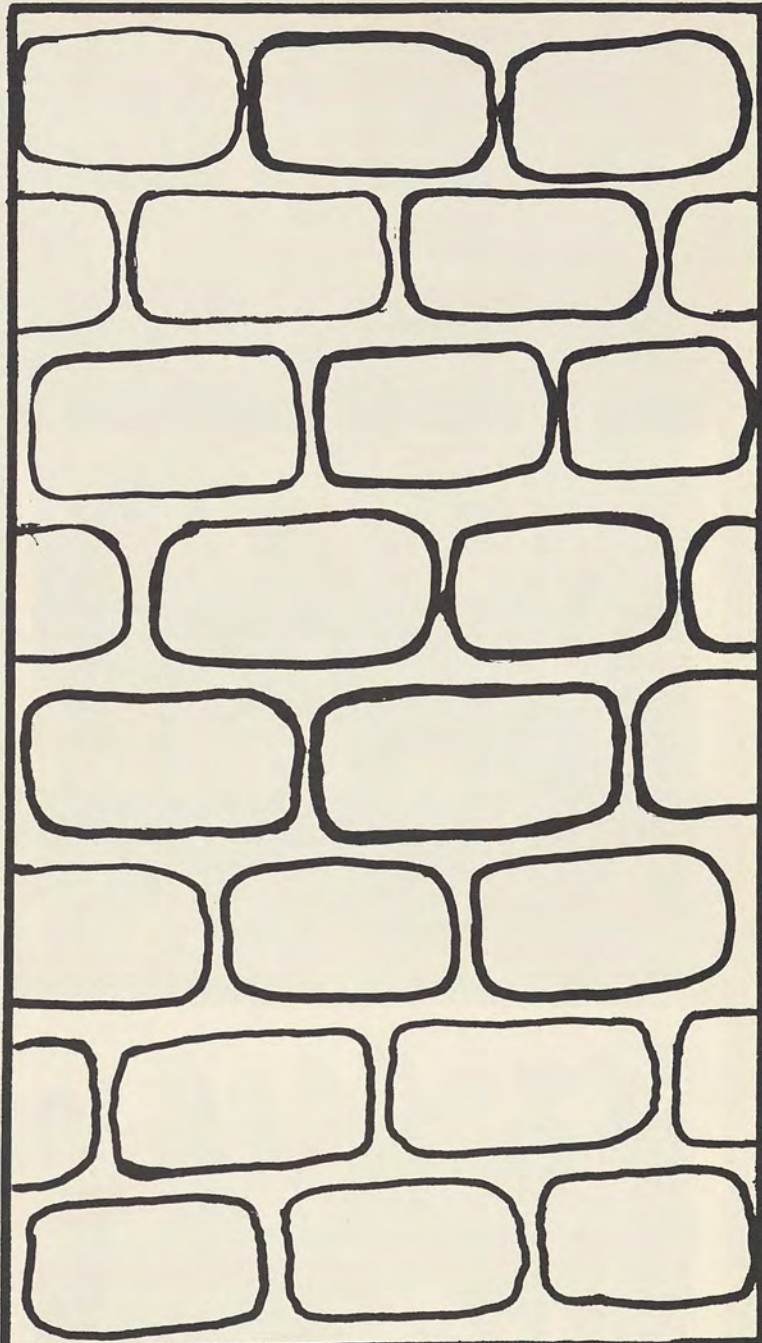
The classes are seldom large. Teachers and student aids are always available, willing, and eager to help out with problems which might arise out of class.

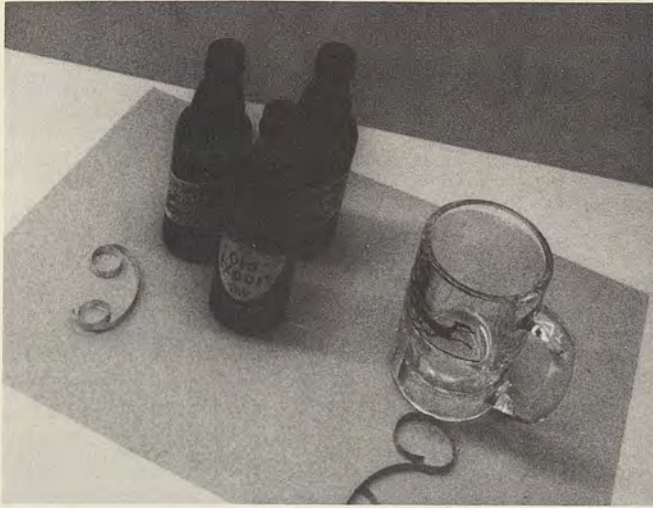

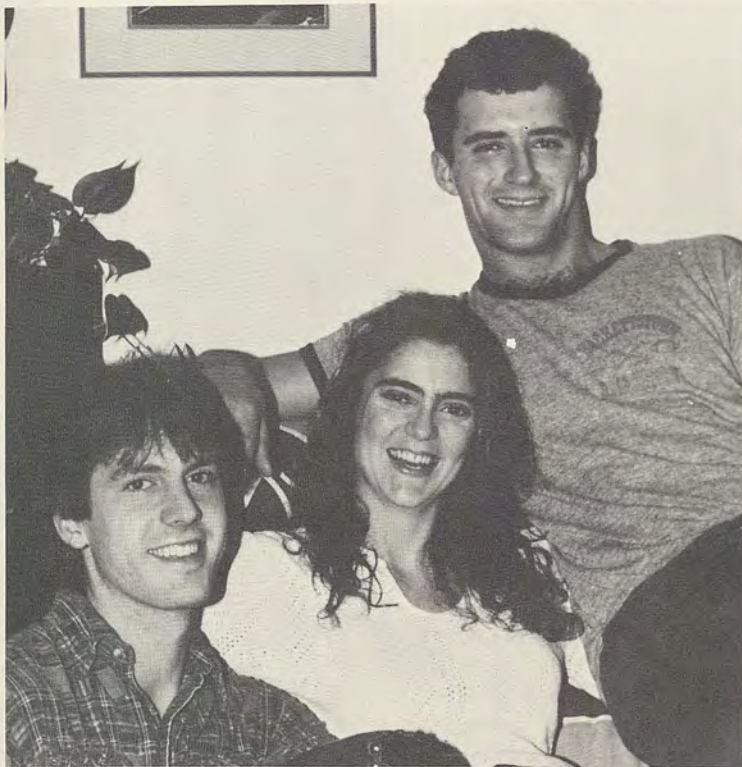

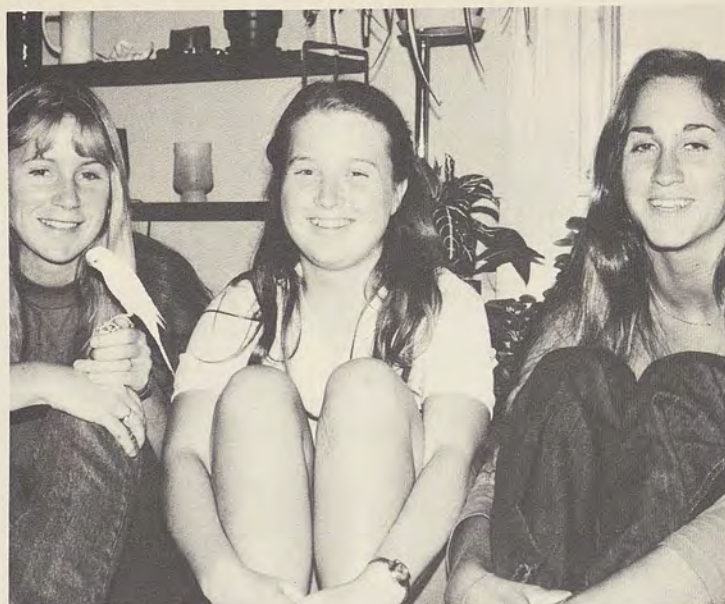

The Frostburg State Bobcat football team, under the leadership of second year coach Dean Peterson, finished their season with a 6-2-2 record. It was their second most successful season in Frostburg's history. The core of the team revolved around the returning thirteen starters and thirty-one lettermen. The team finished the 1982 season with a total of 181 first downs, 1409 yards gained rushing, and 2408 yards gained passing.

There were nine graduating seniors: Greg Shockley, Steve Forsythe, Terry Bell, Russ Lindsay, Mark Van Orden, Charlie Harris, Rich Rich Prather, Greg Fuhrman, and Kris Stultz. Of these, three were honored in their final game by winning coaches' awards. Prather won the game MVP honors, and guards Shockley and Lindsay were named offensive players of the game. Prather also collected, in the game against California (Pa) the most yards rushing (172) and the longest rush (40) of the

season. He is the first Bobcat to join the thousand yard club and has done it in both his junior and senior year. Harris made the longest kickoff return and the longest punt return (91, 64) in the games against Duquesne and California (Pa). Forsythe, in the game against Allegheny, made the most receptions and gained the most yardage on receptions for the season. Bell broke up five passes, another record for the season. Fuhrman and Van Orden rated four and nine of the defensive statistics listing with totals of 83 and 36. All of these outstanding seniors will be missed in the years to come.

There are, however, many more outstanding players on the team that will serve as the inner core of next year's team. Outstanding efforts of the season include those of Jobie Waldt, Terry Hersh, Mike Lippold, Happy Hall and Sean McInerney. Waldt, in the game against West Liberty, completed the longest pass (70 yds) and made the

record for the most yards passing (374). The longest punt was by Heish in the game against Grove City (52 yds), and the longest field goal (44 yds) was by Lippols in the game against Randolph-Macon. Hall made 19 tackles in the game against California (Pa), the most of the season. McInerney was named Defensive Player of the game against Westminster. All of these players will be the strength upon which Coach Peterson will rebuild the team.

The coaching staff of the '82 Bobcats consisted of eight people. They were led by head coach Dean Peterson. He was helped by: Dave Catron, the defensive coordinator; Ron Pyles, defensive linemen coach; Ed Schwarz, offensive line coach; and Jim Cunningham, the receivers coach. Gary Barry assisted coach Pyles and Rich Fox assisted coach Schwarz. The three team captains also helped: Jobie Waldt, Mike Lippols, Happy Hall.

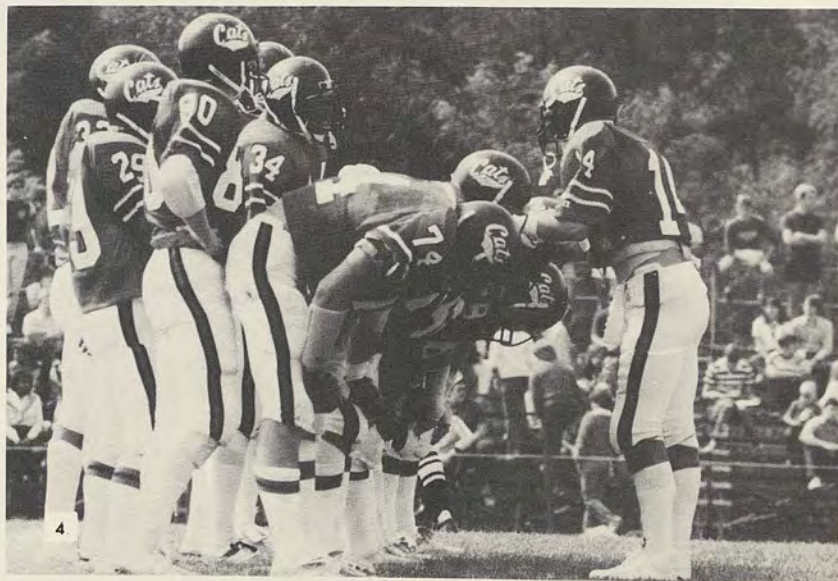
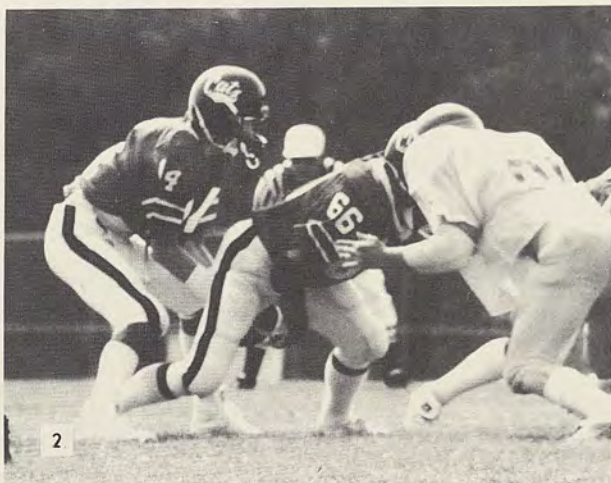


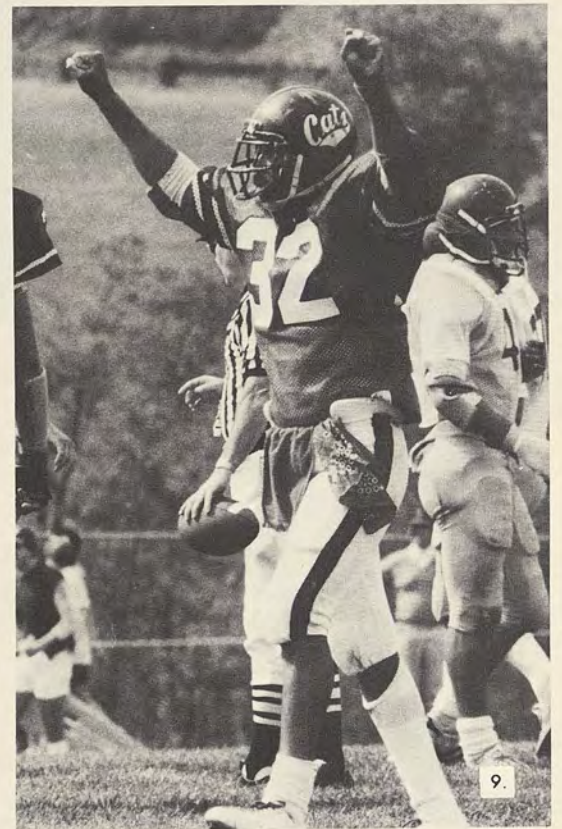

The Frostburg State Bobcat Booters had another excellent season. With twelve returning players, the team went on to a 10-3-3 record. They were coached by Ken Kutler, who entered his fourteenth season as coach. Coach Kutler was very well pleased with the team this past year. It was only because of a 'decision' by officials that the Booters did not go to the NCAA Championships. It was a big shock that another team was picked over them, especially when one considers their

record and that of their coach (109-68-36).

Though the team did not go to the NCAA Championships, they were recognized as a very powerful and impressive team. Frostburg State hosted the ECAC here and the Booters won it with a crowd of spectators cheering them on. The players were also recognized by being selected for various 'teams.' Noel Cyrus, for the second year, was named an all-American. Both he and Mark Weber, co-captains

and co-MVP's, were first team all-State, and Skip Dostal and Lawrence Sagel were second team all-State. All-South players were: Noel Cyrus (1st team), Mark Weber (2nd team), and Skip Dostal (2nd team). Skip was also the leading scorer for the season with a record of seven goals and four assists.

Though the team may be losing some of their players to graduation, be ready for another outstanding season in '83 when the Booters make another bid for the playoffs.



The 1982 Bobcat Harriers was FSC's best cross country squad ever. They were coached, for the thirteenth year, by Bob Lewis, who has a dual meet record of 63-21. This past year, the Harriers' main objective was to finish in the top ten of the college division. They did that and much more.

At the NCAA III Championships, they ran to an eighth place team finish. Rich Hoffman finished thirteenth and thus became FSC's first All-American in cross country (one must remember that there are 237 teams in division III: over 3,000 runners in div. III in the U.S.). The eighth

place finish was the highest ever for the Harriers.

The Harriers won the Mason-Dixon conference title, as well as taking the individual first, second, and third place titles. The meet was hosted by FSC for the first time, and it was held at Rocky Gap State Park. Rich Hoffman won the race handily, and John Arias followed in second. The big race was between third place finisher, Jack Kiley, and the defending champion from UMBC. With less than 800 yards to go, Kiley pulled out into the lead. The three runners and Jon Maier (8th) and John Herring (9th) were

named to the All-Conference team.

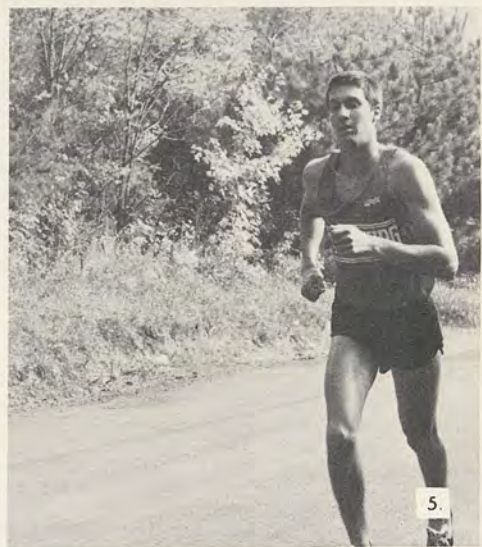

Their 15-4 record is the best, according to wins, in Bobcat Field Hockey history and when one looks at their schedule, the record seems to be almost impossible. The FSC Bobcats played a good cross section of division I and II teams.

Of the twenty-six players, there were seven starter returns from last year's squad. Of these were the top two scorers of last year, Mary Hain and Barbara Barrett. Defensively, there was Kelly Hyde, who Lottes considers the anchor of her defense. Behind Hyde was

Kelly Shriver, goalie. In the final game against Salem, Pam turned aside 19 shots, an outstanding accomplishment.

The Frostburg State women's lacrosse team completed a very successful 11-4 season with a second place finish in the State Tournament.

To reach the finals, Frostburg defeated Hood, 11-8; lost to Washington College, 9-7; beat Anne Arundel, 6-1; and UMBC, 10-6. FSC and UMBC tied with 3-1 records in pool two, but by virtue of the Lady Bobcats' win over UMBC, Frostburg advanced to the title match versus Towson State. FSC was dominated by the more experienced division I team, losing 22-11.

Coach Sharon Irwin had said before the tournament she would be happy with a second place finish, but she was

disappointed at the many scoring opportunities her girls did not capitalize on. In all, FSC had 47 shots.

As for her team's play, Irwin commented, "Our defense did not play well until we played UMBC. I don't know if they had tournament jitters or what. We played very well against UMBC. We controlled the ball and our defense played well."

Three FSC players scored 11 goals in the 5 games: Barb Barrett, Janet Webb and Denise Wade. Diane Corbett added 9 goals and 7 assists. Corbett set FSC scoring records for goals (51) and assists (26), while Barrett also broke the old goals record of 47 by one.

During the season, many girls were dominant; among them were Barrett and goalie Renee Cannon. Barrett was nominated for Athlete of the week on numerous occasions as she consistently led the team through the games. Cannon was noted for her outstanding saves record: 189 for the season. It is a new FSC record.

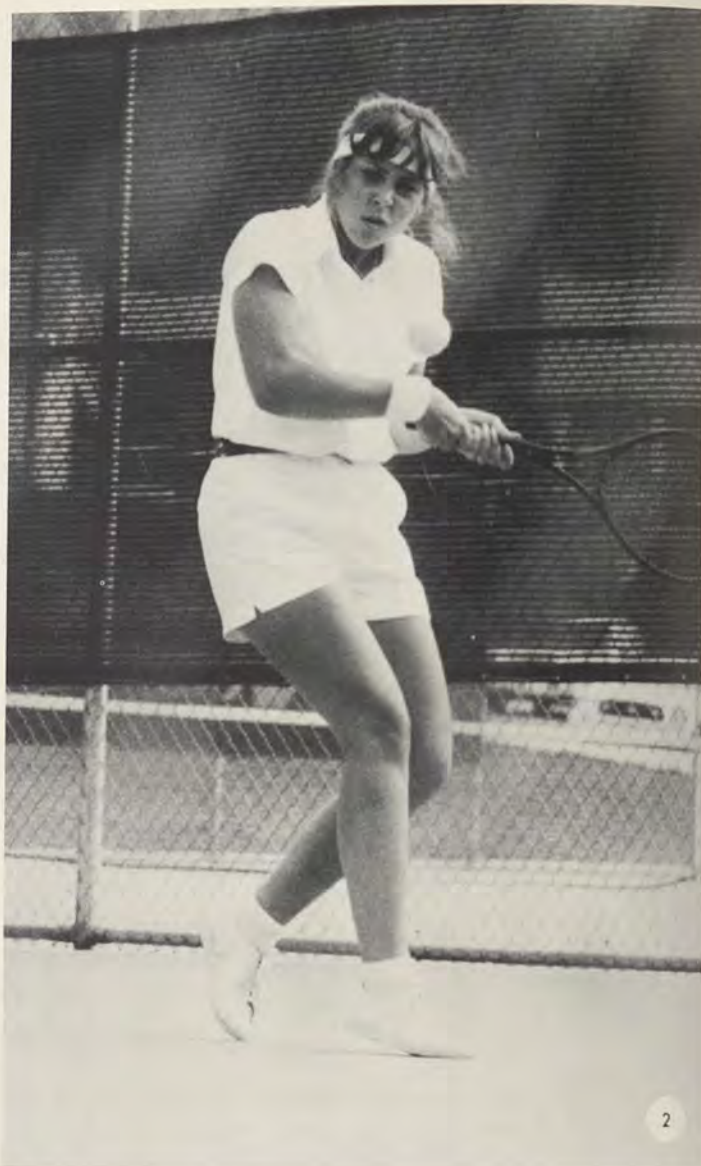

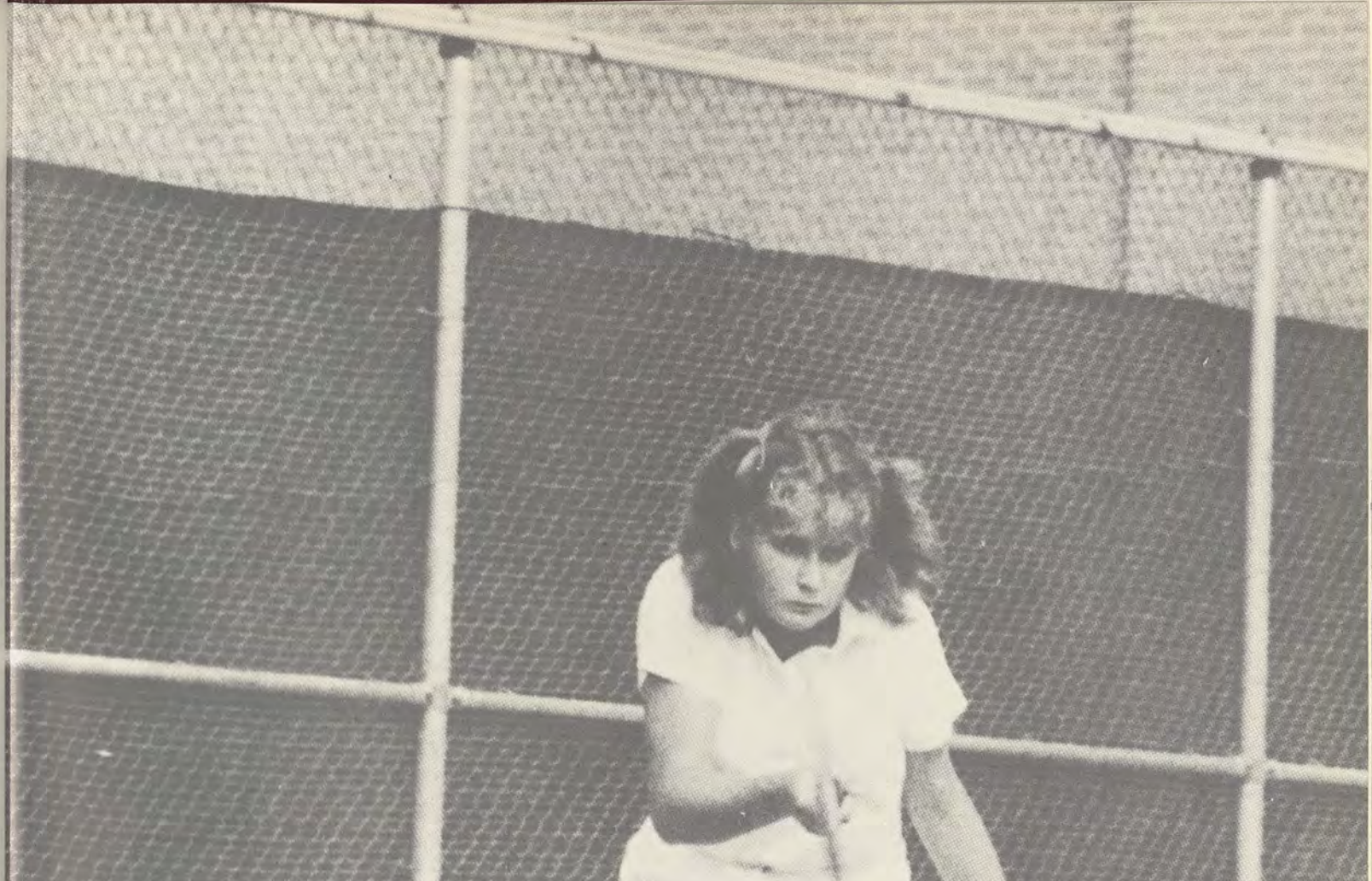

The Frostburg State College Women's Tennis team would up its 1982 campaign at the Maryland State Tournament held at UMBC. Not much went well for the 7-6 Bobcat Netters. They finished in 5th place with thirteen points, well behind the champion Johns Hopkins squad with 30 points.

"We did not do as well as I had hoped," said Coach Nancy Crawley of her team's showing. The bright spot in the tournament for FSC was Jackie Folio. She ended her FSC career by breezing through her first two matches. She beat Loyola 6-2, 6-2 and Johns Hopkins University 6-1, 6-4. In the finals, Folio fell to Lori Weiss of Salisbury in straight sets. Nevertheless, Folio's appearance in finals was called one of the "highlights of the season" by Coach Crawley.

This achievement helped offset a disappointing finish by the rest of the Bobcat squad.

Lea Pfluger, (#1 in singles), Tina Pinocci (#2) and Debie Assael (#3) all fell in their semifinal single matches. "I was disappointed that Tina and Lea lost in the semi's," stated Crawley. Pinocci's

loss was especially bitter since she had already beaten the girl once before. Assael fared no better in her first state competition as a Bobcat. Assael showed considerable poise for a freshman, however, in pulling out a tough (7-5, 7-6) win against Pam McDonald of Loyola. Her luck did not hold against Amy Chambers of Mt. St. Mary's however.

Even the usually potent doubles team of Pinocci and Pfluger had trouble in this tournament. Although posting a 6-2 regular season record, they fell in the 1st round to Sayet-Walderman of Goucher (0-6, 6-1, 7-5).

Frostburg's disappointing showing in this tournament could not obscure the fact that Crawley's netters played some fine tennis this season. They turned a dismal 4-8 record in 1981 into a winning record of 7-6.

A major factor in this turnaround was the fine play of Tina Pinocci and Lea Pfluger both as doubles partners and in singles play.

As a doubles team they lost only five sets on their way to posting a regular season 6-2 record. Coach Crawley stated, "I was very pleased with Lea's

and Tina's play. They now play with patience and good intensity."

Pinocci (#2 in singles) also posted a sterling singles record this year. In a complete turnaround of last year's 4-8 record, Pinocci lost only four sets and won eleven straight matches on her way to a 12-1 record. Pinocci's only loss came against West Virginia Wesleyan. This mark is second best in FSC history. Crawley can look forward to her return next year.

Lea Pfluger turned in a fine 9-4 record from her #1 singles position this year. Crawley cites Pfluger's return for her senior campaign after a year of inactivity due to injury as one of the main factors in the turnaround of the team's record.

Jackie Folio, tagged by Coach Crawley as the most improved player for this year, made a strong contribution with an 9-4 record, including 8 wins in 10 matches in the #4 singles slot.

When asked about her team's 2nd winning season in 7 years, Crawley stated, "I was pleased with our season. We played some good matches this year."



When all was said and done, it was not the opposition that was the Frostburg State baseball team's biggest enemy, it was Mother Nature. Included in FSC's 10-16 season were 20 rainouts, leaving FSC coach Bob Wells disappointed at what he felt would be a fine season and impressive schedule.

As usual, Wells was optimistic when the season began. However, he knew the Bobcats were young and it would take some time for them to adapt to the college game. Included on the roster were 9 freshmen and 11 sophomores. Over half of this group proved to be an integral part of the team.

After a dismal 2-13 start, Frostburg won 8 of their last 11 to finish with a 10-16 mark. The ten wins represented the second smallest total in Wells' nineteen year coaching career.

Many bright spots exist in the cloudy season of 1983. A number of players expected to play backup roles proved to be solid performers. Only two seniors departed the team, leaving a solid nucleus for next season.

Four regulars finished the '83 season

above the .300 mark, led by Bill Burton's .359 average while handling first base. Burton committed just one error, and tied for the team lead in RBI's with 15. Doc Schwartz was the early season hitting sensation. He finished at .343 after flirting with the .450 mark midway through the year. He also totaled 15 RBI's and led the team in homeruns with three.

With 12 hits in his last 22 at bats, Larry Sporer finished with a .338 average. After beginning the year as a backup catcher, Sporer moved to RF. He finished with 15 RBI's and tied Schwartz for the team lead in doubles with 5. In 65 AB's, the sophomore struck out just once.

Completing the foursome with .300 averages was Joe Loyal. Loyal batted .313 with 2 HRs and 12 RBIs as the designated hitter. He led FSC in runs with 20.

Other solid performances were turned in by: Chris Fitzgerald — a .288 average, 10 RBIs and a team high of 10 stolen bases; Paul Engle — a .450

average after taking over as the second catcher; Happy Hall — a .288 average with 8 RBIs; and freshman Scott Hackal — a .250 average, but 12 RBIs as the starting shortstop.

Dale Gromes led FSC with a 2.38 ERA. He walked just one batter in eleven-plus innings, but appeared in just 5 games due to injuries. Freshman Rex Campbell started the year as an outfielder, but late in the year pitched several fine games in relief. He recorded one of Frostburg's two saves while compiling a 3.60 ERA.

Overall, Wells was satisfied with the hitting (.238 average), and with the exception of a few spots, happy with the fielding (.933). The pitching is another story. Despite the poor ERA, Wells felt his pitchers were hurt by the lack of early outdoor work.

For Bob Wells, 1983 was definitely a learning experience. Not only did Wells have to learn to live with a losing record and poor pitching, Wells was saddled with Mother Nature's worst offerings in many a spring.

The women's Basketball team, under the leadership of fourth year coach, Jim Crawley, qualified for their second NCAA playoffs. 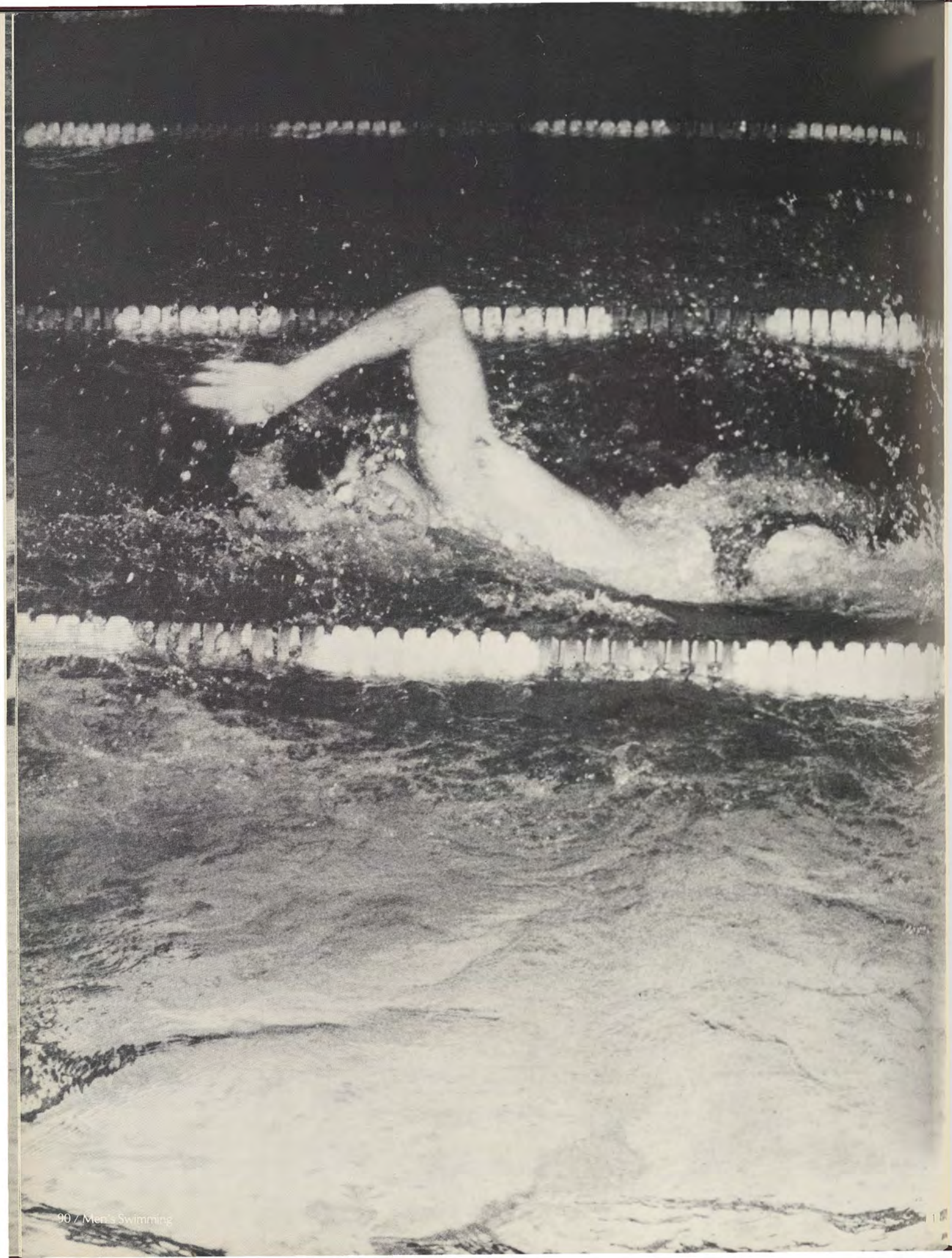

There was a moment of anxiety when Trenton came back to lead with less than seven minutes to go, only to see Frostburg score eleven unanswered points and settle matters.

By winning their first game, the Lady Bobcats earned a spot in the Championship game against number one seed, Kean College. The game started out rather badly as the squirettes (Kean) built up a fifteen point lead. The game looked to be an easy win for them. However, Frostburg managed for a 49-41 halftime deficit. They lost more though when Kean raised the points to 67-51 with thirteen minutes left.

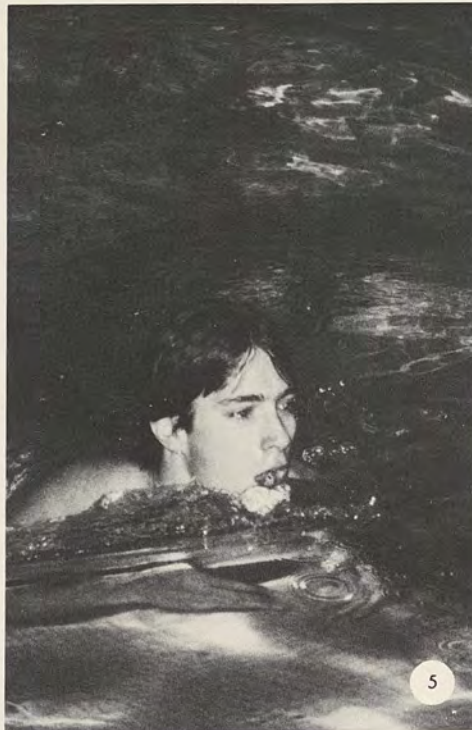
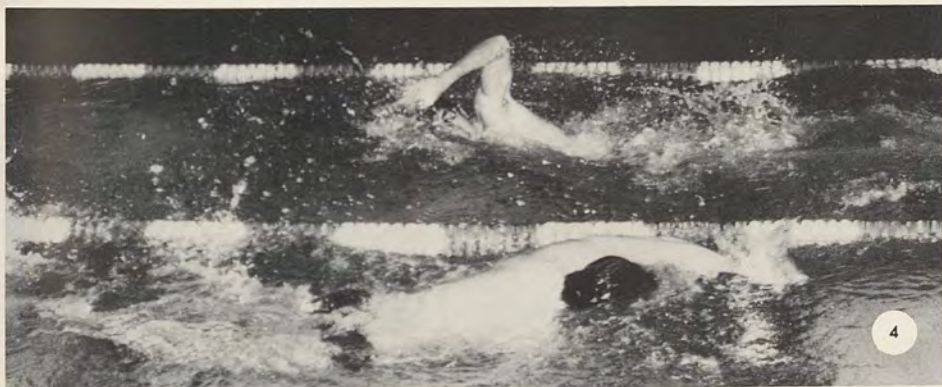
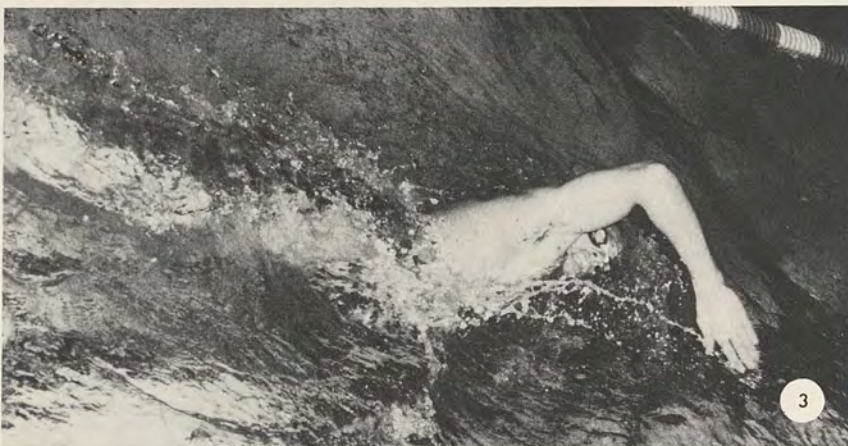
Frostburg then scored thirteen more points to trail 69-66 before time ran out on them. In this game, Mary Carol Jackson played an exceptional game, scoring twenty-four points before fouling out. For her career, she finishes with 1355 points and 1070 rebounds, both FSC records.

Besides the team's first ever win in National playoffs, their 20-5 final record duplicates the finest FSC season ever and their .800 winning percentage put them in 11th place in the country. 

Four Frostburg women's swimmers, the largest contingent ever, participated in the NCAA Division III National Championships at Canton, Ohio from March 8 to March 12.

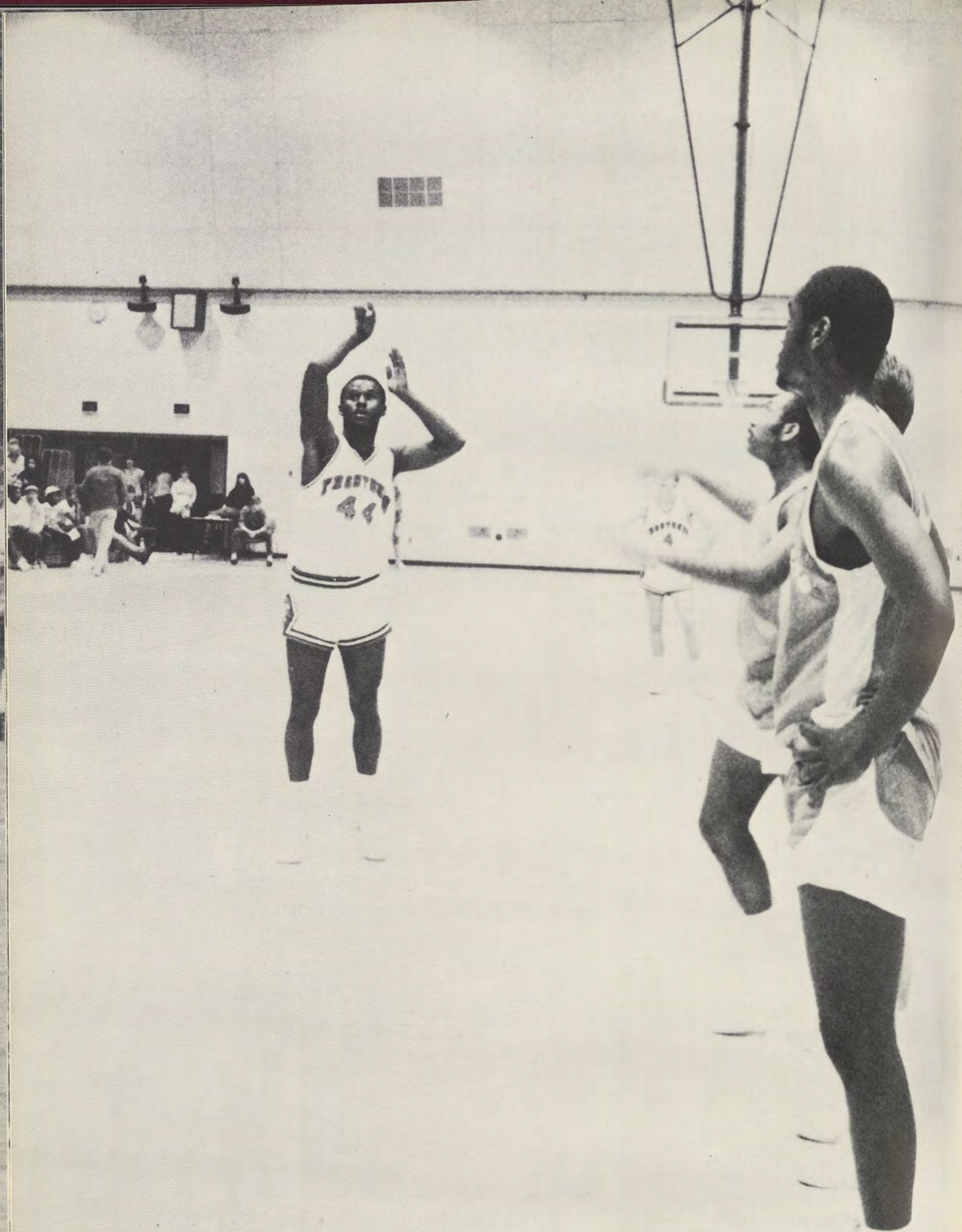

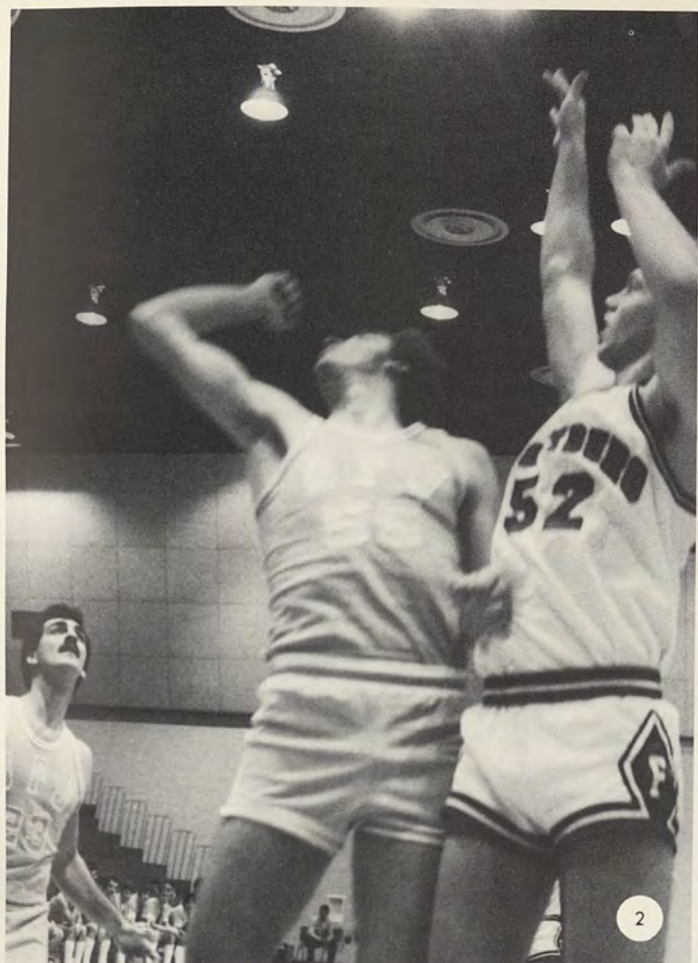
Two Frostburg swimmers qualified

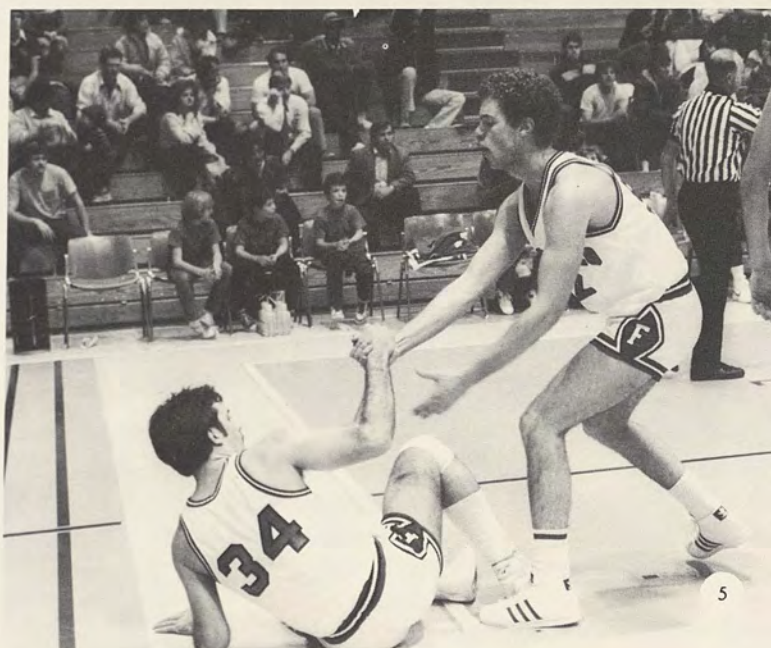
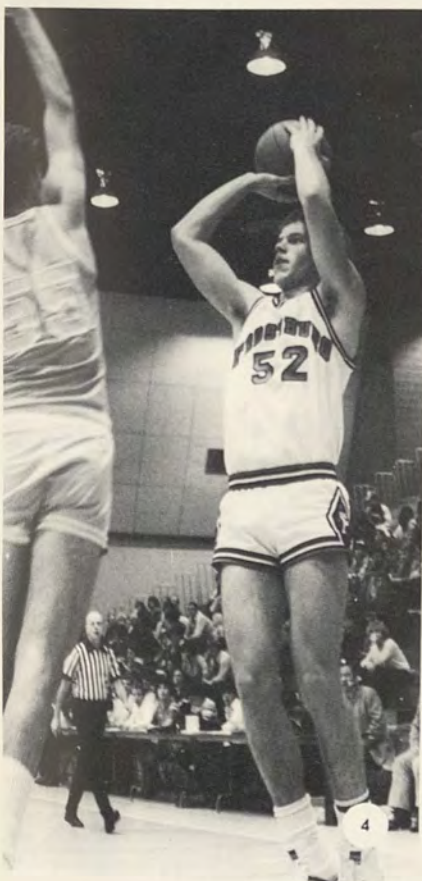
The final woman is diver Katy Corran. Corran qualified for the three-meter dive in the Bobcat Women's Invitational. This was her first trip to the Nationals.

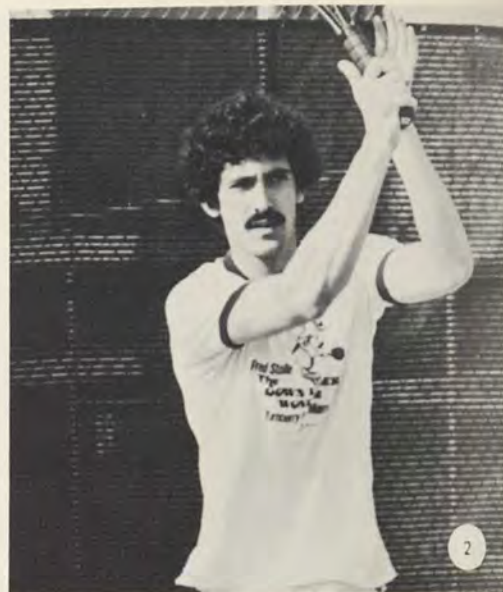
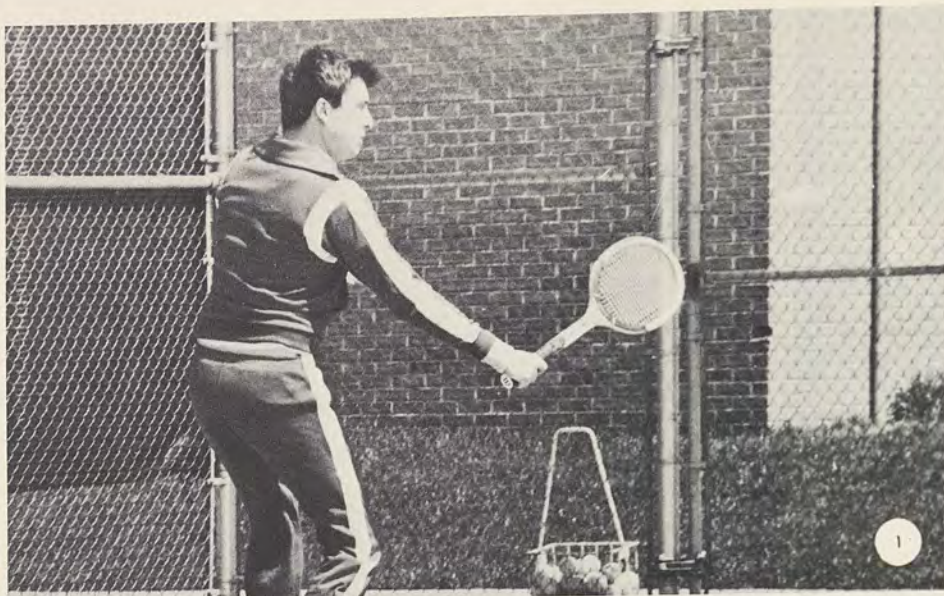



Frostburg gained a forfeit win in the number one doubles and a singles win by Tom Machtergaele for their only points versus Indiana.

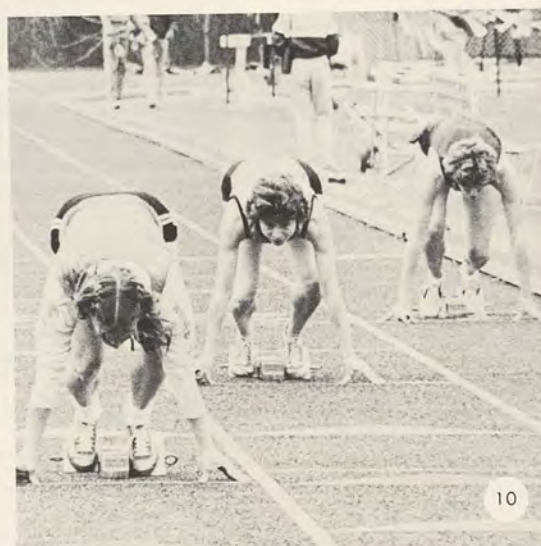
