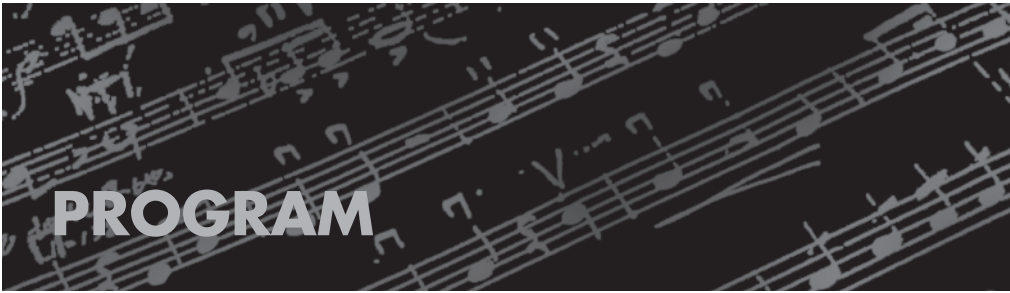

## **MUSICIAN BIOGRAPHIES**

**Jarod Armes** is a music education major in his senior year at Salisbury University. Originally from Federalsburg, MD, Armes served as a trombonist in the Marine Corps for the MCAGCC Band in 29 Palms, CA, from 2005-2009. During this time, Armes had the opportunity to perform for the funeral of President Gerald Ford, the Rose Parade and NBC's Sunday Night Football at Lambeau Field. Armes has been a featured soloist for the Salisbury Pops and also has performed with the Salisbury Symphony Orchestra and Delmarva Big Band. Armes' trombone teachers include Lawrence Knier and SSgt. Tom MacTaggart of the (USA).

**Jocelyn Armes** is a senior at Salisbury University majoring in music education with a concentration in saxophone. Originally from Deal Island, MD, she graduated from Parkside High School in Salisbury, MD, in 2007. In addition to her musical studies, Armes is an active Bellavance Honors student and has presented research on the historical saxophone repertoire. She was a guest conductor for the Salisbury University Wind Ensemble in 2010 and also has performed with the Salisbury Symphony Orchestra. After graduation, Armes hopes to teach music at the middle school level and attend graduate school to pursue an advanced degree in either education or music performance.
