

MUSICIAN BIOGRAPHIES

Tenor **Syed Jaffery** is a senior completing a degree in music while pursuing a career in medicine. Syed has always had a drive for music, which gave him the courage to switch his major from biology to music during his sophomore year of undergraduate study. He is currently the vice president of SU's sole collegiate a cappella group, Squawkappella. He was most recently seen in the Musical Theater Ensemble's production of I Love You, You're Perfect, Now Change. Past performances on the SU stage include the roles of Mitch Mahoney (The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee) and several roles in the Musical Theater Ensemble's review Be Our Guest. Syed also has been part of several SU Opera Theatre productions (Puccini and Friends, Talk Opera! and A Memorial Tribute: Leonard Bernstein and Aaron Copland). He has garnered recognition in several competitions, winning second place for the 2016 and 2017 MD/DC NATS Student Auditions (music theatre category), third place for the 2016 MD/DC NATS Student Auditions (classical category), National qualification for the 2016 NATS Mid-Atlantic Regional Student Auditions (classical and music theatre categories), and most recently third place for the 2017 NATS Mid-Atlantic Regional Auditions (music theatre category). Syed will be graduating later this month with Honors, a 4.0 GPA and as a member of the academic honor society Phi Kappa Phi, an honor given to students in the top 10 percent of their graduating class. He looks forward to attending the Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine as a first-year medical student in fall 2017.

Pianist Veronica Tomanek is on the music faculty of the University of Maryland Eastern Shore in the Department of Fine Arts. She is also staff accompanist/coach for the Wright vocal studio in the Department of Music, Theatre and Dance at Salisbury University, and serves as the music director at St. Alban's Episcopal Church in Salisbury. Veronica has taught at the University of Connecticut, Wesleyan University and Brookdale Community College in Lincroft, NJ. She frequently performs throughout the mid-Atlantic and New England as a chamber musician, piano and organ soloist, choral director, music director for musical theater productions, and accompanist. She held the post of principal pianist/keyboardist with the Eastern Connecticut Symphony Orchestra for 16 years. She also has performed with the United States Coast Guard Band and Chamber Players, the Silver Bay Quartet, and with many other instrumentalists, vocalists and choral groups. She has a Master of Music in piano performance from the University of Connecticut and has a diploma in piano performance from the Rouen Conservatory, Rouen, France. She lives in Salisbury, MD.
