MUSICIAN BIOGRAPHIES

Soprano **Desiree Borges** is a senior pursuing a bachelor's degree in music with a minor in business administration. Desiree has performed all different types of genres while at SU under the direction of Dr. John Wesley Wright. She was most recently seen in the Musical Theater Ensemble's production of "It's a Musical," a review. Past performances include I Love You, You're Perfect, Now Change, the role of Logainne "Schwarzy" SchwartzandGrubenierre in The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee, and SU Opera Theatre Ensemble productions of Puccini and Friends, Suor Angelica, and A Memorial Tribute: Leonard Bernstein and Aaron Copland. Desiree has garnered recognition in several competitions winning 1st place in the 2016, 2017 and 2018 MD-DC National Association of Teachers of Singing (NATS) student competition (musical theatre category) and 3rd place in the 2018 NATS Mid-Atlantic Regionals. Desiree is a member and current president of SU's a cappella group Squawkappella and enjoys teaching voice lessons to kids through the PRESTO program. After graduation, Desiree hopes to continue to call the stage her home.

Pianist **Veronica Tomanek** is on the music faculty of the University of Maryland Eastern Shore in the Department of Fine Arts. She is also staff accompanist/coach for the Wright Vocal Studio in the Music Program at Salisbury University, and she serves as the music director at St. Alban's Episcopal Church in Salisbury. Veronica has taught at the University of Connecticut, Wesleyan University and Brookdale Community College in Lincroft, NJ. She frequently performs throughout the Mid-Atlantic and New England as a chamber musician, piano and organ soloist, choral director, music director for musical theater productions, and accompanist. She held the post of principal pianist/keyboardist with the Eastern Connecticut Symphony Orchestra for 16 years. She also has performed with the United States Coast Guard Band and Chamber Players, the Silver Bay Quartet, and with many other instrumentalists, vocalists and choral groups. She has a Master of Music in piano performance from the University of Connecticut and has a diploma in piano performance from the Rouen Conservatory, Rouen, France. She lives in Salisbury, MD. She recently was featured in the production of *Hairspray* at Salisbury University.
