## HAGUE, May 7 .

HE following is the purport of the anfwer which the deputies of the flate made to the Britifh minifter's reprefentations, upon the republic's fending a third ambaffador to the Court of France,

That the court of Great-Britain had no reafon to exclaim in fuch manner as it did againft the refolution which the States General were about to take of procuring fufpenfions of arms, feeing this was never attempted to be done 'til they were dreve to the laft extremity, and after having in vain tried all the means which were believed to be effelual, in order to refilt the arms of France. That their high mightineffes had taken upon them to fend M. Gilles to tue to the French court, in hopes that thereby fome oxpedient might be found out that would preferve the republic from ruin, with which it is threatened, in order to prevent the calamities of war from making a nearer approach thereto. That the States Geseral hoped, by this method of proceeding, they fhould not onIy be abla to fave the fron:ier of the republic, but thould like wife fand fair to bring the court of France into a jult and reatonable ececommodation with the allies of the ftate, That this nas the great point they propofed to themfelves; that therefore the courts of Vienas and London hould not imagine that they bshany thing elfe in view; that the States General had fo ofen already given the reafons which conftrained them to act in this fort, that it would be fuperfluous to repeat them. That they could not conceive any hopes of being able, with the affifunce of all the forces which their allies propoled to bring into the feld, of vanquilhing France, of retaking the phaces the had got poffefion of in the Low Countries, or ewen of preferving thofe which yet remained to the allies: That therefore thoir bigh mightinefles had nothing to do but to aum at the fecurity of the republic: That what meafures foever the States General fiould take to accomplifh that end, they would endeavour to puke it fublerxient to the general welfare of Europe: That if they appearedin any degree complaifant to the demands of his mof Chrifian majelty, it was onfy in hopes that this moparch wodld in rectarn flew a readinef to accelerate the repole of Europe. That the world was fenfible, it, was not 'ril things were arived to the laflextremity, that the States General de. termined to have recourfe to the court of France for an expedims, and that all impartial people will do juflice to the fentiments which the sepublic has never failed of thewing, in arder n promate the interef of the common canfe, ES,"

And as in all the conterences which toth high mightinefles had with that miniifter, they carefully avoidpd that word Neutrality, they looked upon one another for forme time without fpeaking ; after which oue of them frid, We cahnot exaetly tell you what we propofe to do by fending M. Gilles to the court of France; perhaps his bafinefs may be conipreheaded in the term Neutraliry, the event will 'm time difedver it.
