### Remarks from the University President

#### President's Residence

- President has vacated the university's campus President's Residence
  - O Due to physical challenges, use of stairs has become prohibitive and the president has relocated to a private residence off-campus
  - President's Residence is not equipped with an elevator; the estimated cost of equipping the President's Residence is on the order of hundreds of thousands of dollars and the money could be better spent elsewhere
  - o The President's Residence can still be utilized for various functions; the furniture in the residence is owned by Salisbury University and remains in place
  - Appropriate committees, with faculty input, will have time to evaluate future use of the President's Residence

#### Budget

- The State of Maryland is facing a budget deficit of \$600 million plus, which is much higher than an expected deficit of around \$450 million
- The hit to the University System of Maryland was estimated to be somewhere in the range of \$40 million to \$80 million when the state's deficit was expected to be around \$450 million; we can now expect a substantially higher impact on USM given the higher-than-expected state budget shortfall
- There has been no mention of furloughs at this juncture
- We may in for a couple of difficult years, but Salisbury University is in high demand as evidenced by the number of applicants each year

Learning with Technology Committee

- Report on charge to investigate the Bookstore's textbook reporting policy and make possible recommendations to accommodate e-textbooks and online access codes presented by Dr. Brent Zaprowski
  - One of the computer systems the Bookstore uses requires an ISBN number; if the materials you require do not have an ISBN number, they can make one up
  - Bookstore personnel are very willing to work with faculty on issues, just call them when you need assistance
  - The committee recommended that the Bookstore produce a "Speedy Sheet" of instructions for faculty using non-standard materials
  - SU is ahead of most USM institutions on meeting reporting requirements and that even with all of the sources available to students, roughly 90% still choose to get their materials through the bookstore

## Presentation by Mr. Todd Smith, Web Communications Manager

- Front Page, SharePoint Designer, and Expression Web are no longer supported by Microsoft, and so we need to transition to new software to edit, add, and maintain content on the main SU web site (www.salisbury.edu)
- Cascade Server CMS (by Hannon Hill) was selected by an RFP committee; it has been purchased and installed, and is in a pre-production environment as we work out the kinks
