# University Theatre Offers "The Glass Menagerie"

University Theatre will present Tennessee Williams' "The Glass Menagerie" on Nov. 19 and 20 and Dec. 2, 3 and 4 at 8 p.m. in



the Performing Arts Center Studio Theatre. A Sunday matinee will be Nov. 21 at 2 p.m.

Williams' work, often described as being "translucently autobiographical," tells the story of the Wingfield family through the "memory" of son and narrator, Tom. Meet Amanda, the mother, a daughter of the Old South who is out of step and out of time in the tumultuous world of the 1930s, along with her daughter, Laura, a frail misfit whose fragile existence is defined by her cherished collection of delicate glass animals.

Originally produced in 1944, this play has charmed both theater professionals and audiences for nearly 55 years. It continues to be one of the most frequently produced plays at all levels of the theater.

### Composition Course to Feature Eastern Thought

During the spring 2000 semester, students will have a new way to take the required English Advanced Composition 310. Dr. Paul La Chance's new English 309 will both satisfy all the standard English 310 requirements, and it will provide simultaneously an introduction to Buddhism, Taoism and Zen. Reading some selected texts, like Lao Tse's Tao Te Chin and Zen in the Art of Archery, students will be introduced to major Asian traditions by focusing all their research in Eastern thought. This experience in International Education will enhance students' breadth of cultural exposure by tracing Asia's development of Ancient Indian Buddhism into today's Zen. In fact, the abundance of cultural influences and historical developments of Buddhism from India to China to Japan will provide abundant research opportunities.

Tom Serfass, Assistant Professor of Wildlife Ecology, Department of Biology, received a supplemental grant from the Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation of \$38,774 for the third year of his project to monitor the fates of elk translocated in northcentral Pennsylvania. He also received \$24,000 from the Pennsylvania Wild Resource Conservation Fund to initiate a river otter reintroduction project in southwestern Pennsylvania during 2000.
