



Recent years have marked broadening our educational program to include four-year liberal arts, four-year teacher education for secondary school positions, and a Master's program. Enrollments in mathematics, science, and modern languages have increased considerably in this period.

As the 1963 Nemacolin goes to press, it appears most likely that the Curlett Commission Report will be implemented whereby our institution will be converted into a state college, eliminating the word "teachers." For our college this means continued emphasis for teacher education along with further expansion of the liberal arts program.

The staff and adviser to Nemacolin are to be commended upon their sincere efforts in providing for our students a yearbook depicting students striving for excellence at Frostburg and at the same time enjoying moments of leisure.

As you turn the pages of this, your 1963 Nemacolin, may you too increase your angle of vision and view a new and broadening future.





Student Union, no longer just a committee, has become an important functioning body on campus. From it radiates all the social activities of Frostburg State.


Students this year have enjoyed many activities sponsored by this group; such as: Sunday night movies, roller skating parties, sock hops, cultural programs, and most important-Home-









To welcome this year's freshmen, the Sophomore Class had a get acquainted dance in their honor. It resulted in an evening of fun for all.















In Memoriam James A. Hosack

"My life hath been the poem I would have writ, But I could not both live, and live to write it."

Thoreau

James Hosack faced the final battle of his life as he had faced many other challenges, with courage, resourcefulness, and an unshakeable faith in God. The final years of his life brought to him the intense physical suf-

fering which so often accompanies the dread disease of cancer. During the three years from the time of his first surgery to the moment of his death, James Hosack fought a winning battle. True, he lost a skirmish with cancer, and the lives of his family and his friends—and they were legion—will be diminished. But he won the important victory; his indomitable spirit triumphed over physical pain, and by his struggle he demonstrated to those of us who were privileged to know him that a man imbued with the spirit of God is the measure of all things.

Jim Hosack was proud to be a teacher. He had no designs on possible advancements through administrative positions, although his leadership qualities were often demonstrated. He preferred the classroom with its daily contact with young people, and he practiced well the artistry of the master teacher. His experience included elementary and secondary school teaching as well as college. As an associate professor in the Education Department, he was devoted to the task of inspiring and preparing others to enter the profession which he loved.

Jim's other activities contributed to the image of the well rounded man that he presented to the college students. He was a devoted husband and father, a teacher and a lay minister in his church, a World War II veteran and a Naval Reserve officer, an active worker in Masonic organizations, a coach and advisor to various youth groups, and the force behind the resurgence of the Student Education Association on campus.

In the final months of his illness, Jim's friends and fellow faculty members attempted to lighten his burden by assuming some of his classes and his community obligations. It was a matter of great concern to him that others were making small sacrifices in order to ease his load. He frequently expressed his sense of obligation and often wondered aloud how he would ever repay the debt. It is indeed ironic that this humble man whose life had been a living dedication to the service of others should feel uncomfortable at receiving a small portion of that which he had so freely given. For those of us who were privileged to have helped, it was truly a labor of love.

For those of us who were privileged to know James Hosack, there will remain forever the memory of a courageous man and dedicated teacher.
