BIOGRPHIES

Alice Wigfield Soprano, Conductor and Vocal coach

Mrs. Wigfield's love of music began as a master violist earning her a full scholarship to Eastern Kentucky University and graduated with a Bachelor of Music Education. She was a featured vocal soloist with the University's Chamber Choir, performing in nine countries in Europe and a Good Will Tour in Israel. In 1985, she received a Master of Education from Salisbury University. She has over 39 years teaching music in both public and private schools, retiring in 2014 the same year Mrs. Wigfield was recognized by the Maryland General Assembly for conducting the top choral school music program in the State. She also represented Maryland at the National Advanced Choral Conducting, Conference with Henry Leck (Indianapolis Children's Choir) at Butler University.

Mrs. Wigfield's school choirs have received awards for their level of musicianship and performed in prestigious places such as St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York City. Mrs. Wigfield has been the music director of the Magi Choral Festival since its inception 25 years ago. Mrs. Wigfield continues to teach voice and mentor hundreds of students, many who have gone on to professional careers in music. She is currently on staff at Allen Memorial Baptist Church in Salisbury as the traditional worship leader and director of choirs. Mrs. Wigfield recently has become the Artistic Director for the Salisbury University Children's Choir beginning February 9, 2019.

Ginger Rizzi

Ginger Rogers Rizzi is in demand locally as an accompanist. As a graduate of West Virginia Wesleyan College, with a degree in music education and mastery level in piano performance, and Salisbury College, with a Master of Education, she was an elementary music teacher in Wicomico County for 35 years. She has received numerous awards as an outstanding educator. Along with accompanying choir festivals and musicals, she accompanied the Magi Choir for 15 years. Currently, in addition to accompanying the SU Children's Choir, you will find Mrs. Rizzi on the piano bench at Allen Memorial Baptist Church in Salisbury where she serves as accompanist for the traditional worship service.
