Our Second Century Begins

From an opening day enrollment of 57 students, Frostburg State University has grown to a present day enrollment of over 5,000 students. Its physical plant, once limited to a single building, Old Main, which housed classrooms and a library has also grown to over 30 facilities including classroom buildings, residence halls, the Lewis J. Ort Library, the Harold J. Cordts Physical Education Center, the Lane Center, and the Performing Arts Center, situated on 255 beautiful acres.


Opened in 1902 as State Normal School No. 2, the University owes its existence to the tenacity of J. Benson Oder, editor of the *Frostburg Mining Journal*, and the citizens of Frostburg who, in spite of political barriers, raised funds and purchased the site on which the University is located.

Principal Edmund Dandridge Murdaugh and three faculty instructed the first Normal School class; in addition, the other faculty taught 151 children in the Model School. The Normal School students, who were high school students having to meet no requirements other than age (girls, 16; boys, 17), had but one twoyear course of study, elementary education. The curriculum consisted of Latin, mathematics, history, rhetoric and literature, natural and physical sciences, drawing, music, calisthenics, psychology, philosophy of education, philosophy of school management, Pedagogy, Observation, Practice Work and Primary Manual Training.

Over the years, the name of the institution has reflected the changes in the scope of its educational mission. In 1935, The State Normal School No. 2 became the State Teachers College at Frostburg, a four-year college which offered a Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education. In 1963, the name became Frostburg State College, and finally in 1987, with the strong support of the local civic and business community, became Frostburg State University, an indication of its growing resources, diversity and excellence in educational opportunities for the region and the State.

In 1988, FSU became a constituent institution of the University System of Maryland, comprised of 11 of the State's 13 public institutions. Expanding to meet the educational needs of the region, the FSU Center in Hagerstown was also established in 1988 to offer upper-level bachelor's degree coursework and graduate programs. The University also opened, in 1990, a permanent location for the Frederick MBA program.

Throughout its growth, the University has emphasized excellence in teaching. Over 80% of the full-time faculty hold Ph.D.'s or terminal degrees from institutions that are among the most prestigious in the nation. Faculty scholarship has led to scholarly books, manuals and journals, as well as numerous articles and reviews. This excellence in faculty has resulted in superior results for students. FSU was recently ranked first among its peers for the number of doctorates per 100 baccalaureate degrees awarded. In the same study, FSU was ranked second in the percentage of national, prestigious awards received by faculty. These have included Fulbrights and significant grants from the National Endowment for the Humanities, the National Endowment for the Arts and other national associations.

At the same time, the University has developed comparable excellence in academic programs, research, consulting, cultural and athletic events, and facilities. In recent years the campus has consistently received a superior rating, the highest state award given for facilities and maintenance. In addition, FSU was also recently ranked 15th in a listing of the safest college towns in the South.

Today, the University's mission and services have expanded significantly. Over 400 full-time administrators and support staff, and more than 200 full-time faculty serve the educational needs of students who come not only from throughout the United States, but also the world. These students have a choice of 34 major programs of study leading to the Bachelor of Art, Bachelor of Science, and Bachelor of Fine Arts degrees as well as graduate degrees in applied ecology and conservation biology, business administration, counseling psychology, education, wildlife/fisheries biology, human performance, modern humanities, and park and recreation resource management. In addition, 12 pre-professional programs are offered.

Frostburg State University continues in its pursuit of excellence as we enter our second hundred years of service. It is a tradition of excellence and commitment, which spans a century, that is FSU's legacy - as well as its future.

Academic Regalia

Academic regalia is a visible reminder that the process of intellectual pursuits has historic and honorable antecedents. The dignity of scholarship in the past remains vital in the present.

Academic costume consists of gowns, hoods and caps. Traditionally made from black silk, gowns increasingly are the color of the institution granting the degree. The bachelor's gown falls in straight lines and has long pointed sleeves, while the sleeves for the master's gown are closed with slits for the arms at the wrist. The doctor's gown has a velvet facing and three velvet bars on bell-shaped sleeves. The velvet is either black or of the color stipulated for the degree held.

The colorful hoods designate the degree of the wearer, the subject in which the degree is held, and the institution which awarded the degree. The colors of the velvet bands on each hood and robe represent the scholar's field of learning while the official colors of the school awarding the degree are always shown in the lining of the hood. Frostburg State University's colors are red, black and white.

The black mortarboard type of cap is most commonly worn and it is usually made of the same material as the gown. Doctor's caps may be made of velvet and may have tassels of gold or in the color of the wearer's degree. Tassels of different colors are also used to indicate academic honors.

The Mace

In the Middle Ages, the mace was a weapon used against armored warriors. It evolved through the years into an ornamental staff which served as a symbol of the authority of the ruler. Colleges and universities have adopted the mace as a decorative staff or baton which is carried by the grand marshal of the institution in all formal academic processions. The mace is also displayed at other significant events.

The Frostburg State University mace was crafted from mountain walnut which was milled in nearby Flintstone, Maryland in 1945. The grain pattern of the quarter-sawn wood was enhanced by laminating side sections to a central shaft which was then turned, point-to-point, on a wood lathe. To obtain a high-gloss finish, ten coats of trewax were applied while mace was turned at high speed on the lathe. The fine detail work around the medallions and the final coating of wax were done by hand.

The design of the Frostburg State University mace is based upon the recorder, a woodwind musical instrument. Two die-struck replicas of the University seal are affixed to the top.

The mace was designed and crafted in 1986 by Dustin Davis of the Frostburg State University Department of Visual Arts.



The Medallion

The Frostburg State University medallion is a replica of the seal of the University and is worn by the President at all formal academic convocations as a symbol of leadership and responsibility vested in that office.

The Presidential medallion is die-struck metal with a highly polished gold finish. The design depicts a torch and shield encircled by the name Frostburg State University, and its location, Frostburg, Maryland. The torch symbolizes the enlightenment of higher education, while banners on each side proclaim the dual mission of the University: Leadership and Scholarship. Appearing on the shield are mountains which represent not only the location of the University, but timelessness and endurance; a bobcat, the mascot of FSU, representing strength and courage; an open book and a candle representing learning; and the founding date of the University, 1898. The seal's design was the result of a competition among the members of the junior class of 1960. By class vote, student Janet Beadle's design was selected.

The Grand Marshal

Dr. Amy Harman has been a professor in the Department of Biology for the past 31 years. She was the Graduate Program Coordinator for Biological Sciences for several years and served on many university committees, including Faculty Senate. She received a B.S. from Elon College, an M.S. from Virginia Polytechnic Institute and a Ph.D. from the University of Maryland.

Commencement Speakers

Christopher L. Zealand

Christopher Zealand will graduate today with a 4.0 GPA in his major of English, after receiving a "false start" at FSU several years ago.

A 1989 graduate of Allegany High School in Cumberland, Christopher attended FSU for two years before leaving and embarking on what would be a journey through a variety of minimum wage jobs. This departure from the world of academia he attributes to "low motivation, restlessness, poor planning and immaturity."

As one of his professors said, "We wish other students would finish as 'falsely' as Christopher began and that others would be as self-disciplined, serious, curious, intellectually courageous and mature."

At FSU, Christopher has been a presenter at the English Colloquium, tutored at the campus Writing Center, worked off-campus and has been an active member of the English Honor Society. He will be attending law school in the fall.

Amber L. Stuver

When Amber Stuver graduates today with degrees in physics and general science, she will have achieved her degrees with an outstanding academic record in a remarkable two years.

A 1997 graduate of Hempfield Area Senior High, the Greensburg, Pennsylvania resident came to FSU hoping to obtain her undergraduate degrees in the shortest time possible, anxious to move on to graduate studies. Her career aspirations are focused around teaching and research.

At FSU, Amber has been elected to membership in the Freshman Honor Society, the National Physics Honor Society, and the National

Mathematics Honor society. She has also been the recipient of several prestigious scholarships including the Tam Memorial Scholarship in Physics.

In addition to her scholastic achievements, Amber has served as a tutor and an officer in the FSU chapter of the Society of Physics Students. She is also an accomplished flute and piccolo player and enjoys ice skating.

Amber has accepted a graduate assistantship at the Pennsylvania State University Department of Physics where she plans to pursue both a master's and doctorate degree.

Diane Carter-Richardson

Diane Carter-Richardson (class of '80) was a world-class sprinter and avid basketball player before "racing" to the top of the financial world.

She is now the president and CEO of RCI Financial, a full service financial marketing firm which owns several subsidiaries in Landover, MD and serves a clientele of government and private industry employees. RCI has grown from a staff of two persons to its current staff of over 200, with sales volumes reaching \$20 million annually.

Diane received a master's degree in business management at Frostburg in 1984 and ventured into the world of financial management services. Prior to starting RCI, she spent over ten years as a bank officer. Since that time, she has dedicated her life to teaching people a practical way of saving and accumulating money.

Diane is one of the most respected financial experts in the Washington area and serves on the board of directors of several corporations. Among her many civic activities, Richardson serves on Prince George's Fundraising Committee for Handicapped Children and is chair of the Amateur Athletic Union, Maryland Regional Chapter. She travels nationally giving speeches and financial seminars to government agencies, churches and non-profit organizations.

Articles on her accomplishments have been featured in several publications including *The Washington Business Journal*, Maryland's *Warfield Business Journal*, Minorities and Women in Business and In the Black. In addition, she is a regular guest on radio talk shows discussing ways to save money.

With such corporate success, this Alumni Achievement Award winner still fondly looks back at her days at Frostburg State. "One of the best experiences in my life was going to Frostburg," she says.





Dr. Catherine Gira

Dr. Catherine R. Gira became the President of Frostburg State University on September 1, 1991. Prior to that, she served for nine years as Provost at the University of Baltimore. She also

previously held the positions of Professor of English and Acting Dean of the College of Liberal Arts at that institution.

Dr. Gira has held leadership positions in numerous national and state professional associations, including the American Association of University Administrators (President, 1988-90); Federation of State Humanities Councils (Vice-Chair, 1993-94; National Secretary, 1991-93; and member of the Board of Directors, 1991-94); Commission on Higher Education, Middle States Association Commissioner (1994-present) and member of the Executive Committee (1997-present); American Council on Education Leadership Commission (1994-1996); Maryland Humanities Council (Chair, 1989-91, member, 1983-95); Maryland Association of Higher Education (President, 1986-87). She sits on several regional and national boards, including those of the Western Maryland Health System, the Rocky Gap Foundation, the Regional Education Service Agency, the Cumberland Theatre, and the national Joint Military Intelligence College.

Dr. Gira earned a B.S. from California State College (PA), an M.Ed. and a Master's in Liberal Arts from The Johns Hopkins University, and a Ph.D. in Literature from the American University. She has been recognized as Woman of the Year by the Maryland Legislature (1993), as one of Maryland's Top 100 Women (1996), and in 1997 was inducted into the Maryland Women's Hall of Fame. She has also been formally honored for her role in regional economic development by the regional Tourism Association Board and by local media. She has written numerous articles on Shakespeare, Renaissance art and literature, and issues in higher education. She has also authored a bibliographic and critical study of Shakespeare's Henry IV, published by Garland Publishing Company in 1994.



Candidates for Degrees

Commencement Speakers

Among her many civic activities, Richardson serves on Prince George's Fundraising Committee for Handicapped Children and is chair of the Amateur Athletic Union, Maryland Regional Chapter. She travels nationally giving speeches and financial seminars to government agencies, churches and non-profit organizations.

Articles on her accomplishments have been featured in several publications including The *Washington Business Journal*, Maryland's *Warfield Business Journal*, *Minorities and Women in Business* and *In the Black*. In addition, she is a regular guest on radio talk shows discussing ways to save money.

Dr. Catherine Gira

Dr. Catherine R. Gira became the President of Frostburg State University on September 1, 1991. Prior to that, she served for nine years as Provost at the University of Baltimore. She also

previously held the positions of Professor of English and Acting Dean of the College of Liberal Arts at that institution.

Dr. Gira has held leadership positions in numerous national and state professional associations, including the American Association of University Administrators (President, 1988-90); Federation of State Humanities Councils (Vice-Chair, 1993-94; National Secretary, 1991-93; and member of the Board of Directors, 1991-94); Commission on Higher Education, Middle States Association Commissioner (1994-present) and member of the Executive Committee (1997-present); American Council on Education Leadership Commission (1994-1996); Maryland Humanities Council (Chair, 1989-91, member, 1983-95); Maryland Association of Higher Education (President, 1986-87). She sits on several regional and national boards, including those of the Western Maryland Health System, the Rocky Gap Foundation, the Regional Education Service Agency, the Cumberland Theatre, and the national Joint Military Intelligence College.

Dr. Gira earned a B.S. from California State College (PA), an M.Ed. and a Master's in Liberal Arts from The Johns Hopkins University, and a Ph.D. in Literature from the American University. She has been recognized as Woman of the Year by the Maryland Legislature (1993), as one of Maryland's Top 100 Women (1996), and in 1997 was inducted into the Maryland Women's Hall of Fame. She has also been formally honored for her role in regional economic development by the regional Tourism Association Board and by local media. She has written numerous articles on Shakespeare, Renaissance art and literature, and issues in higher education. She has also authored a bibliographic and critical study of Shakespeare's Henry IV, published by Garland Publishing Company in 1994.
