

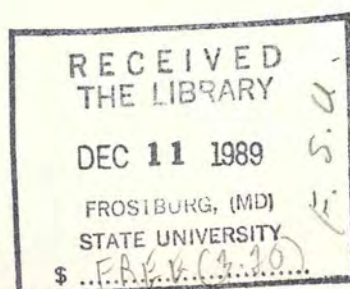

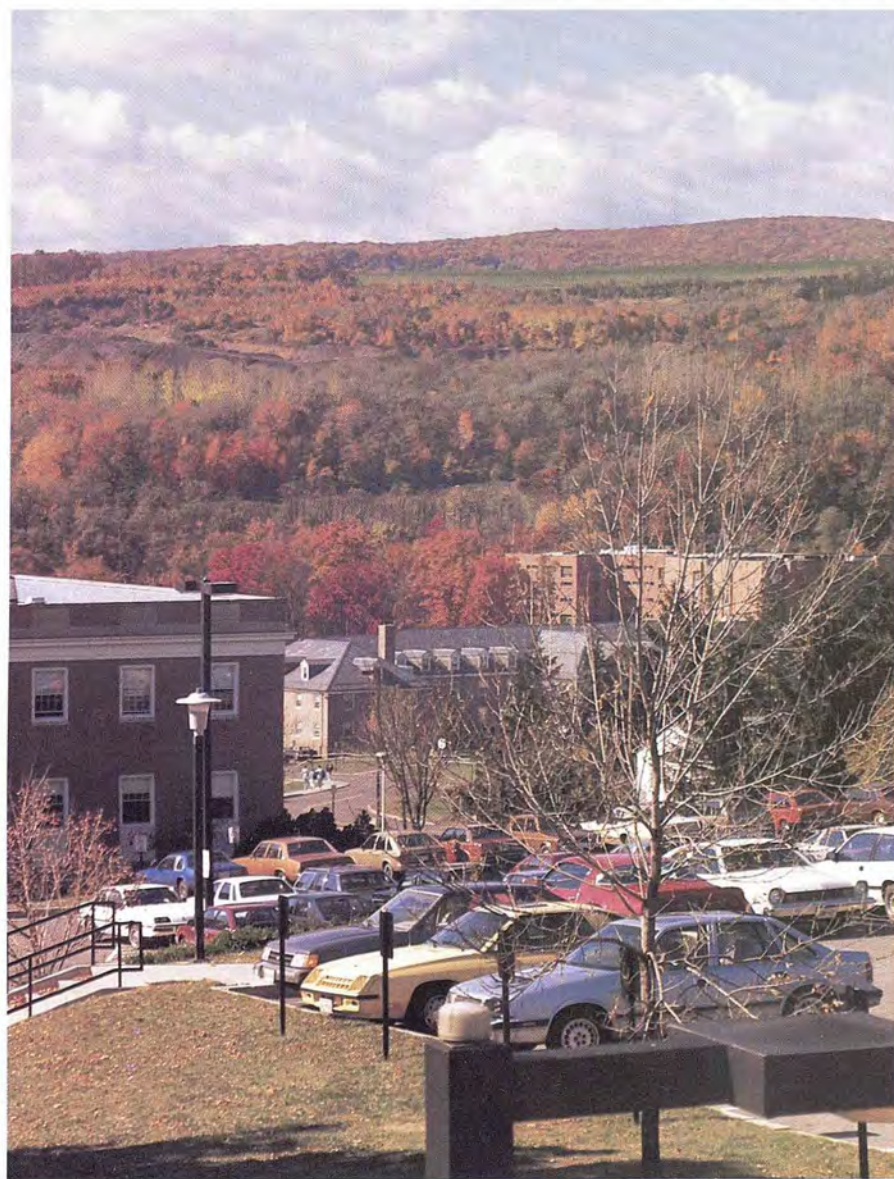

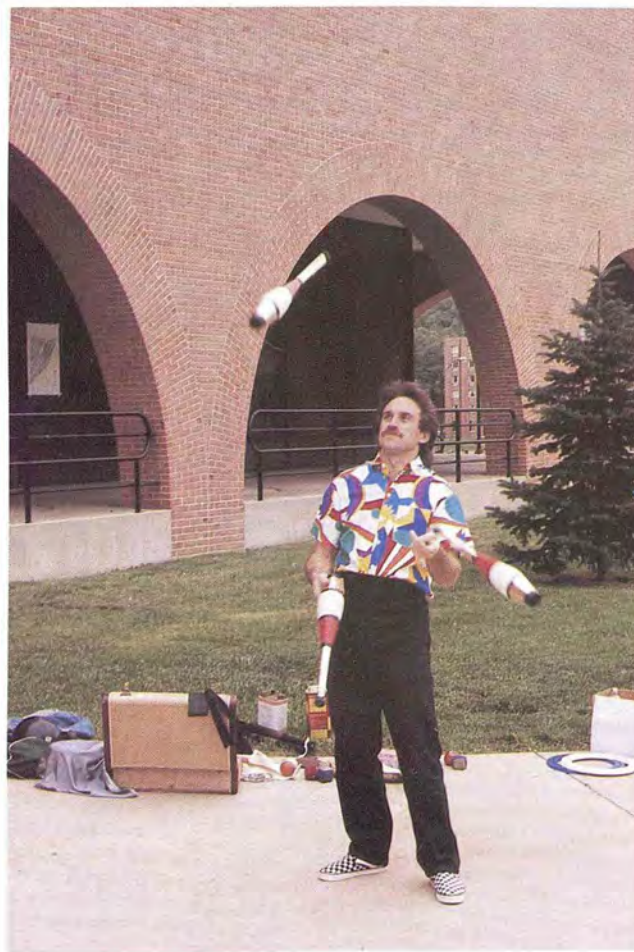
book assumed the Indian name.

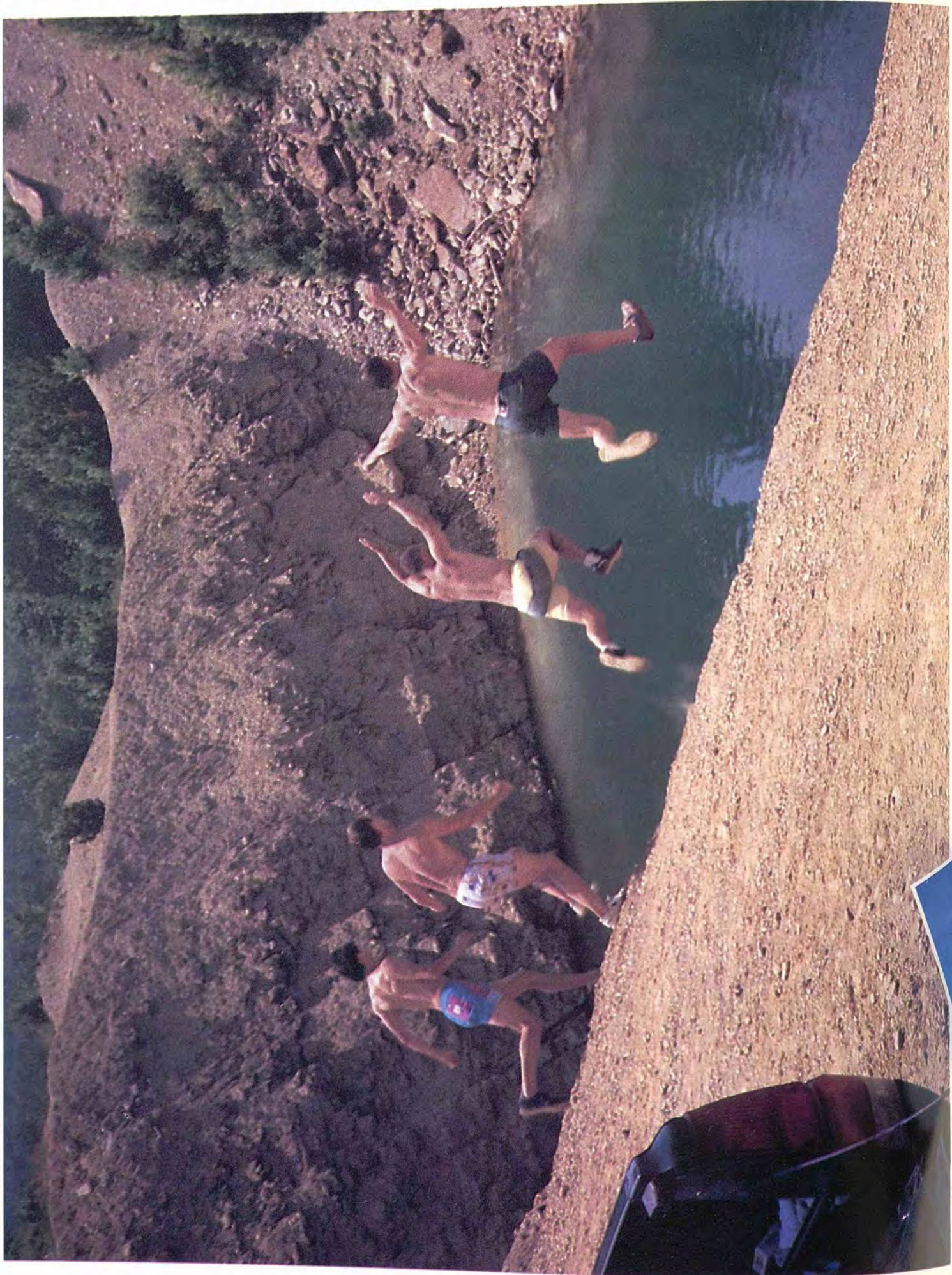

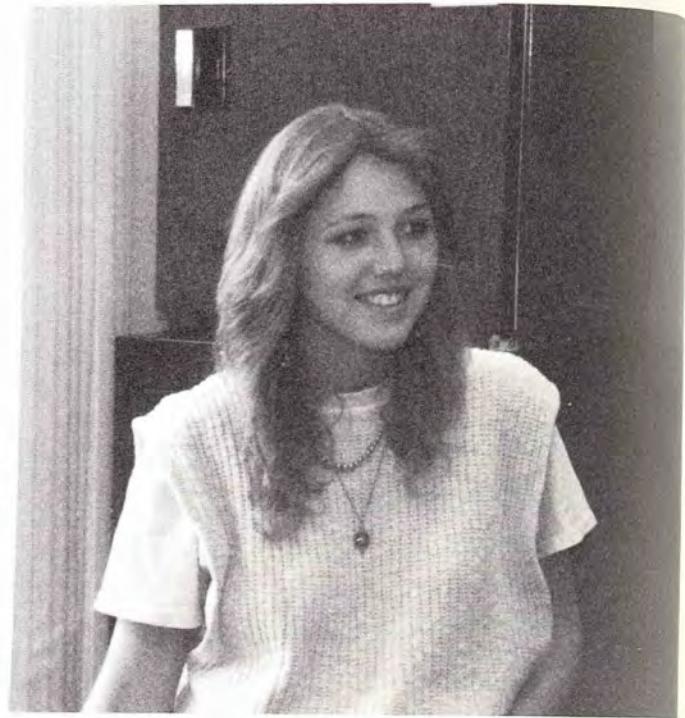

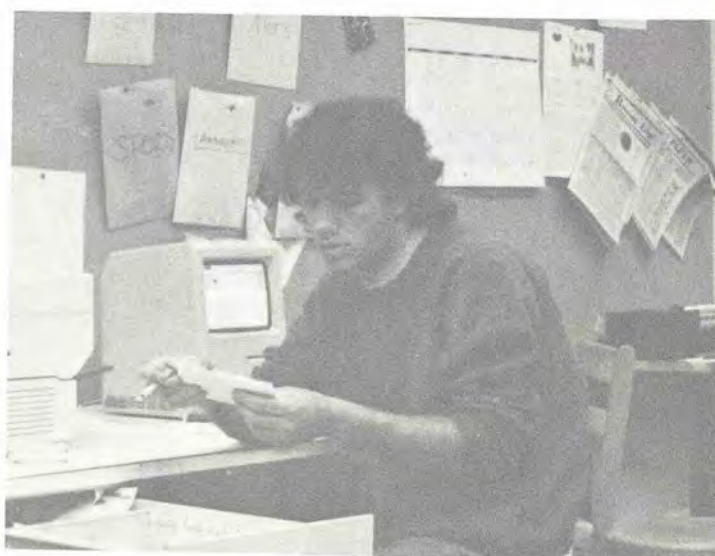


The Bottom Line

Coach Bennett feels that even though she is losing six seniors, the team should still be strong next season.

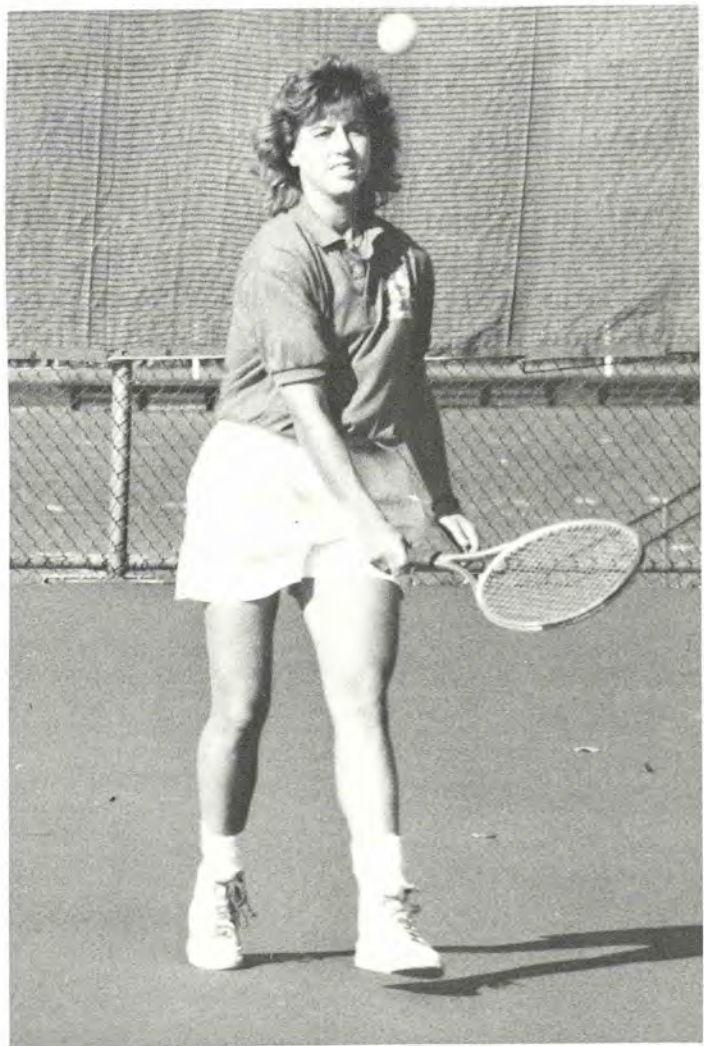
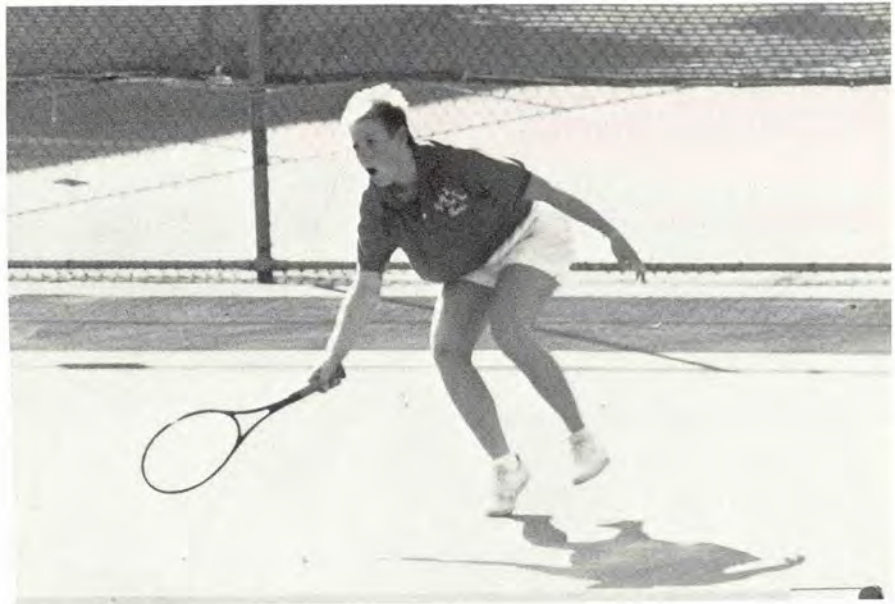

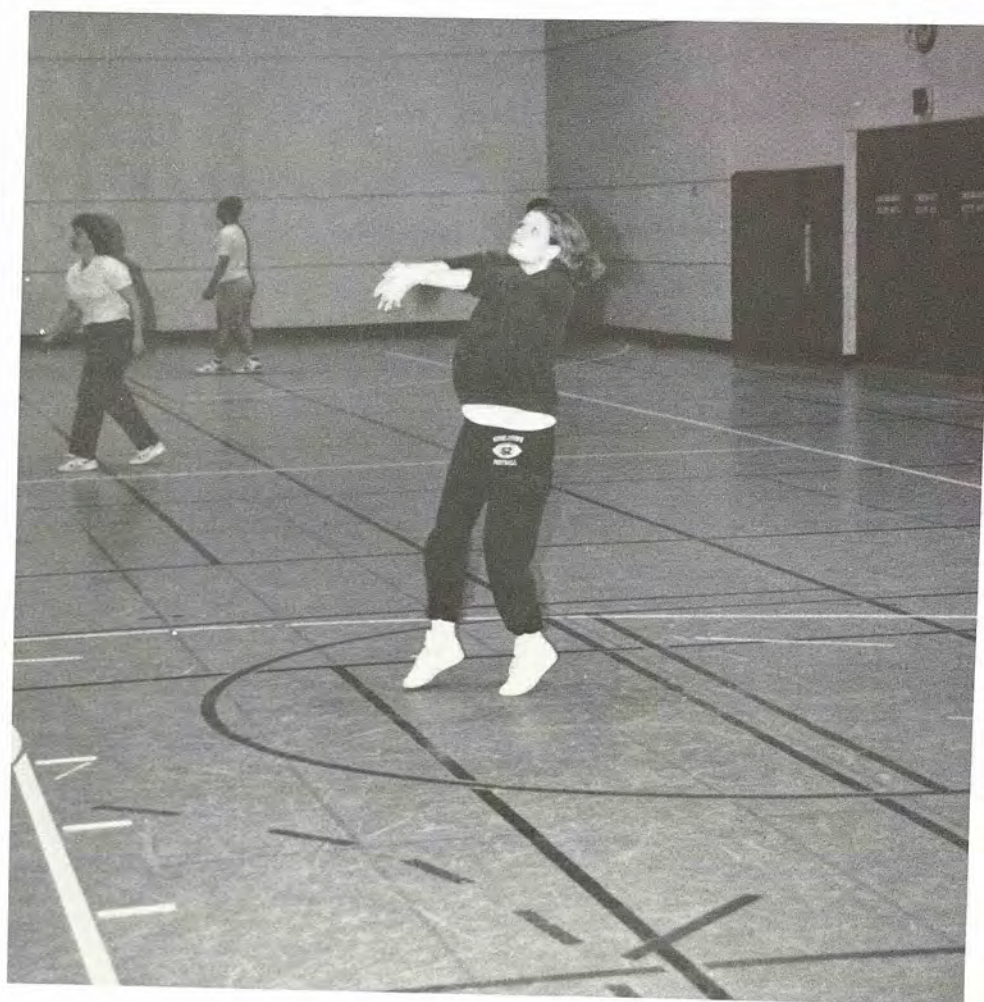
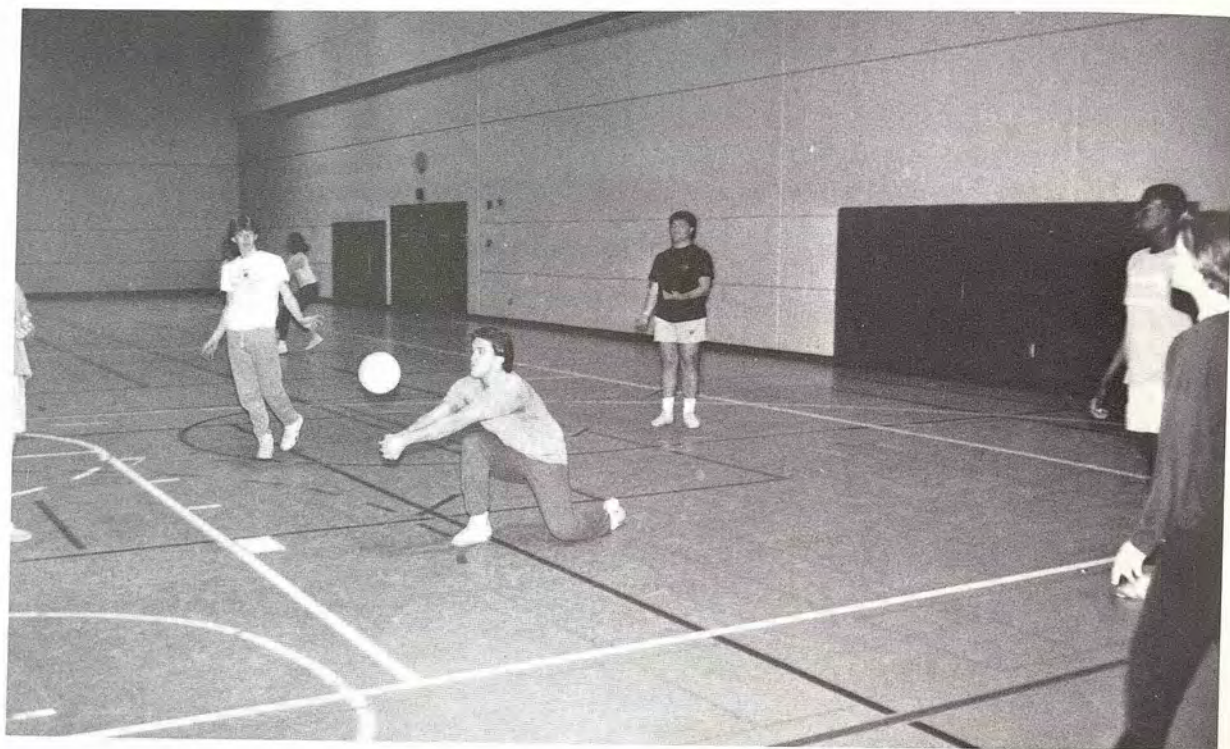
In mid-March, the Frostburg State University's Men's Rugby team started practice in the lower gym of the Physical Education Center. The team had a mixture of new and old players.

Rugby is a sport where each team, which consists of fifteen players, tries to score by crossing the goal line. The game is both a combination of soccer and football.

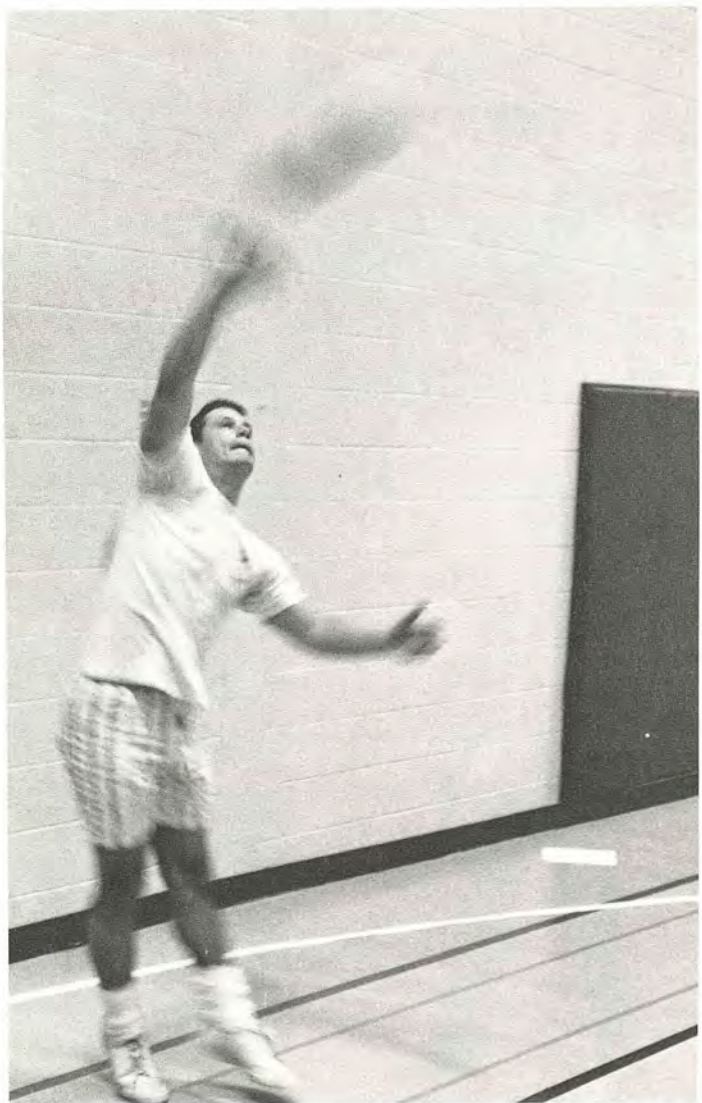
