#### Frostburg State University 139th Commencement Slated For Dec. 20

FSU will celebrate and recognize the achievements of its December 2011 graduating class during the University's 139th commencement ceremonies Tuesday, Dec. 20, in the Cordts PE Center's Main Arena. President Jonathan Gibralter will confer degrees on graduates from the colleges of Business, Education and Liberal Arts and Sciences during the single 11 a.m. ceremony.

Daniel Goff, College of Education; Jacob Hoover, College of Liberal Arts and Sciences; and Robert Ketterman, College of Business, are the featured student speakers for the winter commencement exercises.

Goff will graduate with a major in recreation and parks management. Before coming to FSU, he graduated from Anne Arundel Community College in June 2009 with an associate degree in general studies. He has been vice president of the Recreation Society and was active in organizing the Major's Fair presentations. Goff is a member in his major's national honors program, Rho Phi Lambda, and, as an Eagle Scout, he received a Maryland Governor's Citation and Maryland General Assembly Citation. In a

competitive application process, he recently earned and completed an internship at the Coast Guard Station at Kodiak, Alaska, and is also certified as a Level III search and rescue technician. Goff holds a 3.6 overall GPA.

Hoover will graduate as a history major with a certificate in international studies. From the time he graduated from high school in 1996, until the present, he explored many careers and fields of study. He started his higher education career in 1997 before deciding to get married and start a family. Hoover eventually enrolled in FSU as a non-traditional student. He has been on FSU's Dean's List since fall 2009 and now graduates with a 3.8 overall grade point average. He discovered a passion for Latin

American history at FSU and is a member of Phi Alpha Theta and the History Club. His strengths include original historical research and excellent communication skills, both written and oral; and despite the many obligations associated with raising his family, he has served as a tutor for struggling freshmen in History 100.

Ketterman will graduate as an accounting major. He graduated from high school in 1988 and attended FSU that fall semester, but other interests intervened. Ketterman was working part-time for Kinney Shoe Corp. and had completed two phases of the management training program. When they offered him a full-time assistant manager position in Frederick, Md., he took advantage of the opportunity and moved the following week. Before deciding to come back to school, he had also worked as a contract manager and traffic coordinator for LM Services LCC in Cumberland for 10 years. Ketterman boasts a 3.9 overall GPA.

BEN Scholars are leaders in biological sciences teaching and learning, with a passion for improving undergraduate education. They conduct outreach activities for biological sciences faculty on their campuses, throughout their region and nationally through professional societies.

At FSU, Brosi teaches Introduction to Ethnobotany, Dendrology and Plant Taxonomy. Over the years Brosi has

worked for several organizations that strive to improve the environment, including the Tree Improvement Program, the Department of Forestry and the Nature Conservancy. Some of her research interests include ethnobotany in Appalachian and other cultures and economic and environmental sustainability of nontimber forest products.

#### **Zumpanos Support FSU Baseball Tradition in Memory of Aaron**

Baseball has been central to the lives of generations of the Zumpano family, including father Gene and son Steve, who both played for FSU's Bobcat baseball team. Sadly, the life of the Zumpano who may have been the best player of them all, Steve's younger brother Aaron, was cut short. He died in 1988 in his freshman year of college as the result of a car accident.

Today Aaron's memory is what is inspiring his family to support FSU's baseball team through the Aaron P. Zumpano Memorial Baseball Fund, which supplies funds annually to enhance the players' athletic experiences and meet the team's immediate needs.

This is the second year the fund has supplied funds for the baseball program. In the 2010 academic year, the money helped purchase an outfield fence cap for Bob Wells Field, which has improved player safety and enhanced the look of the field. This year's payment will be directed toward improvements in the locker room.

FSU Athletics, as part of the NCAA's Division III, cannot make use of student tuition or state funds, nor are athletic scholarships available to DIII athletes. That leaves teams to rely on only students' fees and private giving to meet their needs.

His brother hadn't declared a major yet, but Steve suspects that his desire to help others would have led him to a career in education – assuming he didn't make it into professional baseball.

The most reliable, up-to-date information regarding delayed openings and cancellations will be available at the MAIN UNIVERSITY NUMBER (301-687-4000, option 2). after 6 a.m. Notification of delays or closures will also be made through these outlets:

- Via Burg Alert text and email alerts (Registration information is below.)

- Via <a href="www.schoolsout.com">www.schoolsout.com</a> (Emails and text alerts are available.)

Everyone should sign up for Burg Alerts, which can be sent as text messages to your cell phones (standard texting rates apply) and as free emails. In addition to notifications of weather closings, Burg Alerts will be used to alert the campus in any kind of emergency. To sign up, go to <a href="https://www.frostburg.edu/computing/fsualert">www.frostburg.edu/computing/fsualert</a> or visit the Technology page from the FSU front page. Look for "Text Alert System sign up" under "Ouick Links."

Follow the instructions, using your FSU user name and password to access the site. (Choose "Public Safety Alerts" for notification of emergencies and "School Closing" for notification of closings or delays.) Don't forget to select the box that says, "It is ok for regroup to send text messages to my phone. Standard rates apply" if you want to receive text messages.

If you were previously signed up for e2Campus, your registration transferred to Regroup.

Unless FSU closure is announced on the outlets above, WE ARE OPEN. Likewise, the message under option 2 at the main University number will announce the closure or announce, "There are no delays or closures at this time."

FOR FACULTY/STAFF: Personnel compensation for closures or delays will be based on the appropriate cancellation/delay message as presented on the FSU voice-mail system. A reminder: Essential personnel are required to report to work in the event of any cancellation or delay. These individuals have been notified of their "essential" status by their department heads. If you are unsure of your status, check with your supervisor.

If, in your judgment, it is not safe for you to come to work while the University is still open, you must contact your supervisor and provide this information. If liberal leave is announced for employees, it is expected that everyone will make an effort to report to work and class. Employees will be charged for the appropriate leave time. The announcement of liberal leave DOES NOT relieve essential employees of their need to report to work during inclement weather.

FOR STUDENTS: The announcement of liberal leave for employees DOES NOT cancel classes. If you have concerns about your ability to make it to class, discuss them with your faculty members BEFORE the weather turns nasty.

When classes are cancelled for bad weather, Ort Library, the Cordts PE Center and the Lane University Center (not including food service) will be open for students who live on campus or within walking distance on a modified schedule and with limited staffing. Open hours on those days will be 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. Monday through Friday, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Saturdays and 1 to 8 p.m. on Sundays, except in the cases of extraordinarily severe weather. Do not attempt to drive to campus if the weather is severe enough to warrant closing the University, for your own safety and for the sake of those who must work to clear parking lots and sidewalks.

FOR ALL: The final decision with regard to your personal safety resides with you. Stay warm and be safe.
