Opening Remarks from the Faculty Senate President

Faculty Representation on Associate Provost Search Committee

- Volunteers are still needed to serve on the search committee for the position of Associate Provost
- We currently have two volunteers from the Fulton School, one from the Library, and one from the Henson School; we need volunteers from the Seidel and Perdue Schools
- Ideally we would like a number of volunteers from each school and the library so that the Provost can have choices
- Discussion
 - A question arose regarding whether the successful candidate would be offered tenure in an appropriate department at SU if the candidate is from outside SU
 - The situation is not uncommon in positions at that level, and if that holds true in this case, then faculty might be more motivated to participate in the process
 - Faculty Senate President will follow up with the Provost about whether or not tenure will part of the hiring / negotiation process

Update from Faculty Welfare Committee on Evaluation of Administrators (presented by Dr. Bart Talbert)

- Evaluation of administrators will be conducted through Gullnet
- Beginning on Wednesday, September 23, the Gullnet system will email faculty to let them know that that evaluations are available as well as the Administrators being evaluated
- The date range to be used for the evaluations will be 9/23 – 11/20 (Friday before Thanksgiving)
- Faculty will have the opportunity to evaluate their department Chair, Dean, the Provost, and the President
- Faculty will receive weekly emails reminding them to participate in this process until they complete their assigned evaluations
- Discussion
 - The Library also has the position of “Director” whom also engage in evaluation of faculty; question of whether Directors should be included in the list of administrators to be evaluated by Library faculty
 - FWC will work with IT about including Directors on list of administrators to be evaluated by Library faculty

No Remarks from the Provost Today

- Provost Allen and Interim Associate Provost McCartney are attending a meeting at the Board of Regents and unable to attend our meeting today; consequently, there are no announcements from the Office of the Provost

New Business

Snow Days in Spring 2016 Semester

- The University System of Maryland has streamlined the academic calendar, leaving no room for make-up days due to inclement weather
- Provost had previously suggested that faculty be prepared for inclement weather by having assignments and work available for students online via MyClasses or other similar contingency

— Discussion

- Some classes, particularly labs, require in-classroom work; lack of make-up days severely impacts these courses
- One suggestion was to schedule one Saturday each month for make-up days; a problem here would be of students that work and would not be able to attend a Saturday class
- Consensus to send this issue to the Academic Policies Committee for consideration

Changes in Open Enrollment (reported by Dr. Nancy Siegert, Associate Vice-President for Human Resources)

- We will be returning to the telephone “TVR” system that we have used in the past rather than using an online mechanism
- For those employees who pay their benefit premiums via payment coupons, changes will be processed via a paper worksheet; worksheets will be in the Open Enrollment Packets, and will also be available in Human Resources
- Changes for 2016
 - The Healthcare Flexible Spending Account maximum will increase from \$2,500 to \$2,550 for the plan year
 - Grandchildren, Legal Wards and Other Child Relatives can only be covered until they are age 25 (not 26)
- Wellness Requirements for 2016
 - Select a Primary Care Physician (PCP)
 - Complete the Health Risk Assessment
 - Review the results of the Health Risk Assessment with your PCP
 - Submit the physician’s verification form back to the health plan
 - Complete age/gender recommended preventive services*
 - Complete a stress management or nutrition class through your medical plan*
 - Participate in any disease management programs **if contacted***

*Additional information will be provided once available.

— Reward

- PCP copays waived for remainder of the plan year once the physician’s verification form has processed through the health plan and no premium surcharge for non-compliance.

— Benefits Fair

- Benefits Fair to be held on Monday, October 5, 11:30AM – 2:30PM, in the Wicomico Room of the Guerrieri University Center
- Medical, dental, prescription, retirement, life insurance, and Unum plan representatives will be available to answer any questions that you may have

- Free screening services will also be provided (blood pressure, bone density screening, and blood glucose screening)
- Human Resources Walk-In Open Office Hours
 - Human Resources will again offer Walk-In Open Office Hours for anyone needing assistance with making changes during Open Enrollment
 - Individual appointments are not needed during these hours
 - A schedule of the hours will be sent separately via email
 - Walk-In Open Office Hours are different than the Open Lab Hours for those needing assistance with completing the Health Assessment Online
 - There are 2 Open Lab Hours scheduled for those needing assistance with the online health assessment in TETC 110A on Wednesday, September 23, 1:30PM – 4:00PM, and Friday, September 25, 11:30AM – 4:00PM
- Open Enrollment Packets
 - For those employees whose benefit premiums are processed via a payroll deduction, the Open Enrollment Packets will be sent to Human Resources by the State of Maryland Employee Benefits Division
 - Once received and labeled, they will be distributed via campus mail
 - We expect the packets to arrive in early October, but will confirm closer to that time
 - For those employees who pay their benefit premiums via payment coupons, the Open Enrollment Packets will be mailed to your home address by the State of Maryland Employee Benefits Division
 - We expect the arrival time to be the same
- Rates
 - The 2016 rates are not yet available, but will be provided once received
 - The rates are to be included in the Open Enrollment Packets
- For those not making changes to their benefit plans
 - If you are making no changes to your benefit plans, you do not need to do anything
 - However, if you wish to continue using any of the Flex Spending plans, those do not roll over automatically so you have to call in and specify your participation
- Discussion
 - The requirement to participate in training for stress management and nutrition is perhaps excessive, especially given that a number of faculty already have expertise in these areas
 - The age cutoff for dependent children, being lowered to 25, seems arbitrary and we are being given very little notice

- Using the website to download required forms, depending on your health insurance carrier, can be difficult
- Some Senators reported that their doctors are paying little, if any, attention to the health assessment forms and simply signing them
- We were reminded that spouses/partners must also complete the health assessment
