## Budget Cut – SU Response

•	Savings from delayed hiring	\$ 525,000
	(over 40 positions put on hold)	
•	Tuition increase (2%; \$62)	341,000
•	Savings from construction fees	300,000
•	Delayed facilities renewal	275,000
•	Fund balance reduction	63,566

Total January 2015 reduction

#### FY 2016

(July 1, 2015 to June 30, 2016)

### **Budget Reductions**

• USM Cut: \$96,508,000

• SU Cut:

- > Unknown at this time
- > Pro rata would be \$3,609,399



#### FY 2016

So why has it been reported that in FY 2016 USM gets a 1.3% increase?

- \$15 million increase in revenue
- \$86 million increase in mandatory costs

# How the State plans to achieve FY 2016 budget reductions

- Reverse January 2015 COLA
- Eliminate July 2015 Merit (2.5%)
- Across the Board Cut of \$25,457,000 to USM
  - > SU's Pro rata share would be \$952,092
  - Assumes a 5% tuition increase and elimination of the COLA and Merit increases that had been in Gov. O'Malley's proposed FY 16 budget



#### Consortium Assembly

#### **Notes:**

- Operating funds and Capital funds are not fungible.
- Governor Hogan hopes to eliminate the State's structural budget deficit in one year.
- Governor Hogan campaigned on a promise to reduce taxes.
- Impact of Coalition lawsuit is uncertain.
