Resolution:

The Senate Library Committee presents a resolution asking the Senate to thank the Salisbury University administration for its support of Blackwell Library in 2010-2011 and to strongly encourage the administration to continue to make increased funding for the library an annual priority.

Comment:

The Senate Library Committee would like to point out that a new building, by itself, will not address the poor rankings of Blackwell Library among its performance peer institutions. Additional resources are necessary for the library to fit the needs of "A Maryland University of National Distinction."

Documentation:

- In 2008 (latest data available), Salisbury University ranked 10th out of 11 performance peer institutions in current serial subscriptions and microforms held.
- In 2008, Salisbury University ranked last of the performance peer institutions in audiovisual materials held.
- In 2008, Salisbury University ranked last of the performance peer institutions in books, serial backfiles, and other paper materials held (both in absolute terms and per person enrolled (FTE)).
- The table below compares Salisbury University's collections to its peer institutions.
