The Advertiser maintains, as it has always done, that the oyster beds are the property of the state, and if they have any value, should be worked by the citizens of the state, and that the citizens engaged therein should pay for their protection. Every citizen engaged in the business, whether dredger, as captain, mate or crank-winder, or as tongsman, should be a citizen of the state. Why should the state allow the beds and bums of earth, to share in the profits of this property if it is a valuable franchise. The Advertiser's position is that only citizens of the state should be permitted to engage in the business. They should pay for their protection and should not be placed in competition with the class of men that have heretofore engaged in the business. The dredgers should also be protected against imposition practiced upon them by captains of dredge boats by taking them from shore and landing them on the bay shores or decaulie marines to sweep the country as beggars upon the community.

When we prohibit non-residents, and aliens from engaging in the business we will have gone far towards solving the problem.

The Income Tax.
The supreme court of the United States has rendered a decision on the Constitutionality of the Income Tax. Only eight of the nine members sat on the case, Justice Jackson being absent by illness. The decision has seriously impaired the operation of the law by declaring unconstitutional that portion which taxes incomes from bonds, federal state and municipal, and all incomes from real estate. The court was evenly divided on the question of sustaining the constitutionality of the law as a whole. The New York Herald of the ninth gave the following very succinct synopsis:
1. The income tax law is now in force.
2. The tax is levied on incomes received between January 12, 1894, and December 31, 1894.
3. The amount of the tax is two per cent.
4. Citizens of the United States—resident or non-resident—and resident aliens are subject to the tax on all incomes. Non-resident aliens are taxed on incomes derived from any source in the United States.
5. Incomes of \$4,000 or less are exempt from taxation.
6. On incomes exceeding \$4,000 the tax is levied only on the portion of the income exceeding \$4,000.
7. Incomes are taxable, no matter from what source derived, except (a). Those derived from rents of real estate.
8. Those derived from interest on State or municipal bonds.
9. Only one deduction of \$4,000 is made from the aggregate income of the members of any family composed of one or more parents and minor children.
10. Where corporations pay taxes on their incomes, individual stockholders are not taxed upon incomes derived from dividends on the stock of such corporations.
11. Each person having an income of more than \$3,000 per year must make a return of such income to the collector or deputy collector of Internal Revenue of the district in which he resides.
12. Guardians and trustees must make returns for their wards or cestui que trust.
13. Returns this year must be made on or before April 15. In succeeding years before the first Monday in March.
14. The tax is payable on or before July 1.
15. It is made the duty of the collector to assess the amount of the incomes of persons who fail to make returns, and add fifty per cent. to the amount of the tax as a penalty.
16. Five per centum will be added for all taxes unpaid ten days after notice and demand, and ten per cent. for non-payment within thirty days after notice and demand, except from estates of deceased, insane or insolvent persons.
17. For a false return a penalty of one hundred per cent on the amount of the tax is imposed.
18. Salaries of State, county or municipal officers are not subject to the income tax.

Governor Marvill's last hour was very quiet. Up to noon of yesterday he remained full consciousness, and before he died he made a statement of his life. He was permitted to lie through the sick room. At noon he sank into a state of coma, from which he never rallied. Death was due to infection of the kidneys and total collapse of the heart.

Sadness in Laurel.
Sadness reigns throughout Laurel this morning, and the scene upon the streets is solemn and impressive. Troop B of the National Guard of Delaware, Captain Osborne, is stationed at the home of the late executive as a guard of honor. Business is entirely suspended, and will remain so until the funeral is over.

FUNERAL THURSDAY AFTERNOON.
The funeral services took place at 2 o'clock in Laurel Thursday afternoon. The members of the legislature and state officials attending in a body. The remains were interred in the family lot at Laurel.

OFFICES LEFT VACANT.
One of the last official acts of Governor Marvill was to appoint James D. Spicer, a young man of this town, in whom he had taken a great interest, State Librarian. Mr. Spicer expected to take charge of the office to-day, but Governor Marvill, when Secretary of State Smith brought the commission for his signature, on Saturday, was unable to sign it. More than a dozen offices are left vacant in this way.

A SELF MADE MAN.
Joshua Hopkins Marvill, late Governor of Delaware, was born in Little Creek hundred, Sussex county, Delaware, September 24, 1823. The Marvill family has been in Delaware for more than 100 years, being originally of English descent on the paternal, and of French descent on the maternal side. They were engaged in agricultural and marine pursuits.

Joseph Marvill, the father of the dead Governor, was a farmer of limited means, but honest and industrious and inculcated the habits of industry upon his children, in which he was always assisted by his wife, Sallie Ann nee Hopkins, to whom he was married in 1815. At the time of his death, which occurred by drowning in 1854, in the 48th year of his age, he left a family of six children, none of whom were grown, and it required all her energy with that of her older children to maintain the family.

On this account the educational advantages of the family were meagre, and Joshua, being the fourth child, was not much encouraged in his studies. As he grew old enough to attend school, which was about three miles distant from the farm on which his mother resided, he found the farm work so pressing that he could only get a day here and a day there to go to school, and surrounded by such embarrassment had the privilege of tuition for only about 30 days. He remained with his mother until he was 20 years of age, and then hiring a man to take his place on the farm, became a mariner for a year, and afterwards engaged in ship-building, which he followed for seven years.

Here he began to develop the mechanical genius that had possessed him from boyhood, and to study with commendable and earnest persistence until he compelled the hidden doors of mechanism to open at his command. So great was his proficiency that in a short time the vessel from the position of an apprentice to that of a master workman, and holding the affections of the firm that gave him employment, became their trusted and honored chief workman. In his 28th year he established a shop for the manufacture of agricultural implements, which he carried on until 1870, when he practically began the basket and crate business which has since that time occupied his attention.

By a small hand machine which was invented by him in 1870, he made 25,000 berry baskets. This experimenting, the following year he substituted steam power for the smaller hand machine, and, protected by letters patent, manufactured 600,000 baskets and crates. The business grew rapidly and in 1875 he put in a larger engine and heavier machinery. By use of these, with continued improvements, the demand so increased that before long he was manufacturing annually 5,000,000 fruit baskets of different kinds, and crates in proportion, while letters of royalty had been issued by him to other houses in different States, for the manufacture of goods of a like character.

In 1849 he was married to Miss Sarah Ann Simms of Somerset county, by whom he had three sons, two of whom are associated with him in business life, and all are possessed of the same sterling principles that mark the life of their parents.

Mr. Marvill was a man of unwavering integrity of deep convictions and of a penetrating mind. He was a stranger, taciturn, rarely expressing an opinion on any subject until the appropriate time for him to speak and come, and then the opinion invariably came in a quiet, unassuming manner, and in a partial judge of a man, being rarely deceived in his estimate. In religion he was a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church, and as such an earnest advocate of all her measures. At the last Wilmington Conference, held a few weeks ago in Smyrna, he was elected a member of the Board of Stewards of the conference. In philanthropy his hand was always open, though he practiced the instructions of his Master in not letting the right hand know what the left hand does.

Politically Governor Marvill was a Democrat until the breaking out of the Civil War, when he became a Republican and remained with that party. He was a man of great energy and of a strong will, and his life was a constant struggle for the betterment of his people.
