The Secretary adds that there is positive and direct evidence, in possession of the Treasury Department, that projects have been formed, for defrauding the revenue upon a large scale, along the Canadian frontier, and that some of them are, probably by this time, in a train of execution; but that it is hoped and believed that they will be frustrated by the constant vigilance of the Customs House officers, aided by a competent force.
