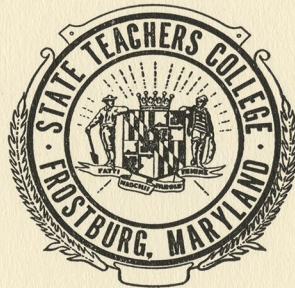

THE ACADEMIC COSTUME

The academic costume dates back to the 12th and 13th centuries when the universities were under the jurisdiction of the Church and most of the students were preparing for religious vocations. The gowns were necessary for warmth in damp, unheated buildings. Over 600 years ago the Universities of Cambridge and Oxford began using a costume similar to the costumes used today. It was almost 1900 before American colleges and universities adopted the use of the academic regalia.

At a glance, it is possible to distinguish between those holding bachelor's, master's, and doctor's degrees. The gowns are similar except for the sleeves, and for the velvet bars and trim on the doctor's gown. It is the hood which is the most important part of the costume. The size and shape of the hood indicates the degree of the wearer. Those with doctor's degrees have hoods which are 4 feet long and bell shaped at the bottom; the master's and bachelor's hoods are 3½ feet and 3 feet long, respectively, while pointed at the bottom. The velvet border of the hood signifies the subject in which the degree was earned. The color of the lining of the hood tells what college or university conferred the degree.

In the academic procession today, the subjects in which degrees were earned most frequently are:
