set was passed by the Legislature of
Maryland.

But it is enacted by the General Assembly
of Maryland, That from and after the passage
of this act, all Consuls shall be allowed
two allowances, 5 cents per mile, for every
mile they may have to travel over the five
first miles, in delivering over to the post
of their respective countries, any person or
persons who may be committed for com-
mit offence.
