



BIOGRAPHIES

Conductor Lee Knier directs the Salisbury "Pops" Concert Band at Salisbury University where he also teaches courses in music education and applied brass lessons. A graduate of both Temple and Arcadia universities, he earned degrees in music education and performance with concentration in trombone and conducting. He also has served as interim conductor of the Salisbury Symphony Orchestra, assistant conductor of the New Jersey Youth Orchestra and assistant director of bands at Temple University. Knier has performed regularly as a trombonist with the Mid-Atlantic Symphony Orchestra, St. Peter-by-the-Sea Orchestra, the Metro Lyric Opera Orchestra, Garden State Philharmonic, Brookdale Big Band, Tex Benecke and the Modernairs, and the Steel Pier Show Band. He has toured with the Nelson Riddle Orchestra and the Glenn Miller Orchestra directed by Buddy DeFranco. Knier lives in Salisbury with his wife Veronica, a pianist, and their son Chris.

Glenn Luedtke began his musical career as a percussionist. While studying at the Peabody Conservatory, he joined the Baltimore Symphony Orchestra where he performed until becoming a member of the United States Army Band ("Pershing's Own") in Washington, D.C. While in the Army Band, he performed with the Concert and Ceremonial bands, Herald Trumpets, Orchestra and Chamber singers, retiring as a Sergeant Major following more than 20 years of service. A nationally registered paramedic, Luedtke is director of Sussex County EMS. He is a frequent lecturer at regional, national and international EMS conferences and symposia, and he serves as an adjunct assistant professor of emergency medicine at the George Washington University School of Medicine and Health Sciences in Washington, D.C. He joined the Salisbury University Concert Band in 2001 and also performs regularly with the Salisbury Community Band, the Milford Community Band (principal trumpet and assistant conductor) and a local brass quintet, A Touch of Brass. Luedtke and his wife life in Rehoboth Beach, DE. They have two daughters and a granddaughter.



Caitlyn Howard, soprano, is currently a senior at Salisbury University seeking a Bachelor of Arts in music education and vocal performance. She began music lessons in elementary school and performed throughout middle and high school in several musicals at Salisbury Christian School. Having begun classical voice training in high school with Peabody graduate Virginia Russell, Howard has been a soloist with the Salisbury University Chorale and Chamber Choir, Salisbury Jazz Brazz Big Band, the Harlem Festival Orchestra (Handel's Messiah) and featured on concerts with the American Spiritual Ensemble. Howard has played the title role in Rodgers and Hammerstein's Cinderella and the role of Mabel in the Wye Operetta Workshop's production of Pirates of Penzance at the historic Avalon Theater, the latter a role she revived and was highly praised for in SU's Opera Workshop production last spring. Howard is also a successful competitor, having garnered top prizes and scholarships from the National Association of Teachers of Singing (NATS), Salisbury University and the Salisbury Wicomico Arts Council, respectively. Howard is currently studying voice and voice pedagogy with Professor John Wesley Wright.

Jackie Darrow, saxophonist, is completing her senior year at Salisbury University as a biology major. She has been a member of SU's Salisbury "Pops" for seven semesters.

Matthew DeTora, trumpeter, is a sophomore at Salisbury University where he is pursuing dual majors in business management and marketing along with a minor in mathematics. DeTora is involved in the American Marketing Association and is a member of the Phi Eta Sigma Honor Society. He is also an active member of SU's Pep Band.


