11. The board being entirely a public department, its proceedings would be open to Congress, and subject to any alteration or modification which experience might suggest.

12. Over and above the duties of the board, in the character of a Financial Congress, it would be peculiarly adapted to investigate the great interests of Agriculture, Manufacture and Commerce, in relation to the currency, and with the main object of these investigations, to report thereon from time to time as might be required by either branch of the National Legislature.

13. From session to session, and consulting with the first members of your General Government, the practicability of the proposed system, and its immediate adoption, as precluded by circumstances—policy or unremovable circumstances—hence the arrangement has been induced to submit the plan as here presented with a view to the action of the next or succeeding Congresses.
