GREAT MEETING OF YOUNG MEN IN NEW YORK.—A meeting of the Whig Young Men in the city of New York, was held at Masonic Hall, on Wednesday evening, which for number and spirit has never been surpassed. Drury Field, Prof. was appointed as president and about one hundred young men were present.

After the meeting was organized, an address in the Young Men of the State was presented, read and adopted.

A series of resolutions, prepared by a committee, were also voted, and adopted by acclamation. Of these resolutions we have only room for the following:

Resolved. That we, the Whig Young Men of the state of New York, assembled, being deeply impressed with the vast importance of the coming election, feeling that by its result may be determined the questions whether we are to live under a government of equal laws or a grinding despotism, or the impossible system of an exclusive metallic currency—under the organization and conservatism of Tammany Hall, or the Whig principles of '76—here pledge ourselves to each other, and to our country, to remove no effort to sustain the principles of freedom and abraham by which the plowmen of the Government are endeavoring to hold us in bondage, and shake to their base the liberties of the country.

Resolved. That the present administration is equally distinguished for its ability and honesty, the first having been shown by its becoming bankrupt with a surplus of forty millions, the latter by paying itself in specie, and its creditors in paper.

Resolved.
