Part of FSU's Cultural Event Series Special Events programming, Jungle Joe's Wildlife Adventure is an ecoadventure featuring an interactive live animal show. It will



be presented on **Thursday, April 7**, at 7:30 p.m. in the PAC Pealer Recital Hall.

Jungle Joe, aka Joe Fortunato, a former police officer who now works as a zookeeper and wildlife educator, will bring 15 of the most popular exotic animals on loan from the Bucks County Zoo and Conservation Society in Warminster, Pa. The animals include the beautiful blue and gold macaw from South America; the eagle owl, the largest species of owl in the world; the fennec fox, the smallest fox in the world; the African serval cat; and the Burmese python, one of the largest snakes in the world and now an invasive species in Florida.

Jungle Joe's Wildlife Adventure teaches children and adults about the diversity of exotic animals throughout the world. The program entertains as it addresses issues of environmental and wildlife preservation. It also emphasizes the importance of recycling to protect the environment.

'Enough Is Enough'

Campaign Aims to Stem Violence



FSU will participate in "Enough is Enough," the national campaign to end

campus violence, the week of Monday, April 4, through Saturday, April 9. Each day will have a different theme, and events, workshops and information will be offered.



Monday is kick-off day, starting with the annual Martin Luther King Celebration in the Atkinson Room (232) of the Lane

University Center at 4 p.m. *Bernard Wynder '78/M'84*, the assistant vice president of Student Services at FSU, will speak on "Enough Is Enough," concentrating on community with an emphasis on King's message of learning to love and serve one another. Wynder is the recipient of numerous awards, including the NAACP Image Award and the "Living Legend" award from Associated Black Charities of Maryland. He serves on the Allegany County Human Relations Commission and was recently elected president of the Allegany County chapter of the NAACP.

Wynder's speech will be followed by a rally and Harmony Walk beginning at 6:30 p.m., highlighted by the unveiling of the Lane Center wall fountain in the newly renovated lower lobby. Music will be provided by the FSU Chamber Choir, directed by *Dr. Karen Soderberg*.



Following the Harmony Walk, Dustin Lance Black, Academy Award-winning screenwriter for the movie "Milk," will

speak, beginning at 7:30 p.m., also in the Atkinson Room. In addition to his work as a screenwriter, producer and director, Black is a high-profile civilrights activist on LGBT issues.

Tuesday is Take the Pledge Day, in which members of the campus community can sign a pledge to take a stand against violence. There will also be the first of a series of brown bag lunches, beginning with "Facing Facebook Feuds" from noon to 1 p.m. In the Lane South Addition (244), which is also serving as headquarters for "Enough Is Enough" week. Members of Dr. Elesha L. Ruminski's CMST 345/Conflict Management class, with the Allegany Conflict Resolution Center and Alpha Phi Omega, will bring the campus and local community together to learn what to do when conflicts

arise as a result of Facebook postings. The students will discuss why it is valuable to face rather than avoid conflict and offer basic strategies and resources for managing interpersonal conflicts that begin on Facebook.

President Jonathan Gibralter and Dr. Tom Bowling, vice president for Student and Educational Services, will lead an online chat on civility on Blog from the 'BURG (blogfromtheburg. blogspot.com) beginning at 6 p.m. That discussion will lead into the 7 p.m. workshop in the South Addition on cyber bullying and how the web plays a role in causing harm to members of our society. FSU students Greg Brightbill and Patty Malatt, representing the BURG Peer Education Network, will discuss how individuals can help stop the practice.

Wednesday, Unity Day, will feature a brown bag session on "Spirituality and Forgiveness" offered by the *Rev. Dr. Cindy Zirlott* of United Campus Ministry at noon in the South Addition. A workshop on healthy relationships, presented by the Family Crisis Resource Center, will begin at 7 p.m., also in the South Addition. Everyone will also be encouraged to leave a handprint on a "These Hands Don't Hurt" banner, which will hang from the Lane Center second-floor railing for the rest of the week.

Thursday will be Take Action Day. In addition to an opportunity for students to create posters that will be displayed in the Lane Center, international fitness and wellness guru Scott Cole will present an evening workshop called "Get Crazy, Get Still" in Lane 111. Members of the student organization, BTLGLASS (Bisexuals, Transgenders, Gays, Lesbians and Straight Supporters), will present "It Gets Better" at 7 p.m. in the South Addition.

On Friday, for Beats of Peace Day, members of the campus community will be encouraged to share random acts of kindness that will be used to create a "Random Acts of Kindness" PowerPoint slideshow, which will be on display in the Lane Center lobby throughout the day. Cole will also return for a daytime workshop called "Get Active, Not Physical" in the Atkinson Room, and "Late Night in the LUC" will feature fun activities reflecting the week's themes.

Saturday is Campus Cares Day with campuswide community service activities. There will also be an all-day National Coalition Building Institute workshop in Lane 111 from 10 a.m. until 6 p.m.

The "Enough Is Enough" campaign was initiated by NASPA President Diana Doyle in response to the call by the vice president for student affairs at Virginia Tech, Zenobia Lawrence Hike, to take action after the shootings on the Virginia Tech campus. The campaign recognizes that parents, students and community partners are critical allies who will further propel its initiatives to end campus and school shootings.

'Digging Into Shakespeare'



CES, in collaboration with FSU's University Programming Council, will present two performances with Capital Region Performing Arts

roster artist and storyteller Jon Spelman on **Thursday**, **March 31**. Spelman's visit will feature an educational performance of "Grimm 'n Grits" at 4:30 p.m. and a public performance of "Digging Into Shakespeare" at 7:30 p.m. Both programs will be presented in the Lane Atkinson Room (232).

The afternoon presentation of "Grimm 'n Grits" will be targeted to an audience of elementary school children from throughout the tri-state region. In this program, Spelman transforms

the fun of the Grimm fairy tales into exciting Southern rural stories.

Spelman's evening performance, "Digging Into Shakespeare," explores his entertaining experiences in performing Shakespeare. Spelman weaves soliloquies from several of Shakespeare's plays, including "Richard III," "Romeo and Juliet" and "Titus Andronicus" with his own selfdeprecating recollections of disastrous performances and the star-crossed love affairs they begat, or vice versa. He even retools "Venus and Adonis" as a blues number featuring musician Tina Chancey on the viola de gamba, a Renaissance-era guitar played with a bow. Appropriately, "Digging Into Shakespeare" wraps up with Spelman's recollection of taking his 15-year-old daughter Anna to see "The Tempest."

Spelman has presented programs for audiences across the United States and 11 other countries. He has received two Emmys and a Children's Radio Award for "Three Stories Tall," which he hosted.
