Students new to the university

1 st semester:	<2.0 cum gpa	Probation
2 nd semester:	< 2.0 sem gpa	Dismissal
	> or = 2.0 sem gpa	Cont Probation
3 rd semester	< 2.0 sem gpa	Dismissal
and subsequent	Failure to reduce deficit points	Dismissal
semesters:	> or = 2.0 sem gpa/reduce def points	Cont Probation

Continuing students in good standing the prior semester

1 st academic action	<2.0 cum gpa/12 or less def pts	Probation
	<2.0 cum gpa/13 or more def pts	Dismissal
2 nd and subsequent	<2.0 sem gpa	Dismissal
semesters	Failure to reduce deficit points	Dismissal
	> or = 2.0 sem gpa/reduce def pts	Cont Probation

Part-time students on academic probation in the fall or spring sem or student on academic probation during winter or summer may not increase their deficit point totals or they are dismissed.

Readmission

Dismissed students: Readmitted when deficit points are 6 or less and they have fewer deficit points than when they were dismissed.

Permanent Dismissal

Dismissed students who increase their deficit point totals may be denied permission to register for classes and be permanently dismissed.

Students with < 2.0 cum gpa

1 st semester:	<2.0 cum gpa	Probation
2 nd semester	< 2.0 sem gpa	Dismissal
and subsequent	> or = 2.0 sem gpa & < min acad progress	Dismissal
semesters:	> or = 2.0 sem gpa & > or = to min acad progress	Cont Probation

GPA Chart:	1 - 30 earned credits	Cum 1.4
	31 - 45 earned credits	Cum 1.5
	46 - 60 earned credits	Cum 1.6
	61 - 75 earned credits	Cum 1.8
	76 - 89 earned credits	Cum 1.9
	90 credits or above	Cum 2.0

Readmission

Dismissed students: Readmitted when cum gpa meets the min academic progress standard and cum gpa is higher than when they were dismissed.

Permanent Dismissal

Dismissed students who earn less than a 2.0 sem gpa for three semesters while dismissed may be denied permission to register for classes and be permanently dismissed and are not eligible to petition for readmission for a period of five years.
