We have now in our possession documents from which we collect the following facts: John Quincy Adams is now in his 62nd year. In his 14th year he went to Russia as private Secretary to Judge Adams. Since that time until the present, being 48 years, he has been engaged in no public office or another, without hardly a year of intermission. During this period he has drawn from the Treasury of the U. States, in the shape of salaries, outfits, contingent expenses, and for construction journals, &c. the enormous sum of about THREE HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS. So that he has received upon an average the sum of upwards of Five Thousand Dollars for every day of his life—or, for every day since first he came before the light of this world! This is unparalleled in American history—Yet the roars of the gentry would not permit this political monster to draw the breath of the people for another term of four years, at the rate of \$100,000, and judging from the present aspect of affairs, an extra sum of like amount for contingent expenses during that period. But John Q. Adams never performed any services for these enormous sums drawn from the People's purse! Oh, yes, he has. As a Senator, he has been every day the navigation of the Mississippi—He voted against the purchase of Louisiana, against Mr. Jefferson and the republicans party in the Senate of the U. States; He wrote a book on Court Etiquette only calculated for Kings and nobility, but which was designed to keep up his family at Washington. He also wrote a blackguard song in ridicule of Mr. Jefferson. He likewise wrote a work defining the right of the people to alter constitutions, and denouncing the Equal Rights' Man. On the 10th of February, 1807, he voted for a law requiring a personal qualification of voters. And while at Ghent in Nov. 1814, he, in his insatiable thirst for gold, denounced our government as weak and tyrannous, because it gave Congress was unwilling to allow his exorbitant charges. Such were the services of John Q. Adams As an Adams man what constitutes J. Q. Adams' competency to preside at the head of our Nation, and he will tell you Adams is a skilful diplomat. Then enquire, where has he given us any great and beneficial services? Look to his conduct, evidence of his high dignity? The answer will be found in his diplomatic means arranging matters, or making bargains, we suppose the late barter for the Presidency will stand most conspicuous in the catalogue of Adams' great doings.

Read, Pause and Reflect.
On the Senate of the United States.
Friday, February 1807, on the second reading of the bill to erect Louisiana into two territories, an amendment was offered containing the following provisions:
1st. That no person shall be eligible to a seat in the territorial legislature, unless he shall have been a citizen of the United States for at least seven years, and have been a resident in the territory for at least one year.

2d. That no person shall be qualified to vote for a representative unless he shall have been a citizen of the United States for at least seven years, and have been a resident in the territory for at least one year.

3d. That the governor of the territory should have power to promulgate the laws.

4th. That he should have power to dissolve it.

5th. That he should have power to negotiate all the bills passed by the legislature.

6th. That he should have power to appoint and remove all the judges of the territory.

7th. That he should have power to appoint and remove all the sheriffs of the territory.

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
