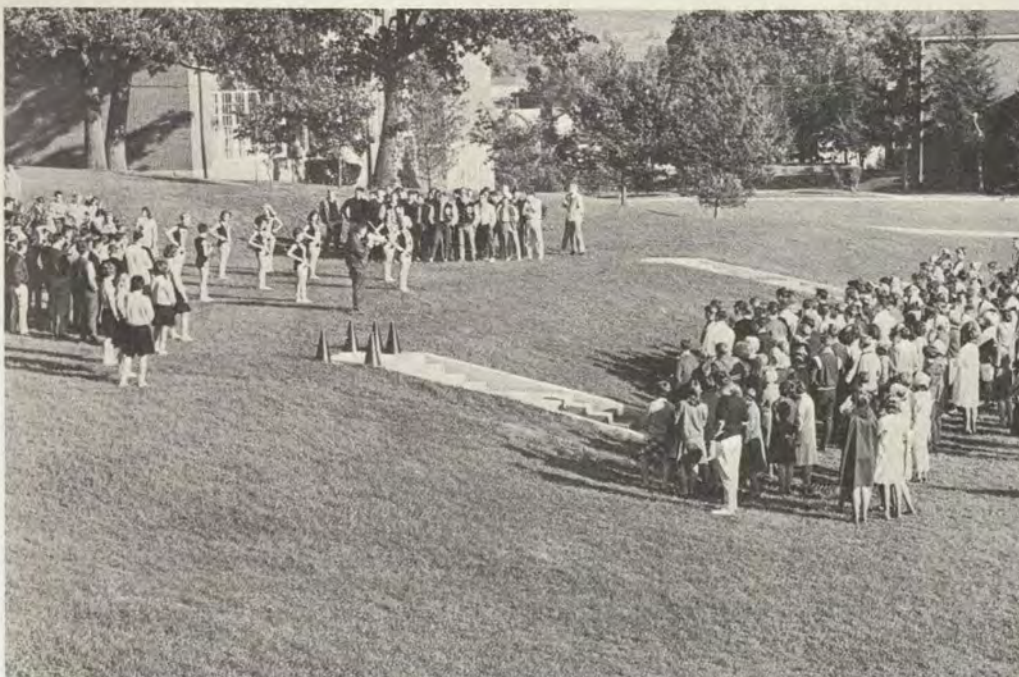

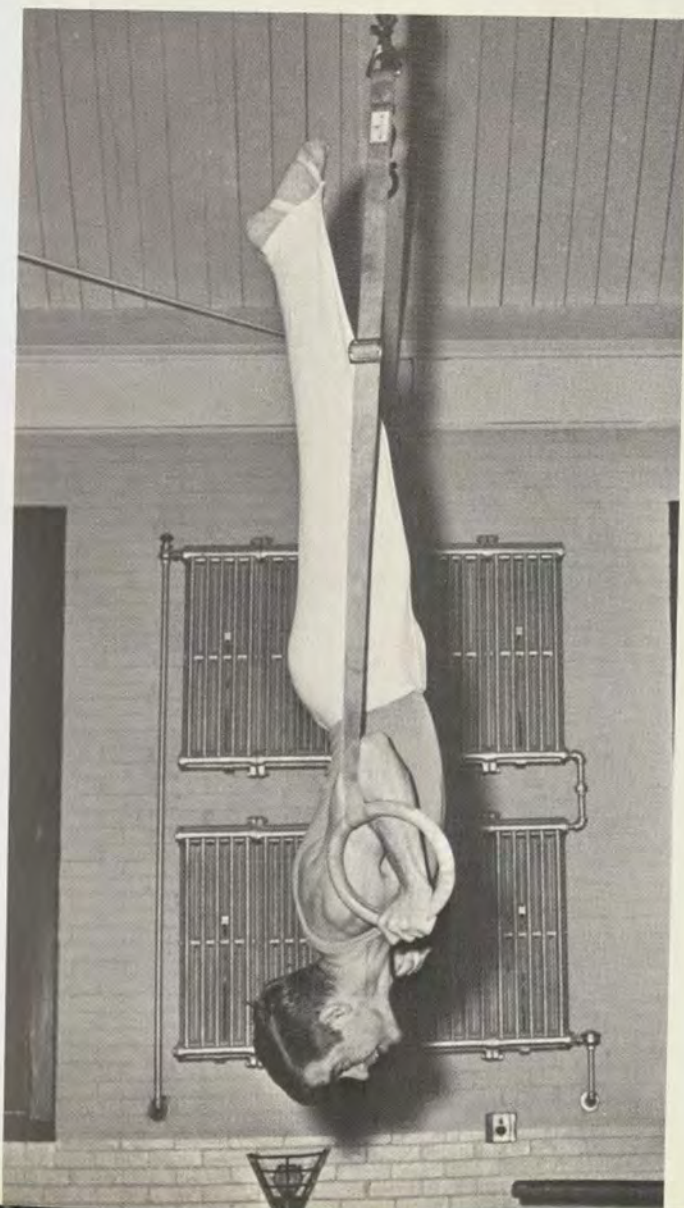

To Sue Meredith, our capable and attractive president, and all of the house officers goes a vote of thanks for a year of faithful service.

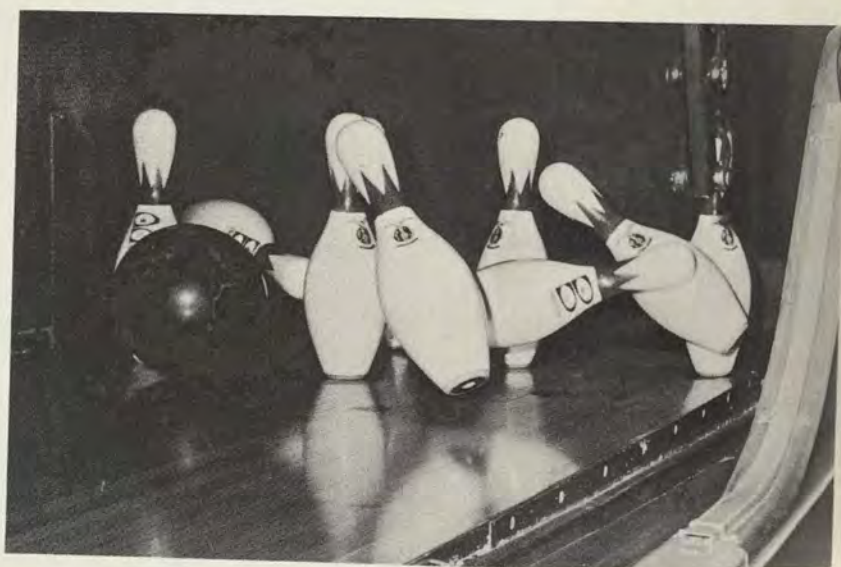
