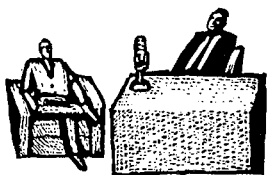

Gov. Glendening and Cabinet Coming to FSU



Maryland Gov. Parris Glendening will be holding his Cabinet meeting on

the FSU campus Thursday, Sept. 16. The event, called "Capital Connection," is the first in a series to take the Governor's cabinet to the four regions of the state. In addition to the regular cabinet meeting, officials from 35 government agencies will be available for both call-in and live interaction with Maryland citizens from 1 to 3 p.m. and 5 to 7 p.m.

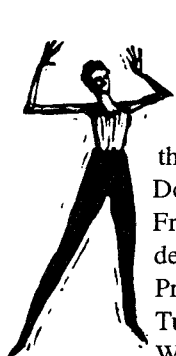
Here is the schedule:

Well, "Hello, Dolly!"

The cast and crew of the national tour of "Hello, Dolly!" arrived on campus Friday in preparation for the debut of Mainstage Production's musical Tuesday, Sept. 14, and Wednesday, Sept. 15, at 8

p.m. Performing Arts Center Drama Theatre.

FSU students will be assisting in the production's preparation.

"Hello, Dolly!" tells the story of a busybody widow, Dolly Levi, who makes her living as a meddling match-maker in the horse and buggy era of New York City. As she sets out to arrange a marriage between Irene Molloy, a lovely widowed New York milliner, and Horace Vandergelder, a rich curmudgeon of a Yonkers merchant, Dolly leaves a whirlwind of merry mix-ups along the way.

Dolly will be played by Tracy Jordan, who appears for the fifth time in this role. Jordan has performed throughout the world in most media, including TV and film. In addition, she has appeared in numerous cabaret and concert arenas including "Richard Rogers - A Man & His Music" in which she co-starred with Walter Cronkite,

Florence Henderson, Marsha Mason and Giorgio Tozzi.

James Lee Flynn brings a wide range of theatrical experience when he takes the stage as Horace Vandergelder. In addition to leading roles in stock and regional theater, Flynn has played on Broadway and has toured nationally and internationally with numerous well-known artists, including Chita Rivera, Kathryn Crosby, Scott Wise and John Davidson. He holds degrees in music education and taught music for 23 years in New York public schools.

Ride for the Trail

Allegheny Highlands Trail of Maryland will have its annual fund-raising ride Saturday, Sept. 25. The cost

The ride will go from Frostburg to the Big Savage Tunnel, approximately 14 miles round trip. Lunch will be served at the Depot Shops after the ride between 11:30 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. Helmets are required. Terrain is rough and mountain bikes are recommended. Adventure Sports will provide technical support on the ride.

Those who can't join the group for the ride can still have lunch at the Depot for \$10.

FSU President Catherine Gira wishes to bring the following policy concerning the scheduling of academic assignments on dates of religious observance to the attention of all members of the University community:

"It is the policy of Frostburg State University that the academic programs and services of the University shall be available to all qualified students who have been admitted to its programs, regardless of their religious beliefs. Students shall not be penalized because of observance of their religious holidays and shall be given an opportunity to make up, within a reasonable time period, any academic assignment that is missed due to individual participation in religious observances. It is the responsibility of the student to notify his/her instructor of conflicts between religious observances and scheduled course activities."

Courtesy suggests that a student should inform the instructor in advance of any absence.
