ACADEMIC REGALIA

The traditional caps and gowns worn by students and faculty in the academic procession have been the historic costume of scholars since medieval times. Because many scholars of that period were members of monastic orders, the academic costume resembles ecclesiastical dress.

A uniform code for academic costumes was drafted by an intercollegiate commission in 1893 and has since been adopted by the majority of colleges and universities in the United States. Each of the three academic degrees—bachelor's, master's and doctor's—has its own distinctive gown and hood. The gown representing the bachelor's degree is distinguished by its long, pointed sleeve. The master's gown has a longer, narrow closed sleeve, extending below the knee; the arm is passed through a slit at the elbow. In contrast, the doctor's gown has a full, bell-shaped sleeve with three bars of velvet. The opening of this gown (and the backs of the head) is faced with wide velvet bands, which may be black or of a color indicating the general field of learning of the wearer—for example, dark blue for philosophy, green for medicine, purple for law, and light blue for education.

The most colorful and distinctive item of the academic costume is the hood, which passes around the neck and extends down the back. The colors of the silk lining exposed in the center of the hood are those of the college or university which conferred the degree.

GRADUATION WITH HONORS

Students graduating with Honors will have completed at least 60 semester hours at Salisbury State University, 30 or more hours of which must be in 300-400 level courses with grades of A, B or C. To graduate with Honors the student must have a minimum cumulative grade point average as follows:

SUMMA CUM LAUDE - 3.8

MAGNA CUM LAUDE - 3.6

CUM LAUDE - 3.3

Students graduating with General Honors have completed at least 30 hours of course work in the Honors Program, including completion of a Senior Honors Thesis. A minimum grade point average of 3.2 in Honors courses is also required.

Today's recognition of Honors is tentative pending certification of all graduation requirements.
