In this time he participated in All County Band, All County Jazz Band as well as the North East Jazz Band, and he was awarded the John Phillip Sousa Band award upon his graduation. Since then he has studied with Professor Richard Adams at Bridgewater College, Dr. Alan Hamant of University of Delaware and Professor Lee Knier at Salisbury University. He currently plays with the SU Jazz Band as well as the SU Wind Ensemble.

Scott Bunting Born July 31, 1987, Scott Anthony Bunting moved around the country in his early childhood before settling in Salisbury. He started clarinet in fifth grade and devoted much of his time to practice. As the years went on, he began to study more instruments and is considered a utility player. Bunting has spent time with jazz ensembles, the SU Pep Band, choirs, recorder consorts, brass ensembles, wind ensembles as well as the Salisbury Symphony Orchestra. He has studied for almost four years with Amy Sterling and has spent time studying with great players at Michigan's Blue Lake Fine Arts Camp.
