

No Bathroom In Cumberland

When the nineteen residents of Cumberland Hall basement moved in last fall, they were assured that a bathroom would be constructed in the basement for their use. However, due to the refusal of the Department of General Services (DGS) to approve the construction project, no progress has been made to date.

The residents of Cumberland basement have named the designated space for the bathroom "The Pit." At the last S.G.A. meeting, the women voiced their frustrations in attempting to find out when the bathroom would be completed. In response, Jim Lund, Director of Residence Life sent a memo offering them the option of moving to one of the many vacancies available on campus. These rooms were constructed in the summer to meet the housing demands that the College experienced in academic year 1979. The College had intended to have the bathroom

completed during fall semester, but DGS refused to allow the construction to go out on bid. So far, the Maintenance department does not have the manpower to complete the job. The plumbing services usually performed by Maintenance include unclogging drains, and fixing leaks. In addition to manpower shortages, the College doesn't have the necessary hardware and materials to complete the bathroom.

The women of Cumberland basement were given single rooms this year in an effort to compensate for the inconvenience of no bathroom facilities on their floor.

Elsewhere on campus, there are 43 other campus residents who do not have bathroom facilities on their floor. No similar offer of a single room has been made to them.

Residence Life has informed the Cumberland residents of the improbability of the bathroom being completed this semester.

High Rise Renovation

As a preliminary step in a major renovation project, the locks on the outside doors of Frederick Hall have been installed. Still to come is the replacement of doors and construction of vestibules on Frederick, Westminster and Cambridge Halls.

On December 3, Bill McKenzie, director of the Physical Plant, sent an emergency requisition to order the hardware for Frederick Hall. McKenzie spoke to the supplier several times and was informed that the manufacturing company of panic bars was waiting up to ten weeks for stainless steel. When it appeared that the College would have to wait, McKenzie requested that they use a combination of metals, including copper, to construct the panic bars. The bars arrived on Friday, February 1, and were installed, along with the locks, by the following Friday.

The College already had the hardware for the locks, but according to state law could not install them until the panic bar hardware had arrived.

Residence Life, along with Maintenance, is currently gathering specifications for the major replacement and renovation

of the doors in Frederick, Westminster and Cambridge and the end doors of Frederick and Westminster. Vestibules will also be constructed to cut down on heat loss from the stairwells and protect the doors from weather damage. Each of the renovated entrances will have two sets of doors with only the inside set locking.

These new doors will have an air compressor closure system which will facilitate easier opening and maintain an automatic locking system during late evening hours. The closures will be hooked up to compressors already existing in the dorms.

The patio doors of Westminster and Frederick are currently not in line for replacement. Residence Life has investigated numerous methods for insuring that these doors lock properly. The College will order one set of a positive action closure for evaluating if this new method will automatically lock the doors after they have been opened.

During the day the doors will still remain unlocked; the new closures will make sure the doors will close completely.

According to James Lund, Cambridge Hall is the only dorm whose front doors are continually broken. The construction on Cambridge will be the most involved of the three dorms because the wall and roof vestibules must be constructed three and a half feet out from the existing structure. Because of the complex nature of this project, an outside contractor was involved in preparing the specifications.

The renovation of the doors will cost approximately \$80,000. The funds are currently available in the Housing Budget. However, before bids from contractors can be accepted, the project must be approved by the State Board of Public Works. The Board meets only once a month and is chaired by the Governor. However, the Board can also reject the entire proposal, as they did with the bathroom in the basement of Cumberland Hall. The contract proposal is expected to be turned in to Annapolis by the end of this month. If approved, the College will begin bidding procedures. Lund hopes to see the project completed by Fall 1980.

Register Women: Yes

Women being registered for the draft? Even in today's society with extensive studies in equalizing the position of men and women, this possibility sent a sobering shock through the country.

If we backtrack a few centuries to the dusty past of hoop skirts and soft laughter, it might come as a surprize to find historical figures leading the charge of the calvary, stuffing shot into cannons, and also being female. Joan of Arc liberated the City of Orleans by excellent military strategy and personal bravery, and Molly Pitcher transports us to the American Revolution when she joined her husband out on the battlefield. Bringing us closer to the present, in both World Wars, women were quite literally used in intelligence operations. They employed extreme cunning, and the other major assets universally attributed to the fairer sex. As femme fatalis they cooed, purred and silkily coaxed vital information from the enemy in his most vulnerable moments, with steely determination glinting under their inviting facade.

Through out the world women have been involved in war efforts. In the U.S.S.R. women made up almost exclusively the supply troops that often encountered combat situation. Women were a good portion of the

French Underground, and in 1940 during the Battle of Britain women using radar technology directed the RAF fighter planes to intercept and destroy German bombers. Almost any situation of guerrilla warfare has involved women in the fray, with Vietnam being a recent illustration. Lastly, in our country during World War III, 350,000 women served in the Armed Forces. The aim of this history is to dissolve the misconception that women and war have shared the properties of oil and vinegar - never mixing.

This is not to be interpreted as a hawkish exaltation of the virtues of war; it has none by my evaluation. The initial loss of life and the long range physical and mental residues are proof of its basic nature of destruction. The controversy over Agent Orange, centering on possible health hazards associated with this chemical used to defoliate Vietnamese jungles is a current example.


To provoke a war by our standards is morally wrong, but to defend one's country from aggression is an unpleasant but necessary recourse for which to prepare. The question remains, if there is definately to be a draft registration, is sex a valid and fair determination of who serves the country and who doesn't?

In coming to a conclusion I first took a look at the present

nature of warfare. Has technology changed its concept from hand-to-hand trench warfare to button-to-button tactical maneuvering? How does the notion of sheer physical strength come into play here? I went with my questions to Dr. Harry Stegmaier, Professor of History, who, with his background in military history, could link the war of the past to the inferences of war in the future. He felt that war had advanced to such a technical level that any differences in body strength between the sexes really didn't play a significant role. Also, generalizing on men's strength on the whole, as opposed to women's strength, it is not very conclusive because of the variation between individuals. Some women are stronger than some men, just as some are also

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Register Women: No

Should women have to register for the draft? Should women be drafted? Should women, if drafted, be placed in combat? These three questions have been looming over President Carter, Congress, and the American Society, and an answer must be arrived at soon.

First, one may consider, should registration be revitalized for men as well as for women? For even though our politicians state that registration will not necessarily lead to drafting, I feel that we should regard this statement for what it is - flimsy.

In the late 60's and early 70's, college students were protesting their right to decide for themselves if they would go to war. They did not want to fight. Their voices were heard and registration and the draft were both abolished. Now, after a decade of politicians playing the "Peace Game," we find that our dreams of peace might be shattered. Most important, as college students, we have to realize that what our counterparts accomplished in the early 70's is on the verge of being destroyed - and all the talk of our fine volunteer army is just that, talk. Moreover, the line that I can't swallow is that the government's use of the registration will be to collect data on the numbers that the United

States has for stand-by defenses. I feel that if we are to register, we will be close to being drafted.

Now, that my opening argument has been "sex-blind" - which so many feminists are calling for in this issue - and I have, in so many words, denounced registration and the draft overall, let me state my views' concerning only women.

I do not believe that at this point in time the United State's government can require women to register. If some women would like to register on their own will, fine, otherwise, mandatory registration is at this time premature. Maybe the majority of the United States - not the ERA lobbyists, or a minority of feminists, or our elite group of politicians - will be ready to accept the idea of women registering and being drafted in the future, but right now, accept it or not - ERA or not, the majority is not ready to progress so rapidly with the ideas that women are totally equal to men.

Realistically in most incidences, fathers, mothers, family, and friends still do not make distinctions between one of the female sex being a lady or a "woman." To fathers and mothers we are their daughters and not their sons. To our family, such as brothers and sisters, we are feminine unlike our brothers. We may be considered intelli-

gent, bright, and equal to others, male species included, mind wise, but we are still not considered superior or equal when it comes to masculinity or "stoicism." This may be unfair, but times are changing, and someday we will be thought of as equals to males. However, society is not ready for this change to be thrown in their faces by the registration and drafting of women. In fact, society more than likely will take a dimmer view of female radicals shouting for equal rights. (And of course, our feminists can't stop fighting now - even if they really don't support what they are fighting for when it comes to registration - for then they are open for a round of name calling with hypocrite at the top of the list.)

But being fair to the feminists, they do express the sentiments of the past drafts as being "unfair and unjust to the poor and the blacks," but if there has to be a draft, the feminists want "women to register and not to be excluded from combat." How nice! Did these feminists ever think that this draft will be just as unfair to poor women and black women? Do you think that Carter would send Amy to war? Or will daughters of the upper-class families or upper-middle-class families be

bigger or heavier. Determination of strength, if and when relevant, is made on an individual basis. He said the areas of logistics, supplies, intelligence and electronics could easily facilitate women, added to the traditional roles they have served as nurses and clerical personnel. If the decision was made to register women for the draft, but not in direct combat situations as planned by President Carter, there are plenty of coordinating and supporting roles within the Armed Forces that could use their talents.

When one thinks of the military, immediately, the image of the gun toting, fatigued clad, GI-Joe floods the mind. Is this the average soldier, if such a

being exists? Doing a little research in the Occupational and Research Handbook, I found that positions in the military "are almost as wide as that found in civilian life" and it was very hard indeed to conceive of an average soldier. The administrative specialists and clerk's category contains specialization in personnel, accounting, finance and disbursing, supply and logistics, religion, morale and welfare, information and education, and communication center operations.

Service and supply handlers subdivision entails jobs in food service, motor transport, material receipt, storage and issue, military police, auxiliary labor, and forward area equipment support. Communications and Intelligence Operations include radio and radio code, sonar,

radar, and traffic control, signal intelligence, electronic warfare, military intelligence and combat operations control. A myriad of other positions exist in the categories of Electrical and Dental specialists, and other technical and allied specialists. The only category that seemed predominantly combat oriented was infantry gun crews and seaman ship specialists. So, if there are positions in and out of combat that women can adapt to in theory, has any application been made?

A Sun paper article responds in commenting that the outcry against registering women for the draft is obscuring the role of enlisted women today in almost every job in the military to the tune of 150,000 strong, with the Defense Department target of an additional 100,000 by mid-dec-

ade. This takes women out of theory and into reality but not into war. Hopefully, the strategy of upgrading and prepping our Armed Forces will deter any nation from provoking a confrontation. The report cards for these women are graded high by the various branches of the service. In a Baltimore Eye-witness interview at the Naval Academy, all the midshipmen were positive about the women they were training with; who will comprise the first female graduates from that institution. They said, "They do everything we do."

The question remains of rights and responsibilities and what is fair and equitable in this situation. An inherent contradiction would be for women to hold equal rights but not be required to share in equal responsibilities. If a man and a

woman doctor receive equal opportunity to join the medical profession, is it "natural" that only the male doctor should use his skill in serving his country? If you and your brother both fall under registration age is it fair for him to be the only one to have to be entered on the selective service computer? We have seen that for women to be involved in the war effort is nothing novel, and that the technical nature of war and the wide range of positions within the military facilitates persons of both sexes. Coupled with the 150,000 women who are achieving this, as well as volunteers, this information should de-mystify the issue of registering women for the draft, and clearly seeing through the camouflaging excuses to the essential rights and responsibilities for both sexes.

fighting beside poverty-stricken women? I doubt it!

One feminist declares, "that I am American, and I am as proud and responsible as American men to assure American security and property." Okay. But maybe her argument about being American would have been more convincing if she did not have to include in the argument a hint of fight for equality. Another feminist did not mince words and boldly said what she meant, "I think registration would result in the passage of the ERA." However, where does this leave the majority of women and men who could give a damn about the ERA. These women fighting for the ERA are willing to push through Congress the bill to register and draft women, at the cost of others, for the pas-

sage of the ERA, and the majority will not receive any benefits if the ERA is passed. Therefore, the social costs outweigh the social benefits. Finally, the question of combat arises. I can't justify men living, if only for a brief moment, to kill; therefore, I find it more than difficult to put women in identical situations. One thing that stands out in my mind, that I fear would become a cognitive dissonance for women, is that they have been brought up to realize that they are the sex which gives birth, gives life. They are mentally conditioned by maternal instincts to nourish, to promote life not death. Can we turn our women into killers? As far as the ERA lobbyists or other Feminists backing registration, drafting, and combat are concerned, I guess they would say, "A woman can kill as well as any man!"




The Black Revolution

Blacks, throughout America, have been prominent in the making of its history. It began years ago with the harsh introduction of slavery. Later, inventions by Black men were prevalent all over the country. Time continued to pass with the Black man making several attempts to prove his equivalency to any White man. Time passed the diligent Benjamin Banneker and his many contributions; Time passed the astute Garret Morgan and his traffic light; Time passed the great Paul Robeson and his contributions to the field of Drama. Time kept moving. It passed the great artist such as Langston Hughes and Paul Lawrence-Dunbar; It passed the prestigious Dr. Martin Luther King and Rev. Jesse Jackson with their attempts for peace and equality. Perhaps time could pass by all of these people and their contributions, but one thing it can't overlook is that without the aids and the contributions of the Black people, America would not be as prestigious and as prosperous as it is today.

As we look back in history and, perhaps, reminisce through our history books, we see that slavery, contributing as much as it did, was the beginning of what

was going to be a strong and powerful people in America. They not only helped to make a history for America, but they made a history for themselves.

Many years ago with the contributions of Black men, the Negro slowly defined the self-image of himself in America. The dynamic role of the Negro in the life of our nation is at last being recognized. He has proven his equivalency, but now he has gone on to be a potent new force at a time of great controversy and creativity. This year, the month of February, as many years before, has been designated for the recognition of the Black accomplishments in America. February is nationally Black History Month, and this month, we, the Black Americans, hope that everyone takes a little time to see how far we've come. We hope that they see how we came out of slavery characterized with non-human qualities and with no education, or, yet, any gained equivalency to any other man or woman. We hope that they see that from that time to the present, we've progressed to be what was once said to be never possible. We are doctors, lawyers, and educators. We are engineers, poets, and actors. WE ARE MEN!

Food Service Survey



Report To The Students

Many of you, like myself, seem to be questioning the adequacy and the competence of the vast number of people who run Frostburg State College. For those of you who want answers to your questions, read on.

"My hands are tied", "It has to go through bid procedures", "I wish I could help" are the classic responses to the many questions that I, along with several members of my executive staff, have raised since October. In the past five months, requests for proper security and facilities in the dorms, proper maintenance of the campus and requests for a ceiling in the dining hall that doesn't leak and at the same time a food service that will serve something nutritious have been denied.

Are our requests so far-fetched? Approximately 800 students reside in the coeds. They are being denied proper security DAILY. There is not one administrator that doesn't lock his or her front door every night - yet we cannot lock ours. Why? Because of the bureaucratic red tape that exists down state in Annapolis.

The older dorms on the hill continue to fall apart. Diehl Hall, traditionally the most abused dorm on the hill, had the lowest damage total for 1st semester this year. The guys up there are trying hard to keep their home together and patiently wait for promised renovations. They'd better hurry- the scotch tape is running out. Diehl also has several broken doors . . . but I guess if they wait long enough the doors will fall off and they can be replaced with new ones. Perhaps this time they'll remember the locks . . .

For those of you who are not aware of the low-bid system that operates in Maryland, the Lane Center and the Dining Hall are, unfortunately, products of it. The lowest bidder gets the contract. Well, now that the ceilings in both buildings are falling, one has to ask "Why"?

In the Lane Center Multi-Use Room, tiles and lights continue to fall. The company that manufactures the ceiling tiles has since gone out of business, hence, the tiles are no longer available. So what happens when a ceiling no longer exists in the Lane Center?

I think that what all of you who eat on campus can best relate to is the sad situation in Chesapeake. I was told that "the students are never happy with the food service, they always want to get rid of it". Is a request as simple as something nutritious, rather than starchy, so complicated? I think not. By the way . . . the ceiling is not going to be replaced until the summer (perhaps) PERHAPS when one of us gets hit on the head with a ceiling tile, they'll manage to speed the process up a bit.

These are just some of the problems that we have been addressing. They do not by any means represent the full range of our concerns.

For those of us who have dealt with this frustration for the past five months, we look to the future and wonder if we will be told the "same old story" then. The administration tells me they sympathize with my position, and that of the students. If they did, they'd be doing something to change the sad state of affairs on this campus. Until that time, I will continue to ask questions on our behalf . . . perhaps one day Annapolis will choose to listen.

I do not challenge the good intent of the administration. But good intentions alone don't get the job done.
