Welcome Alumni! – Leadership and Homecoming Weekend 2011

FSU will celebrate its past, present and future during Leadership and Homecoming Weekend 2011. Events will be held **Thursday, Oct. 20, through Sunday, Oct. 23**, including a pep rally, the All-Campus Sing, tailgating, football, an Alumni After Dark gathering and the Bobcat Hall of Fame induction ceremony.

The weekend activities will be jump-started on Thursday with an FSU pep rally in the Cordts PE Center Main Arena from 5:30 to 7 p.m. where the 2011 Homecoming King and Queen will be crowned. Following the pep rally will be the Air Band Competition. It begins at 7 p.m. in Lane Manicur Hall, and attendees are asked to bring a canned item to benefit the Frostburg Food Pantry.

On Friday, the Office of Career Services invites students to hear FSU alumni share their life experiences from 9 a.m. to noon. This event will be campuswide. At 5 p.m., the Bobcat Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony will be in the Cordts Main Arena. Inductees include **Jay Hegeman '73/M'81, Greg Shockey '83, Victoria Proctor '86, Steve Schleupne '91 and Patrick Sweeney '00**. The FSU Athletic Department will also commemorate the 25th anniversary of the 1986 and 1987 Men's Track and Field teams' National Championship and the 50th anniversary of football at FSU. From 7 to 9 p.m. will be the opening reception of the "Hateful Things" exhibition in the Fine Arts building's Stephanie Ann Roper Gallery. Cap off the night with the All-Campus Sing, sponsored by Sigma Alpha Iota, at 8 p.m. in PAC Pealer Recital Hall.

Saturday, Oct. 22, begins with the Jim Anderson Memorial Baseball Breakfast at 8:30 a.m. in the Lane Atkinson Room (232). Then stop by

the Lane Center upper lobby and check out the Alumni Welcome Center from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Alumni can have their photos taken, check out the newly renovated Lane Center and update their contact information. There will also be face-painting, balloon artists and other arts and crafts for the kids.

At 10 a.m. the Track and Cross Country Alumni Brunch will be in the Lane Center's Greenhouse. Also at 10 a.m. is the Friends of Music Steering Committee meeting at St. John's Episcopal Church, 52 Broadway, Frostburg. For info, contact Dr. Joan Deveen Dixon at jdixon@frostburg.edu or x4115. The Friends of Music Brunch will also be in the church and will start at 11 a.m.

At 11 a.m. FSU's Volleyball team will take on the St. Mary's Seahawks in the Cordts Main Arena. Afterward, come support the FSU Football team with a tailgating party from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. Free parking spaces will be available on a first-come, first-served basis. Cheer on the Bobcats during the football game in Bobcat Stadium, where the Bobcats take on the Alfred University Saxons. The game starts at 1 p.m. and admission is free. From 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. is the Football Reunion on the Lewis J. Ort Library's deck.

If football isn't your thing, bring the family to enjoy a movie, popcorn and fun featuring "The Smurfs" at 1 p.m. in Lane 111. The Men's soccer reunion will be at 3 p.m. on the Ort Library's deck. At 3:30 p.m. the Black Student Alliance will host a "Making Connections and Networking" workshop in the Lane Center's Greenhouse. And at 5 p.m. FSU's Men's

Soccer team takes on the York College Spartans in Bobcat Stadium.

The evening activities begin with the event "Alumni After Dark" from 7 to 9 p.m. in the Lane Atkinson Room. It will feature live music from two alumni, **Andy Branigan '08 and Joe Comer '00**. The evening festivities will continue with Club Connections, co-sponsored by Frostburg Connections, at the Lyric Theatre on Main Street from 9 p.m. to 1 a.m. The night wraps up with a mixer hosted by the Black Student Alliance and Student Government Association. It is from 10 p.m. to 2 a.m. in the Cordts Main Arena and costs \$7 per student and \$10 for non-students.

On Sunday at 9 a.m. there will be an Alumni Association Board of Directors Meeting in the Lane Atkinson Room. At noon the Student Government Association will hold its Big Event; everyone is invited to help clean up the streets of Frostburg.

FSU Foundation
Awards 31 Proposals

The FSU Foundation, through its Annual Fund, awarded financial support to 31 project proposals from faculty, staff and students, as part of its ongoing efforts to reinvest in the campus community. Solicited during the spring 2011 semester by the Foundation, the proposals were selected because of how they supported the goals of student enrichment, academic enrichment and regional and cultural enrichment, the themes of FSU's Staking Our Claim: The Campaign for Frostburg.

Nearly \$98,000 was allocated toward funding proposals, a portion of the \$193,994 raised for the unrestricted Annual Fund in fiscal year 2011, which also supported the FSU Alumni Association, faculty and staff awards and provides student aid. Out of 47 submitted proposals, 31 were selected by the FSU Foundation Board of Directors during a meeting held in early June. This is the fourth year the Foundation has made unrestricted gift revenues available to various campus projects proposed by students, faculty and staff. Copies of funded proposals are on public file in the Lewis J. Ort Library.

Examples of project proposals that were awarded funding include:

- Providing textbook scholarships to Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) students living in STEM @ Sowers Hall, a freshman experience residence hall for students intending to major in STEM programs. The scholarships, which will go toward academic materials purchased in the University Store, will recognize high-achieving STEM students.
- Purchasing equipment and supplies to enlist students' help in doing research to describe the physical properties of Marcellus Shale. The goal of the project is to determine the feasibility of enhancing the extraction of natural gas using supercritical carbon dioxide and assess the possibility of using Marcellus Shale formations for long-term carbon sequestration. Funding was also requested and awarded to help students present their work at a national conference to offset travel and lodging.
- Helping FSU's Learning Green, Living Green Executive Committee, with the Going Green Subcommittee of the Residence Hall Association, establish a student recycling and resource conservation competition, in which students will be encouraged to recycle as much as possible each academic year in their respective residence halls. Funding would be

used as a reward to students in residence halls that have been identified as winners based on the data collected by the FSU Physical Plant.

- Supporting student efforts to serve in their communities by supplying transportation to large events as well as helping to send students to various destinations over their school breaks to serve and experience the culture of that area through alternative breaks. Funds will be spent on transportation expenses, housing, volunteer fees and food for students to attend alternative spring breaks over winter and spring breaks at FSU.

Course in Brazil

Coming Summer 2012!

Dr. Thomas Lambert, an assistant professor in the Biology Department, will offer a course titled "Tropical Forest Ecology and Conservation in Kayapo Lands of the Brazilian Amazon" this summer in Brazil!

This is a tropical forest ecology field course based in the Kayapó Indigenous Territories, a protected wilderness area of the Brazilian Amazon. Students will also have the rare opportunity to visit with one of the indigenous groups leading the movement to preserve large areas of intact rainforest in the Brazilian Amazon.

The course will meet on **July 31** in Brasilia and return to Brasilia on **Aug. 17**. The cost is \$4,200 per student (not including return international airfare, vaccinations and visa).

The course is open to undergraduate and graduate students from all institutions.
