## Room Changes

approved room changes will be allowed during the final week of classes this semester instead of during the second week of classes next semester. Such room changes agree in writing to vacate their present rooms on or before Friday December 12, 1975 regardless of whether or not they are able to move into their new room assignment by that date.

Residence Halls officially close for semester break on Saturday, December 13 at 10:30 a.m. All approved room changes must be made prior to that date. In some instances, e.g., in the case of graduating Seniors whose exam schedules do not allow them to vacate their rooms and leave campus until Saturday December 13, it may be difficult or impossible for new occupants to move directly into those rooms. In such cases, persons making the changes will have to make arrangements to store their belongings in their possessions home over the break. The College does not have storage space available for this purpose. The only time when this will not apply is in the case of a student(s) moving from basement rooms or overcrowded rooms since new students will not be assigned to these spaces; however, if at all possible, even these changes should be made before the semester break.

Please do not ask us to postpone an approved room change until the first or second day of the second semester. This is simply not possible since the vacated rooms must be ready for immediate occupancy when the new students arrive on Tuesday, January 6. You will receive a room change at the end of this semester, please follow that schedule.



## The Star of Bethlehem

The Frostburg State College Planetarium will present its new program entitled "The Star of Bethlehem" during the month of December on Tuesdays and Thursdays at 7:30 p.m. and on Saturdays and Sundays at 2:30 p.m.

The first half of the program will be a retelling of the Christmas story by use of the planetarium sound system, special visuals and a number of special effects projectors. This portion of the program will include Christian music from classical to contemporary, in addition to nativity art that spans the Christian era. Special effects will include a gas laser and a color organ. Part two of the program will consider the questions "When was Christ born?" and "What was the star seen by the Wise Men?"

This program is especially recommended for family viewing. Depending on the demand, a second showing may be given one hour after the listed times. It is still possible for church groups and other organizations to request special showings of this program.

A nominal admission fee will be charged for the general public.

## Graduate Courses

More than 100 courses for graduate credit will be offered by Frostburg State College in the spring semester of 1976, both on-campus and off campus in Hagerstown, Frederick and Garrett County, it was announced today by Dr. Paul Lyons of the College's graduate office.

Frostburg State College offers two graduate degree programs: a Master of Education (M.Ed.) program in administration & supervision, art, biology, elementary education, geography, guidance and counseling, history, mathematics, physical education, reading and social science; and a Master of Science in Management (M.S.M.) program, which is offered through the Center for Management Development.

## Offered

The complete curriculum for the Masters program in Management is offered at Frostburg, Hagerstown and Frederick. The entire Masters of Education program is offered in Frostburg with the elementary education concentration offered in Frederick, as well.

Registration, which is currently being conducted will continue through December 23, 1975, for the education program and through January 9, 1976, for the management program. Registration may be completed by mail or in person.

## Quilt Exhibition

The Frostburg State College art department, the Allegany County Bicentennial Committee and Allegany Community College will co-sponsor a regional quilt exhibition to be held in March 1976 as part of Western Maryland's bicentennial celebration, exhibition coordinator Dustin Davis announced today.

The exhibit will be on display for the first two weeks of March at the Allegany Community College Gallery and for the next two weeks at the Frostburg State College Fine Arts Gallery. When the display is open to the public, an attendant will be on duty to insure that all safety measures are complied with and that every

possible precaution is employed to protect the displayed item.

Mr. Davis, an instructor of art and art education at Frostburg State College, is currently in the process of gathering information concerning regional quilts or blanket chests which could be loaned for the exhibit. "I'm a Shakespearian Lover" reads the button, and it's only talking about one thing.

"Shakespeare's Lovers," the newest production from New York's Laurel Productions, will be at Frostburg State College in the Lane College Center on Tuesday January 13th at 6:30 p.m. Tickets are priced at \$5.00 each for Frostburg State students and \$6.25 each for non-students. Ticket price includes a buffet dinner with Baked Virginia Ham, Chicken Cacciatore, Roast Beef Au Jus, Au Gratin Potatoes, buttered peas, fruit cup supreme, and assorted salads and desserts.

Variouly styled a "Shakespearian vaudeville" or a "smorgasbord of love," the producers describe the show as "a tasty treat from some of the most delicious love

scenes from the works of William Shakespeare performed by a professional cast from New York City." This will be the show's only scheduled performance locally as it continues its national tour which began in August 1974. "Shakespeare's Lovers" has already been seen by thousands of people throughout a thirty-six state area.

Laurel Productions is a cooperative venture of professional actors who believe that "the theatre should be taken out of the hands of the businessman and given back to the actors and the audience." In 1973, an earlier program, "The Tiger and The Typists," was selected by the National Entertainment Conference for their "Live Theatre on Campus" project.

"Shakespeare's Lovers" is a theatrical offering of selections from the plays and poetry of William Shakespeare. It is fully staged and acted especially for American audiences today while not neglecting the wonderful Elizabethan flavor of "the greatest playwright in the English language."

To be sure no one will be left out of the fun, each scene will be introduced with a brief explanatory note relevant to its complete understanding by each member of the audience, whether or not they have previously read the play.

Some of the selections that may be performed include the balcony scene from "Romeo and Juliet," the Katherine-Henry scene in "Henry V," the final rejection of Hamlet by Ophelia and the hilarious Katherine and Petruchio courting scene in "The Taming of the Shrew." The show runs about an hour without intermissions.

Featured in the cast are

two outstanding professional actors: James McMahon and Donna Di Rienzo. Mr. Mc Mahon has performed with the American Shakespeare Festival in Stratford, Conn., and with Joseph Papp's New York Shakespeare Festival in such plays as "Macbeth," "As You Like It," "Troilus and Cressida," and "Twelfth Night." He has appeared off-Broadway in "Public Insult" by Peter Handke and "Love Suicide at Schofield Barracks," both directed by Herbert Berghof, and in the alt-star revival of "The Madwoman of Chaillot" with Blanch Yurka, Peggy Wood and Jacqueline Susann.

Miss Di Rienzo appeared in "The Winter's Tale" directed by Albert Takzauckas and received rave notices for her performances in "Psychatron" and "Haunting of Hill House." In summer stock she has played leading roles in such plays as "Showboat," "West Side Story" and "Any Wednesday."

Albert John Takzauckas, director of "Shakespeare's Lovers," received rave reviews from New York Times critic Howard Thompson and others for his revival of Victor Hugo's forgotten masterpiece, "Hernani." The Washington Post's Richard L. Coe called his production of Robert Frost's "A Mask of Reason" "impressive," and the Star-News found it "original...amusing...and challenging." On the New York stage his directing assignments include "Troilus and Cressida," "The Winter's Tale," "A Midsummer Night's Dream," as well as "Don Giovanni" and "Hansel and Gretel."

# Teacher's Rights

The following column was written for the Iowa State Daily by Bill Kunerth, associate professor of journalism and mass communications at Iowa State University and appeared in the University of Maryland student newspaper. It was submitted for publication by Wayne R. Frohring, assistant professor in the Psychology Department.

Every instructor shall have the right to:

1. Choose those students who will be allowed to enroll in his courses.
2. Drop any student within the first three weeks without the student's permission.
3. Have three unexcused absences from lectures each semester.
4. Take occasional naps during class discussions.
5. Munch on candy bars and drink Cokes during lectures.
6. Absent himself from lectures for important duties such as plugging parking meters.
7. Arrive late for lectures if he has a legitimate excuse such as "oversleeping."
8. Teach only those courses that motivate him and are relevant.
9. Drop courses at mid-semester if student motivation and interest levels are not satisfactory.
10. Write evaluations on each student and publish them at the end of the semester.
11. Read the newspaper and write letters during class discussions.
12. Begin lectures the seventh week of the course and complete the entire semester's work in the last

three weeks.

13. Show up once every three weeks and take issue with all points raised regarding material covered in the classes he missed.

14. Call students at any time of the night to discuss their performance on assignments.

15. Withhold course requirements from the students until the last week of the semester.

16. Ask students if there was "anything important" in the assignments the instructor failed to read or grade.

17. Burst into tears during instructor-student conferences when all other tactics fail.

18. Lecture on the American political situation no matter what the course title is.

19. Be forgiven for poor lectures if he can provide a legitimate excuse such as a "sick relative" or a "night on the town."

20. Leave class one week before the end of the semester because he has a ride to Ft. Lauderdale.


