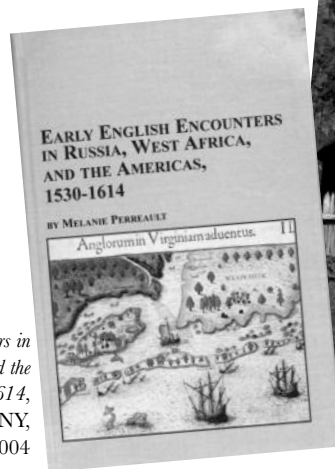

## New Books at the Nabb Center

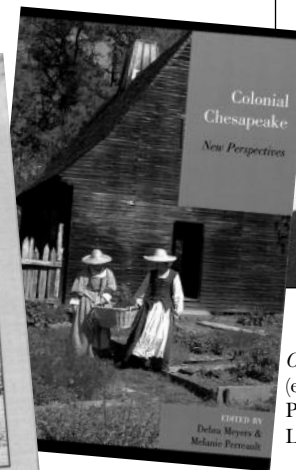

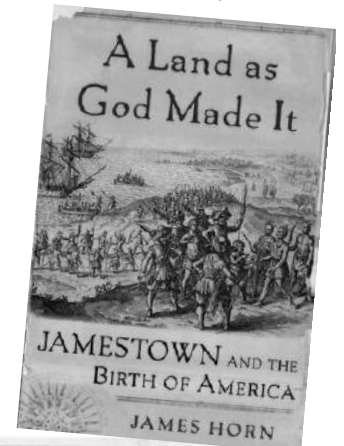

Wednesday, April 11, 2007

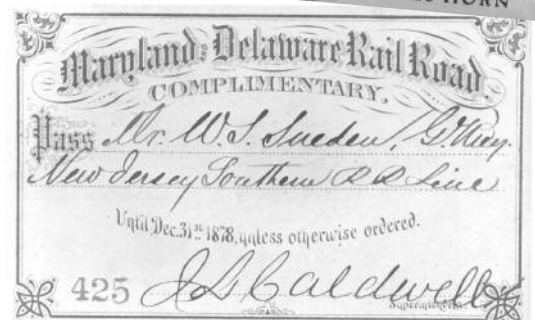
