is extremely large, confidering our Numbers, the Stockade being above 1000 Paces in Circumference; judge what a Figure we make on the Works. The Schooner arrived from Niagara about ten Days ago, and brought fome Provisions, with 22 Men of the Soth, and 23 of Capt. Hop-kim's Company, who luckily escaped from that unhappy Affair of Lieucenant Cuyler, which I suppose you may have heard of long e'er now. About fix Days ago we made a Sally, in which we killed and wounded several of the Enemy; among the Killed was a Chief of the Soteaus; those of his Nation, to myenge his Death, fell upon Capt. Campbell, and cut him all in Pieces; they skinned his Legs and Arms, to make Tobacco Pouches, and other Toys. Lieut. M'Dougall would have shared the same Fate, but very suckily made his Escape from them, and got into the Fort about two Nights before. Lieut. Pauly made his Escape from them a seem of the few Minutes after Capt. Campbell was massacred; we have also got Ensign Schlosser, and two Soldiers, for an Indian Prisoner we had. Presque 10e, Sandusky, St. Joseph's, Miamis, Ocua, and Michillimakinac, are taken, and almost all the Soldiers belonging to each of them put to Death, except the Garrison of Ocua, which they have carried off to the Illinois. Lieut. Holmer, Commander at Miamis, is killed; also Lieutenant Jamett, at Michillimakinac, with about 17 of the Soldiers, and Warrant Tracey, a Trader, Capt. Etherington, Lieut. Lesie, and a sew Soldiers, remain their Prisoners. They have plundered every Thing belonging to the English Posts they have taken.

Since writing the above, the Hurons, who begin to be weared of the War, have brought and delivered up to us 3 Prisocers, among whom are Ensign Christie, late Commandant of Presque-life, and Little Levy, from Ningara. The Hurons and Ponteonatumis, who were partly forced into the War, by the Menaces of the Ottawas, begin to withdraw, being asraid, I believe, of the Arrival of our Army; so that Pondist, whose Army lately confisted of about 7 or 800 Men, cannot muster at present more than 500. They were so confident of succeeding, that they began to divide the Lands with the French, and have planted large Fields of Corn; but I know who will resp them. We have at present Plenty of Provisions and Ammunition, and our Men are in high Spirits; we are also happy in having one of the best Commanding Officers the Army can afford, and under whose Command, I think, we can give a good Account of all the Indians who come against or. ans who come against us.

PHILADELPHIA, August 18.

Extratt of a Letter from Fort Bedford, August 10 "When I wrote you last the 2d Instant, we had no Account of our little Army fince their March from hence on the 28th ult. As a great deal depends on that Convoy's getting into Fort Pitt, fo, doubtlefs, every One must be anxious for its Safety. The whole got fafe to Ligonier the 2d Inftant, without a fingle Shot being fired at them. On the Fourth Col. Bouquet refumed his March, leaving the Waggons, with Capt. Hay, and some other Officers, at Ligonier. On the Fifth, about One in the Asternoon, a full Mile on this Side of Bushy Run, he was attacked (I don't hear by what Numbers) the Fire continued till Six; when the Colonel took Post on a Hill for the Night. Next Morning the Indians, having been reinforced, renewed the Attack, which was very warm, about Ten o'Clock, when the Colonel, having drawn up in a Lane, formed by his Bags, rushed upon the Savages, and pursued them upwards of a Mile and a Half, and then ordered the Retreat. In these different Attacks, we have lost some Men and Officers; but as this Intelligence is founded upon the Report of fix Rangers, who returned to Ligonier, because, as they say, the Enemy got between them and our People, I am cautious of relating Particulars, till a more authentic Account comes to hand. In the mean time, it appears from the whole, that the Enemy has been repulfed; and, in all Probability, the Convoy may have got to Fort Pitt, unless attacked again, the 7th at farthest. I have Reason to believe, that the whole Force the Enemy had on this Communica-tion was collected for that Stroke, for, from the Time the Troops arrived here to this Day, we have not feen nor felt the Effects of an Indian. And the Reapers, under Cover, and by Affidance of Captain Lems's Company, have cut almost all their Grain, without the least Interruption; but now I shall expect that they will visit us again."
