PERFORMER BIOGRAPHIES

Classical guitarist **Danielle Cumming** is well known as a performer and teacher. Her performances have been broadcast in the United States and in Canada on national television and radio. In addition to giving recitals in North America and Europe, Cumming has served on international guitar competition juries and is in high demand for her skill as a teacher in master class settings. As such, she is regularly featured at international guitar festivals.

Danielle holds a Doctor of Music in Performance from McGill University and a Master of Music in Performance from the University of Toronto, where she studied with the renowned guitarist Norbert Kraft. After a year of study in Spain, Cumming released her solo CD, *postcards*, a recording of 20th century repertoire with world music influences.

Danielle is head of the Guitar Area at SU, and is Artistic Director of the Marlow Guitar Series which presents concerts, masterclasses and education outreach in schools in the Washington DC area.

Danielle is endorsed by the D'Addario guitar string company.

Luba Paskova received her master's degree in music from the Saint-Petersburg Academy of the Arts, Russia, where she studied piano with Tatiana Lupikina. At Salisbury University, she has been teaching piano lab class and applied piano courses since fall 2006. Paskova regularly performs at SU faculty recitals and has performed at WSCL Public Radio Delmarva The Celebration of Music concert (2006, 2007), as well as at the Summer Music Improvisation Camp, Columbia University, NY (2010). Paskova compiled and organized the annual recital of Celebration of Great Composers for local piano students, which is held at SU and serves as a fundraising event for the Salisbury University Performing Arts Fund. She has been the local chairperson for Piano Guild Auditions (American College of Musicians) since 2001 and the representative for Royal Conservatory Certificate Program Assessments in Salisbury since 2012. Paskova is a member of the Salisbury Wicomico Arts Council board and is actively involved with promoting SWAC fundraising Classic for a Cause concert and other musical events. Paskova is a respected and dedicated piano coach of all levels and ages and as an active performer herself, motivates her students to participate in recitals, National Piano Guild auditions and other musical venues



Kara Dahl Russell is a working professional interdisciplinary artist. Russell is adjunct professor of applied harp at SU, the pre-concert lecturer for Mid-Atlantic Symphony Orchestra and the director for the Summer Children's Theatre Academy at the Mar-Va Theatre. As a classical music radio host, Russell achieved the rare recognition of three Associated Press Awards for Classical Music Education Series. Russell is in demand for solo and chamber work, teaches private harp lessons, and regularly presents recitals and touring performance programs as harpist and singer.

Eric Shuster produces diverse concert programs and directs the Salisbury University Percussion Ensemble. He regularly collaborates with composers and artists to create new work; sometimes projects that exist between music, theatre, dance, and visual art. He has maintained a long-standing collaboration with Kyle Page. Recently, Eric has performed at the Teatro Colón (Buenos Aires) and the Percussive Arts Society International Convention. He has participated in festivals including Bang on a Can, Nief-Norf, and the So Percussion Summer Institute. Eric is currently a Lecturer of Music at Salisbury University, where he has served since 2011.

PERFORMER BIOGRAPHIES

Jerry Tabor composes electroacoustic and experimental acoustic concert music, much of which, he now believes, is an extension of his initial work as a composer in the jazz idiom. Tabor has given lectures and workshops as a featured composer at numerous festivals and conferences throughout the United States. As a guest composer, Tabor's compositions have been presented at universities and festivals around the United States and in Europe. Several of his compositions are recorded on the Neuma Records label and many of his scores are published by Neuma Publications.

Tabor's work as an editor and composer led him to take the helm of the respected independent contemporary music label Neuma Records in 2013. As an advocate of living composers and contemporary music, in general, he expanded Neuma to include a contemporary music publishing house, and it is now considered a leading distributor of electroacoustic music and is the only publisher in the world to make individual works of this type available.

Tabor holds Doctor of Musical Arts and Master of Music in composition from the University of Maryland College Park, where he studied with esteemed composer and theorist Thomas DeLio. He earned a Bachelor of Music in theory and composition at the University of New Mexico, where he also took master classes with such composers as Milton Babbitt and Michael Colgrass.

As a guitarist, Tabor played professionally for several years in New Mexico before beginning graduate school. He studied classical guitar with renowned national finger-style champion and classical guitarist Michael Chapdelaine while at the University of New Mexico. He also studied privately with L.A. studio and jazz guitarist Michael Anthony (Flintstones, Carol Burnett, Dallas, M*A*S*H, Butch Cassidy and the Sundance Kid, The Fox and the Hound, et.al.).
