Through this group, FSU's top senior leaders will steward relevant causes through their proven capabilities in the classroom and community. PLC students will work with President Jonathan Gibralter and other FSU stakeholders for mentorship opportunities. In addition, PLC members will participate in the Sloop Institute for Excellence in Leadership in the spring and in an international experience.

Qualifications for PLC include 75 or more credit hours completed, a cumulative GPA of at least 3.0 and proven demonstration of leadership on campus.

This plan was distributed along with the FSU Strategic Plan at the President's Fall Convocation.
