### Alice Fiedlerová and Dr. Joan DeVee Dixon to Perform Concert

FSU's Department of Music and the FSU Foundation will present Czech pianist Alice Fiedlerová and *Dr. Joan DeVee Dixon*, a professor of music at FSU, in a program for duo piano on **Friday, Sept. 30**, at 8 p.m. at the Lyric Theatre at 20 E. Main St. in Frostburg. The concert will celebrate renowned composer Antonín Dvořák as part of the 2011 Mutual Inspirations Festival of the Embassy of the Czech Republic in Washington, D.C.

The program will feature "Concordien Polka," "Zlonice Sugar Polka" and "Grand Cacilien Galopp" by Antonín Liehmann; "Můj Máj, Opus 20" by Vitězslav Novák; "Czech Dances" by Vitězslav Novák; and "Slavonic Dances, Opus 46" by Dvořák.

Fiedlerová is a featured artist for the International Dvorak Society's American Spring Festival. She has made a number of recordings for Czech



radio and television and has performed in Germany, France, Switzerland, Belgium and the U.S. In 2000, she was invited to collaborate on "In Memory of the Czech Terezín Composers Project" as the featured performer for the opening concert of the project. She is on the faculty of New York University in Prague and the Conservatory of Music in Prague.

Dixon has conducted extensive concert tours in the U.S., England, France, Germany, Switzerland, Austria, Italy, Israel, Palestine and Japan. She is a featured artist for the International Dvorak Society's American Spring Festival and performs numerous concerts throughout the Czech Republic each year. She has released 12 CDs, featuring both piano and organ, and is frequently heard on National Public Radio and programs such as "Pipedreams." For info, visit www.joandeveedixon.com.

# **CES Presents the Paul Taylor Dance Company**

The masterful choreography of an American legend comes to FSU when FSU's Cultural Events Series presents the Paul Taylor Dance Company on **Tuesday, Oct. 11**, at 7:30 p.m. in the Performing Arts Center Drama Theatre. Ticket holders will also have the opportunity to interact with company members in a post-performance discussion.

The 16-member company will perform three works from the Taylor repertory. "Oh, You Kid!" is an exuberant throwback to the days of vaudeville set to the music of the Paragon Ragtime Ensemble. "Mercuric Tidings" is an energetically joyful work set to the music of Schubert, while the darkly beautiful "Lines of Loss," featuring the music of six composers, sets a more sorrowful mood.

Taylor, one of the most revered American choreographers of the 20th and 21st centuries, helped to forge America's indigenous art form: modern dance. At age 81, Taylor continues to win praise for the vitality of his recent works as well as his classics. Since its inception over 50 years ago, the Paul Taylor Dance Company has become a celebrated and prominent member of the international dance community.

In support of the public performance, two free Arts for Enrichment events will be offered to community members. On **Friday**,

Sept. 30, and Saturday, Oct. 1, at 7 p.m. in Lane University Center 111, CES will present the Academy Awardnominated film, "Dancemaker," which focuses on Taylor's career and gives a behind-the-scenes look at life in the modern dance world. On Monday, Oct. 10, students of dance will have the opportunity to take a master class with one of the Paul Taylor company members. The class in modern dance technique is suitable for late beginner or early intermediate-level dance students. Space is limited and reservations are required. ### **Free Bio-medical Screenings!**

FSU's popular student health and wellness initiative is hosting another round of annual bio-medical screenings this fall. Creating Healthy, Informed, Lasting Lifestyles (CHILL) will ask students to participant in their biomedical screenings on Wednesday, Sept. 28, and Thursday, Oct. 13, from 8 a.m. to noon each day. Students will be able to have their blood pressure, body mass index, body composition, blood sugar and cholesterol levels checked at no cost, all while earning CHILL prizes.

To complete the screening, students will need to refrain from eating or drinking anything but water for at least eight hours before the screening. The screenings involve having a vial of blood drawn to check the blood sugar and cholesterol levels.

Each student screened will be eligible to receive follow-up care at Brady Health Center, including free consultations with nursing staff and the CHILL dietician.

In exchange for the student's time, each participant will receive a complimentary breakfast and a free CHILL T-shirt, and will be entered in drawings for other free CHILL prizes. The first 25 students in line each morning for the screenings will also receive a special bonus CHILL prize.

To be eligible for the screening, students must be at least 18 and not have any previous diagnosis concerning their blood sugar or heart health. Students who do not qualify for this screening are encouraged to contact Brady Health Center to make an appointment to have the screening performed at a later date.
