FSU's Theatre and Dance Department Presents Fall Dance Concert

FSU's Department of Theatre and Dance will present its annual fall Dance Concert on **Oct. 28, 29 and 30** at 7:30 p.m. in the Performing Arts Center's Drama Theatre.

reflection during the troubling moments.

Dance Company director *Jamie McGreevy* choreographed another
original piece depicting the battles for
earth among the Goddesses of Wind,
Fire and Water. This modern
contemporary piece explores the
paradigm of micro-movement, inner-

body tensions and finding the antihabitual body.

Elizabeth Collins choreographed a jazz piece for the concert and Keont'a McMiller choreographed a ballet. Rita Peacock's piece includes hip hop, jazz and lyrical movement; the piece by Samantha Flowers and Brieana Jordan will be accompanied by the inspiring words of Maya Angelou. Senior Brieana Jordan and dancers Jay Moultrie and Sylvern Groomes will perform an upbeat hip-hop piece to the music of Missy Elliott.

FSU and the Allegany Conflict Resolution Center will celebrate National Conflict Resolution Day on **Thursday, Oct. 21**, with a presentation at 6 p.m. in the Leake Room at the Cordts PE Center. The event, part of a Leadership Workshop Series at FSU, is free and open to the public.

The presentations will bring the campus and local community together to learn about "The Value of Conflict." Students from *Dr. Elesha L. Ruminski's* CMST 345/Conflict Management class are organizing, promoting and presenting the event with ACRC. The students will provide an interactive overview of what conflict is, why it is valuable to face

rather than avoid it and basic strategies and resources for managing conflict. A proclamation designating "Conflict Resolution Day" in the City of Frostburg will be read.

Ruminski, chair and assistant professor of Communication Studies and co-coordinator of Leadership Studies at FSU, serves as the president of the board of directors for ACRC. ACRC, with nearly 20 other community mediation centers in Maryland, provides free and low-cost conflict resolution services, including mediation of family, neighborhood and business conflicts, and training and education about conflict resolution. The centers are all members of the statewide organization, Community Mediation Maryland.

Community mediation has been found to be successful at resolving conflicts and improving relationships. It also saves public resources by decreasing repeat calls to the police and decreasing the use of criminal and civil courts. A Basic Mediation Training is tentatively planned for spring. The center is recruiting participants for the unique 50-hour training program.

Take Note 687-STOP Tip Line

FSU has created a tip line for students, faculty, staff and members of the community to use anonymously to provide information about crimes, disturbances or other issues of concern. The tip line, 301-687-STOP, initiated by the students in the President's Leadership Circle, was implemented at the beginning of the fall 2010 semester.

On calling the tip line, the caller will listen to a recorded message for instructions and be directed to leave a message containing the information he or she wishes to share. Exactly five minutes after a message is recorded, the message is automatically sent to FSU Central Communications to be routed immediately to the appropriate office. The messages are anonymous, without numbers or names.

687-STOP was created to give complete anonymity to those leaving tips. Callers are still welcome to contact University Police or other offices directly.
