
Maryland Archeology Month Lecture

Dr. Elizabeth Ragan(right), SU history faculty, presents "Rogue & Dogg & Scotch Irish Men's God: A 'Scotch peddler' in the 17th century Chesapeake" 1 p.m. Saturday, April 22, at the Nabb Research Center. The presentation examines the archaeological and historical evidence for David Brown, a Glaswegian who emigrated to Somerset County, MD, by 1670. He rapidly gained wealth and high office, but unlike most men of his status, he rarely traded on credit. Was this because he was smuggling Scottish goods? Mystery Logo: Claggett Society of Salisbury

While gathering images to accompany articles for last month's *Shoreline* we located a recent donation of a mid-1800s Claggett Society logo. Of interest were the words "Salisbury Maryland" flanking an image of a bishop's miter. We know that in 1792 Rev. Thomas John Claggett was made Bishop of Maryland at Trinity Church, New York City, and that he was the first Episcopal Bishop consecrated in America, but what puzzles us still is the connection between the Claggett name, Salisbury and a Philadelphia artist.
