Overall Principles

Number of Full-time Faculty are used for representation
 Make representation proportional to # of FTF
 Keep Senate from becoming unwieldy

One Dept, One Vote Plan

Each department has 1 faculty senator
 Pro: Simple, easy-to-explain
 Pro: All faculty have a voice
 Con: Representation is not proportional
 Con: Representation may be burdensome on small depts

Bonus Votes for Size Plan

Each dept has a least 1 faculty senator
 Four depts get a "bonus" senator because of their size
 Pro: Relatively simple to explain
 Pro: More representative
 Con: Total number of senators becoming unwieldy
 Con: Representation may be burdensome on small depts

Share a Senator Plan

Between 0.5 to 2 faculty senators per dept
 Four depts get a "bonus" senator because of their size
 5 dept pairs share a senator
 Pro: Best representation
 Pro: Not an unwieldy number of senators (12 more than current)
 Pro: Small departments will not feel burdened
 Con: More complex
 Con: Shared senators must make an effort to connect across depts
