## COMMENCEMENT SPEAKERS

#### TOM LIBERATORE

Although student speaker Tom Liberatore's strong academic performance at Frostburg State establishes him as an exceptional scholar, he also has demonstrated excellent service to his fellow students. During his time at FSU, he has worked as a tutor for physics and psychology through the University's PASS office. His way of relating to his peers prompted one professor to note, "Tom is often the student who will explain complicated concepts to other students in a



clear manner, without being pejorative or demeaning. He has a likable personality and a professional manner."

A Psychology major, Tom has been active in fundraising and initiating committees for Psi Chi, the Psychology Honor Society. He was also inducted into Phi Eta Sigma, the Freshman Honor Society. After graduation, he will pursue acceptance into medical school.

When asked why he wanted to be a student commencement speaker, Tom said he looked forward to thanking those who work behind the scene at FSU and assisted in his academic achievements. "I feel that giving the commencement address would allow me to thank the university, the faculty and staff for the fine job they have done in running this university and in giving me the chance to excel."

#### MOLLY JO SINE

Creative, thorough, dedicated and witty are a few words that professors use to describe student speaker Molly Jo Sine. The Fine Arts major who specialized in printmaking has left a lasting impression on the FSU community. Her unique approach and dedication to her craft has prompted praise from her professors. "For the rest of my life, I intend to create images for the same reason that I intend to keep my sense of humor — both are integral, distinctive parts of who I am," Molly says.



Molly's dedication to her major has gained her many awards from the FSU art community. She won first place in painting and two-dimensional design in the FSU Student Art Exhibit and received awards for her work at the Allegany Area Art Alliance Art Show. In addition to her artistic accomplishments, Molly has received recognition as a Meritorius Achievement scholar and an honors student.

Molly hopes to work as a teacher and a professional artist. In whatever field she chooses, Molly's creativity will be the main thrust of her success. "Whether by working privately, professionally, or within the context of a school, I want to continue learning. By strengthening my creative skills, I help strengthen myself," she adds.

#### B.J. DAVISSON

The first time alumni speaker B.J. Davisson visited the Frostburg State campus was in 1966 for his sister's graduation. From that instant, attending FSU seemed like a natural progression for him. Even since his graduation in 1981, Davisson has maintained involvement with the University by serving as president-elect of the FSU Alumni Association.




After graduating cum laude with a bachelor's degree in Sociology, Davisson attended Ohio State University where he received his M.A. in Student Personnel Administration — a decision that was directly influenced by his Frostburg experience. At FSU, he served as a Resident Assistant, yearbook editor, founding president of Alpha Kappa Delta (the Sociology honorary society), Student Government Association Senator and received the Outstanding Senior Service Award in 1981. These experiences, coupled with the helpful guidance of the administration and faculty at FSU, have played a meaningful and lasting role in his professional and personal life, he says.

Davisson has worked in higher education since completing his graduate school in 1983. After working at Gettysburg College, he moved onto Hood College in 1990 where he currently serves as the Associate Vice President for Development.

"I am a firm believer in getting out of life what you put into it," Davisson says. "Frostburg was a wonderful experience for me. I was able to apply my classroom learning to real situations in my various roles as a student leader. From these experiences, I learned how to think on my feet and how to tackle new assignments with confidence — skills I still call upon each day."

#### Dr. CATHERINE GIRA

Dr. Catherine R. Gira became the President of Frostburg State University on September 1, 1991. Prior to that, she served for nine years as Provostatthe University of Baltimore. She also previously held the positions of Professor of English and Acting Dean of the College of Liberal Arts at that institution.





sociations including the American Association of University Administrators (President, 1988-90); Federation of State Humanities Councils (Vice-Chair, 1993-94; National Secretary, 1991-93; and member of the Board of Directors, 1991-present); Commission on Higher Education, Middle State Association (1994-present); American Council on Education Leadership Commission (1994-present); Maryland Humanities Council (Chair, 1989-91); Maryland Association of Higher Education (President, 1986-87). She sits on several boards, including those of the Alvin Ailey Dance Foundation of Maryland, Rocky Gap Foundation, the Western Maryland Railfest, Regional Education Service Agency, and the National Defense Intelligence College.

Dr. Gira earned a B.S. from California State College (PA), an M.Ed. and a Master's in Liberal Arts from The Johns Hopkins University, and a Ph.D. in Literature from The American University. She has published numerous articles on Shakespeare, Renaissance art and literature, and issues in higher education. She has recently completed a bibliographic and critical study of Shakespeare's *Henry IV*, from Garland Publishing Company.

## ACADEMIC REGALIA

Academic regalia is a visible reminder that the process of intellectual pursuits has historic and honorable antecedents. The dignity of scholarship in the past remains vital in the present.

Academic costume consists of gowns, hoods and caps. Traditionally made from black silk, gowns increasingly are the color of the institution granting the degree. The bachelor's gown falls in straight lines and has long pointed sleeves, while the sleeves for the master's gown are closed with slits for the arms at the wrist. The doctor's gown has a velvet facing and three velvet bars on bell-shaped sleeves. The velvet is either black or of the color stipulated for the degree held.

The colorful hoods designate the degree of the wearer, the subject in which the degree is held, and the institution which awarded the degree. The colors of the velvet bands on each hood and robe represent the scholar's field of learning while the official colors of the school awarding the degree are always shown in the lining of the hood. Frostburg State University's colors are red, black and white.

The black mortarboard type of cap is most commonly worn and it is usually made of the same material as the gown. Doctor's caps may be made of velvet and may have tassels of gold or in the color of the wearer's degree. Tassels of different colors are also used to indicate academic honors.

#### THE MACE

In the Middle Ages, the mace was a weapon used against armored warriors. It evolved through the years into an ornamental staff which served as a symbol of the authority of the ruler. Colleges and universities have adopted the mace as a decorative staff or baton which is carried by the grand marshal of the institution in all formal academic processions. The mace is also displayed at other significant events.

The Frostburg State University mace was crafted from mountain walnut which was milled in nearby Flintstone, Maryland in 1945. The grain pattern of the quarter-sawn wood was enhanced by laminating side sections to a central shaft which was then turned, point-to-point, on a wood lathe. To obtain a high-gloss finish, ten coats of trewax were applied while mace was turned at high speed on the lathe. The fine detail work around the medallions and the final coating of wax were done by hand.

The design of the Frostburg State University mace is based upon the recorder, a woodwind musical instrument. Two diestruck replicas of the University seal are affixed to the top.

The mace was designed and crafted in 1986 by Dustin Davis of the Frostburg State University Department of Visual Arts.



### THE MEDALLION

The Frostburg State University medallion is a replica of the seal of the University and is worn by the President at all formal academic convocations as a symbol of leadership and responsibility vested in that office.

The Presidential medallion is die-struck metal with a highly polished gold finish. The design depicts a torch and shield encircled by the name Frostburg State University, and its location, Frostburg, Maryland. The torch symbolizes the enlightenment of higher education, while banners on each side proclaim the dual mission of the University: Leadership and Scholarship. Appearing on the shield are mountains which represent not only the location of the University, but timelessness and endurance; a bobcat, the mascot of FSU, representing strength and courage; an open book and a candle representing learning; and the founding date of the University, 1898.

## THE UNIVERSITY

From an opening day enrollment of 57 students, Frostburg State University has grown to a present day enrollment of 5,443 students. Its physical plant, once limited to a single building, Old Main, which housed classrooms, a library, a gymnasium-auditorium, and a modern chemical laboratory, has also grown to over 30 facilities including classroom buildings, residence halls, the Lewis J. Ort Library, the Physical Education Center, and the Lane University Center, situated on 255 beautiful acres.

Opened in 1902 as State Normal School No. 2, the University owes its existence to the tenacity of J. Benson Oder, editor of the Frostburg Mining Journal, and the citizens of Frostburg who, in spite of political barriers, raised funds and purchased the site on which the University is located.

Principal Edmund Dandridge Murdaugh and three faculty instructed the first Normal School class; in addition, the other faculty taught 151 children in the Model School. The Normal School students, who were high school students having to meet no requirements other than age (girls, 16; boys, 17), had but one two-year course of study elementary education. The curriculum consisted of Latin, mathematics, history, rhetoric and literature, natural and physical sciences, drawing, music, calisthenics, psychology, philosophy of education, philosophy of school management, Pedagogy, Observation, Practice Work, and Primary Manual Training.

Over the years, the name of the institution has reflected the changes in the scope of its educational mission. In 1934, The State Normal School No. 2 became the State Teachers College at Frostburg, a four-year college which offered a Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education. In 1963, the name became Frostburg State College, and finally in 1987, with the strong support of the local civic and business community, became Frostburg State University, an indication of its growing resources, diversity and excellence in educational opportunities for the region and the State.

In 1988, FSU became a constituent institution of the University of Maryland System, comprising 11 of the State's 13 public institutions. Expanding to meet the educational needs of the region, the FSU Center in Hagerstown was also established in 1988 to offer upper-level bachelor's degree coursework and graduate programs. The University also opened, in 1990, a permanent location for the Frederick MBA program.

Throughout its growth, the University has emphasized excellence in teaching. Nearly 70% of the present faculty hold Ph.D's or terminal degrees from institutions that are among the most prestigious in the nation. Faculty scholarship has lead to scholarly books, manuals and journals, as well as numerous articles and reviews. Faculty have read or presented papers, exhibited works, or performed for hundreds of regional and national organizations. Members of the faculty have also received significant grants and awards from the National Endowment for the Humanities, the National Endowment for the Arts and other national associations, councils and trusts.

At the same time, the University has developed a comparable excellence in academic programs, research, consulting, cultural and athletic events and a well-maintained physical plant. Specifically, in 1990, Time Magazine's *Money Guide* ranked FSU as the 15th best



educational value among public institutions in the U.S., and for the past five years, the campus has received a superior rating, the highest state award given for facilities and maintenance.

Today, the University's mission and services have expanded significantly. Over 413 full-time administrators and support staff, and 244 full-time faculty serve the educational needs of the students who represent every county in Maryland as well as 30 other states and the District of Columbia and 22 other countries. These students have a choice of 34 programs of study leading to the Bachelor of Art, Bachelor of Science, and Bachelor of Fine Arts degrees as well as graduate degrees in applied ecology and conservation biology, business administration, counseling psychology, education, fisheries management, human performance, modern humanities, and wildlifemanagement. In addition, twelve pre-professional programs are offered.

Frostburg State University continues in its pursuit of excellence as we look forward to celebrating our 100th anniversary. It's a tradition of excellence and commitment, which spans nearly a century, that is FSU's legacy - as well as its future.

## CANDIDATES FOR DEGREES

At this Commencement, degrees are conferred upon persons who completed requirements in August and December 1994. As final action cannot always be taken by the time this program is printed, the list of candidates here is tentative only. The diploma of the University, signed and sealed by its proper officers, remains the official testimony to the possession of a degree. The designation of honors is based on the grade point average at the end of the fall semester. The final grade point average will determine honor ranking.
