Founded in 2004 by Artistic Director Linda Simms, this group delivers multimedia performances that demonstrate the artistic diversity of English handbells and handchimes. LINDA S. SIMMS is the founder and artistic director of Capital Ringers, Inc. Originally from Maryland, Simms earned her B.A. from Salisbury (State) University, Salisbury, MD, and her Masters of Music Education from West Chester University in Pennsylvania. In addition, she has completed post graduate studies at Westminster Choir College in New Jersey, Central Connecticut State University and George Mason University in Virginia.

Simms has been involved with handbells since 1980 when she started her first handbell choir. She is a former Delaware State chair, Delmarva State chair, National Education liaison and Area 3 chair of the Handbell Musicians of America (HMA).

In addition, Simms has been the guest conductor and clinician for national, regional, and local handbell festivals and events for youth and adults, and she has published several articles in the HMA Overtones. Simms and her husband, Jim, co-authored a PowerPoint presentation for HMA to publish for Michael Helman's *Prayer for Peace* for handbells.

She has been a guest clinician for the Maryland Music Educators Association Conference, the Delaware Music Educators Association Conference and at the University of Maryland Music Department for music student teachers

Simms actively assists handbell directors and ringers by conducting massed ringing events and workshops in Maryland, Delaware, Virginia, Pennsylvania and New Jersey.

After teaching music in public schools for 20 years, and serving churches in Maryland and Delaware, Simms teaches private music lessons (piano, instrumental, music theory and handbells) in her studio in Dover, DE. She lives with husband, Sebastian the golden doodle and cats, Izzy, Sam and Frodo.

The highlight of this concert season is when Simms conducts Capital Ringers at her Alma Mater, Salisbury University, with the Salisbury Chorale and University Chorale. She is joined on the stage with her son, Nathan, a former ringer of Capital Ringers and senior at the University.
