His great Conflancy and Firm neff in a tedious and painful h1ners and Reffgnation to the divine Wing, were fuitable to a Lifc exercifed in eve sg Inu able Purfuite His long Refigence among us made him thoroughly acquainted wilh our Conitiindoced him inviriably to exert all the Iafluence his Station, as Governot: gaye him; and every Means Which his own-Good Senfe could fuggeft, co proWhich his Powolic Good, He was a Pattern of Sobriety and Regularity; a finceie Lover of Trath and Juftice: and a mot religions Obferver of his Word. His Example, introduced and effablified a Habit of Sobriery and Civility among us. Tbat he was a Man of fine Parts and Underlanding, and that his Adminifitration was juft, mild, and e. quizable, his Enemies (if fuch a Man could have a. ny) dare not deny. In private Life he was an amiable Companion; in his Converfation, afrable chearfal, and inftruative, but never affuming; and in his Friend $\mathrm{h} p$, warm and fincere. He was one of the beft of Hoibands, Fathers, Neighbours, and Mafters.. In $a$ Word, bis Death is univerfally and juflly lamented, as one of the greatell Misfortunes which coold have happened to us ; and his Memory fhatt always be rever'd by every true Friend of Makriand.

To fee her na tural Ally deprived of itts greateft Ornament in a Stadtholder $s$ to fee the whole United Provinces weeping for the Death of Orance; and to fiñd all those Schemes, concerted by that excelient Prince for the Promotion of the general Happinefs of Europe; froftiated by fuch an Accident; muf make, Britain fenfibly participate the Woes of her naval Sifter: Wyle the Remembrarice of an obe dient San in.Law, endeavouring to put into Exe cution fuch Meafures as fiould be cunducive to the Intereft of Ahat Family, from whence his illof trious Congen was defcended ; to find this widowed Daugherer liable to be enveloped by that Cloud of Aritocracy, which her Confort was attenapting to difpel; and to fee the young Heir of Nassau and the Honour of the greate Repablic in the Univerfe, expofed together to the common Dan ger of French Corruption, and Dutch Venality muft create the greatett Concern, Caie, and Anx icty, in the Breaf of the Friend, the Father, and the Grandfather, fo conficicuous in his Britannic Majefty. As the dear Wife, the tender Parent and the gracions Queen, Denmark and it's Soveseign muf be fhrouded in the Veil of Sorrow: As the dutiful Daughter, the Friend of England, and the amiable Lady, Britain and it's Monarch offer to her Mermory the kind Tear of Affection, and the chafte Sigh of Honefly
If we look upon this Lofs in a philofaphical Light, every Man, who has the Wellare of Society at Heart, muft be fenfibly afflicted with it : But if we confider is in a political Senfe, every Eng ifib man is more intimately concerned in fuch a Mir fortune, than the Native of any other Earopean Country not immediately fubfervient on his Dani/b Majefly. Ftb. 13. We hear from Dover, that laft Sunday one Rof, belonging toCol, Stpart's Company and one Harbin, of Whitmores, both of the Third Regiment of Guards, were brought before Edmund Barham, Efq ; Agent for the Pacquets at Dover, for deferting from their Regiment, with an Intent to embark for Calais for the French' Service. They were decoyed from London by one Darby, who is taken into Cuftody on fufpicion of being an Agent for the French

Fib. 22. On Thurday a Man meanly dreffid threw himfelf into the Canal in St. James's Park. Fib. 24. We have an Account that the Sute perb, a Spanihh Regifter Ship; from La Vera Cruz for Cadiz, was loft the it Inftart, at Conele neat Cadiz, and 50 of the Crew perifhed.
It is currently repoted that the Liemtehant of a Britifh Man of War at Lifbon, was lately feized by Oider of his Portugueze Mijefty, and afterwards tranforted to Brazil, for carrying the current Coin of that Kingdom clandellinely on board of the Ship to which he belonged. This froug gling Piattice has been long connived at by tie Portagueze Miniftry, and was generally carried on by the Monks and Friars, whom, as Ecclefisftics, no body is allowed to fearch.
We tiear the Advantaget arifing by the Impor of Gum Seneca into this Kingdom, has induced the Dealers in Silks, Linens, \&c, to apply for an Ad of Parliament, that it hall be imported in Britifh Ships only.

Feb. 25. We have an Account that the Neptune, a new Man of War of 64 Guns, built at Genoa, coming from thence was loft. The above Ship was computed to be worth zoo,000 I.

Yefterday an Officer of the Army was found dead in the Field between Marybon Bafon and the Sign of the Angel. Upon infpecting the Body a Wound made by a-Sword was difeovered under the right Breaf, out of which a little Fat had fpurted, with fome Blood, but there was a copiona bleeding at the Mouth. The Corpfe was quite warmer about one o'Clock in the Afternoon. Two Boys, who were hat play in the Fields, heard a Gentleman fiy to the Oficer, "Againft my Will you force me to fight you." Who this Gentleman was is not jet knowng as he took Care to
make his Efcape, though it is rumoured, but on what Foundation we know not, that he is a noble Lord. By the Papers foond in the Officer's Pock et, he appeared to be Captain Gray of the fift Regiment of Guarde.
Between Six and Seven laft Saturday Evening, a foul Chimney toots fire in Newgate, which occa fioned great Mirth among the Prfoners, who ridi culed the Firemen, and flattered themfelves they were in a fair way to be fet at Liberty; but hap. pily they wete very foon deceived. A Cafe of chis kind happened abodt two Years fince, when the Fire broke out at a Houfe adjacent to the Youltry Compter, which proved a Means of Deliverance io many of the Prifoners
Feb. 26. The Cargo loft in the Superbe, from Vera Ciuz, for Cadiz, confifts as follows, viz. neal, Jlap, Jefuirs Barik and Indigo, 3300 Ui Jes, 1500 Kentals of Copper, 6000 Logwood, 23 Bra hilletta, 320 Chelts of Sugar, 123 Serons of To . bacco, and 30 Serons of Cocua. Fify of the Crew out of 230 were prelerved, and Yart of the above Cargo wilt be faved.

By our laft Advices from Chignecto, the Commander of his Majefty's Forces, Capt. Collier, of
Lafcelles's Regimethe, rdied there the Beginning of Lafcelles's Regimetht, -died thete the Beginning of this Month.
We have alfo an Account from thence of the Death of Monficur La Jorquier, late IuterdantGeneral of New trance, in an advanced Age; at Quebec. He was reputed an experienced Sea Officer, and was an Admiral commanding tue French Fleet, taken by Lord Anfun, and Sir Peter Warren, in 1747 , and semained lome Time a Prifoner in England. The Winter paf has proved the fevereft, and the Froft the molt intente that hath ever been known to the oldcit Inhabitants in the Provuce. affuring the Public, that this Harbour hath not been troze up, or encumbered io much with Ice, as to intersupt it's Navigation.

March 10. By a Letter from Capt. Macarty, late Mafter of the Brig Lion, of this Port, dated in Liverpool December 10. 1751, we are inform ed, that on the 27 th of October laft, four Days after he left this Harbour (bound for Baibadoes) in a Calm, the Veffel fprung a Leak, and in 38 Hours was full of Wa:er; that he then cut away her Mafts to prevent her overfetung, and continued on board for 21 Days, when he and his People were taken ou by the Speedwell, John Thornton Mafter, from Virginia, and carried to Liverpool. By Capt. Turnee in 3 Days from Hallifax, we have the melancholy News, that Capt. Sherburne, of this Towa, who in a large Senooner, richly laden, faild for Hallifax a few Weeks ajo, was calt away on the firff Inftant, on an Ihand near Cape Sambrough, and the Veffel and Cargo loft. The People all efcaped with their Lives, except a Negro Man, who was drowned; but the Mafter having received much Hurt, died foon after he got on Shore. The rell of the People having continued on the Ifland five or fix Days, wert taken off by a filhing Boat, and carried to Hallifax.

Laft Tuefday Evening was interred the Remains of his Excellency Samuel Ogle, Efq; in the Church in this City; his Coffin was covered with black Velvet, and the Pall fupported by five Gen demen of the Council, and the prufiding Judge of the Provincial Court.
Thurfday Morining laft we had a Thunder Guft here, and another in the Evening, accompanied with a very bigh Wind. In the Morning it was very violent in Prince Gcorge's County, about 17 Miles from hence, where one Gobn Ray, Ganding at the Door of his Houfe, was kill'd by the Light ning in an Inflant, and the Hair of his Body, on the left side, finged from his Head down to his Foot. Aboat half a Minute afier, a Walnut Tree, rear the Houle, was Split in Pieces thefeby ; as was alfo, about a Minute after that, a large Sycamore, about 100 Yards diftant; and ro or 12 other Trees were likewife llruck by it, within a Quarten of a Mile of the Houfe.
We hear of confiderable Damage being done the lame Day by the Violence of the Wind, in different Parts of the Province: Near Kent Iflind, a Veffel belotging to Mr. William Addams was over fet, and the People on board narrowly efcaped drowning. In Prince George', County, a Gentleman had feven Buildings blown down, and much other Damage done.
Laft Saturday was interred here the Body of Mr. Jobn Mackubin, aged 88 Years; be was borth in this County, and, as he died merely of old Age, was a remarkable Inftance of the Healthfulnefs of the Place.
On F iday laft a remarkable Caule was tried before the Honourable Judges of the Provincial Court, wherein Miry $W — n$ was Plaintiff, and $70 f a p b$ 1-d Deferdant: The Attion was brought for Breach of a Promife of Marriage; and after a long Trial, and the Examination of many Witnefles, the Jury found for the Plaintiff, and Fifty Pounds Damages. A Caufe of the fame Napure was tried at laft Prince Giorge's County Court, when the Ju ry found for the Plainifif, and Damages. A frw eight pofrbly cure fome pretty Fellows of tbeir Gal lantry, and intimidate tbem (as nothing alfo quill) from deluding and ruining poor innocent and credulous

On Monday laft Mr. Juftice Dent, after a very pathetic Speech and Admonition to the Criminals
condemn'd this Court, proceeded to prom condemn'd this Court, proceeded to pronounce Sentence of Death on George Wilfon, Jomes Pow cll, Thomas Hornbrook, and William Grindy. Wil fon, for the Murder of William Smith, Bazaleel Fofer, and Negro Cuffee, is to be hung in Chains near the Place where he and his Accomplice committed the Murder ; Powell, for Burglary, and Hernbrook, for Horfe flealing. are to be executed here on Friday the ifth Inftant. Grindy, for Horfe ftealing, has obtained his Honour the Prefident's Pardon; but is to tran/port himfelf out of the Province in ${ }^{2} 5$ Days.
The fame Day Capt. James Hall, in the Alex. ander, from London (which Place he left the 14th of Marcb), arrived in Soufb River.
Capt. Judd, belonging to Mr. Black, for Soust River, and Capt. Perry, belonging to Mr. Grove, for Patuxent, came out with Capt. Hall, and are hourly expected.

Capt. Jobns, belonging to Torver and Pbilpot was to fail in three Days after Capt. Hall; and Capt. A/kew, belonging to Mr. Perkins, in about - Fortnight.

Tueffay laft Gobn Brougbton, the Pickpocket, was well barmt in the Hand with the Letter R, and rentenced to al Servitude for his Charges.

It is furprizing that that State, which maniffelty perceives that this rebellious If ind will never cordially fabmit to its Dominion, to which the Inhabitants have an inveterate and hereditary Averfion, has not, by Sale or Exchange, parted with it, as it has had the fairef Opportanty of doing fo. Some fpeculative People, who reafon upon this Subjeet, think, that notwithftanding the feeming Endeavours of the Marquis de Curfay, and M. Chauvelin, to induce theio tarbalent People to behave with the Submiffion and Obedience which the owe to they Republic, there is a fecret Undeftanding between France and fome of the Genoefe Senators ; arid that this is the prime Source of the Difforbances which are continually arifing in that Illand, and which, 'tis evident, are fearce poffible to be remedied any otherwife than by changing its Mafter. The Reafons which thefe thinking People give for advancing Notions that may appear to trange to thofe tipecially who have great Confidence in the Sincerlty of his Moft Chriftian Mojefly, ate, that France has apparently the Poffefilion of this lland very much at Heart, and, in all Probability, to make a Marriage Portion for Madam Henrietta, or one of the other Daughters; and that fhe excites thefe continual Troubles in Corfica, with a Defign that the Genoefe fhouid be in fuch Manner difgufted with and weary of them, that having but little Grounds to hope for main taining their Authority there, they fhoald be induced to expofe the 1 lland to Sale. For a Prepo fition of this Nature, thefe Politicians fay, his Mof Chrittian Majelly is impatiently waiting, in order to make bimfelf abfolute Mafter of $i t$; in the mean Time, fay they, thefe Matters being well confidered, it muft bave been a falfe Alarm which France gave the Senate, when that Crown threatened to recall its Troops from the Illand; the beft Thing the Republic could have then done, would have been to have taken her at her Word: By that Means, it would at once have feen, that the Council of Verfailles really thought of rothing leis than of abandoning a Country, which it fectetely looka upon as a Conqueft which can fearcely efcape is
$P_{0} \mathcal{R}_{\text {, (in Hungary) }}$ Dec, 12 , At all Times the Jews have been hated in this Kingdom, by the Popalace; but gore in this Town than elfewhere, as the Roman Carholit is the only Religion pubFickly exercifed here. Another Reafon, perhaps, of be, the Mifunderitanding which there is between his Serene Electoral Highnefs and his Chapter, an Inflance of which was very recently given, when the Elector expreffed his Defire of celebrating the Birth of the Duke of Burgundy, by a Te Deum to be fung in the Cathedral at Munfter, and by a Difcharge of the Cannon of that City, it was refufed him; but, in order to make a Shew of preferving the Epifcopal Authority, that Ceremony was peiformed in the Chapel of a Extrag of a Letter from $B$

" Laft Sunday arrived here Twenty fix Lower Creeks, Ten Upper Creeks, and Eleven Cherokee Indians. This Vifit was unexpected to fome of them as well as to ourfelves. The two Cretk Nations were at Peace with one another ; but the Lower Creeks at implacable Enmity with the Cherokees. $A_{g}$ foon as thefe : met, they drew in Order of Battle at the old School Houfe, where the Creeks lay before the Arrival of the others, and with much ado were prevented from Bloodibed On this the Cherokees, being much inferior in Number, betook themfelves to the Protection of the Government, and were,fecured in the Guind Houfe. The Governor attempted a Reconciliztion between thems s, and a Kind of Truce was made between them Yefterday: And the Creels promifed that they would not follow the others in two Days. About an Hour before Sun-fet the Cherokees fet out by Way of the Path (the only Rotd which leads op between the two Rivers) and aboon 4 Miles out. of Town were intercepted by the Lower Creeks, who thill'd three on the Spot, the reft they purfued, and it is imagined that five ooly have efcaped, tho' there is not Certainty of more than one. After the Battle the Lower Cretk made off to Afhley Ferry, where they arrived, and crofs'd over near Midnight, but whether with ooce three, or no Prifoners, is not certain, fo variou and uncertain are the. Accounts. Some Soldier are fent aftey them, but there is litule Probability of their coming up with them.
I went to fee the Dead; one old Man had hii Throat cut; but I could find no Woand he hid befider, one was flot through the Body, and his Head was cot off; and the third fhot through this Arm, and through the Body, and all three falped.
