Connecting SNPs with State Medicaid Programs

Coordination could improve care and outcomes.

- Coordinate (Medicare) hospital discharge planning with (Medicaid) community-based supports and services to avoid unnecessary languishing in nursing facilities
- Monitor quality of care in nursing facilities to prevent falls, pressure ulcers and other causes of avoidable hospitalizations
- Coordinate Medicare home health, physician and Rx services with Medicaid attendant care, transportation and HCBS waiver services for a well-designed communitybased plan of care



Despite growth in SNPs, only about 10 percent of dual eligibles are in a dual eligible SNP . . .

... but the largest state Medicaiddesigned programs for dual eligibles are even smaller.






One form of connection between SNPs and states is a voluntary managed care system in Medicaid . . .
