Senators,

The following is a survey document prepared by the Presidents of the Faculty and Staff Senates along with the chair of the Fiscal Advisory Committee to address the following request by the President .

"As you know, SU's budget reduction plan calls for two furlough days in fiscal year 2004. It now appears likely that there will be additional budget cuts beyond those for which we have already planned in 2003 and 2004.

In recent weeks I have heard that some employees might prefer taking furloughs, days without pay, to try to avoid or minimize the need for additional layoffs.

In consultation with the Fiscal Advisory Committee of the University Forum, I ask that the Faculty and Staff Senates poll all employees.

Additionally, the President request that we consider

- "a) Are the above the "right" questions? If not, you may want to revise the survey instrument. I do ask that all employees be asked to respond to the same instrument.
- b) It must be clear that we are requesting information for furlough days beyond those two that are already built into the fiscal year 2004 budget.
- c) A secret ballot system should be used."

We need to consider the appropriateness of the following document and discuss a method for collecting the information.
